The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of January 2011.

Patrol

January 1, 2011 Officers responded to a residence on Ocean Boulevard where Fire Department and EMS personnel requested police assistance with a female subject at that location who was speaking incoherently and refusing to be transported for evaluation. The officer convinced the subject to cooperate and she was transported to a local hospital without further incident.

January 3, 2011 An officer responded to a residence on Hartnett Boulevard where an adult male resident was reported missing. It was determined that a taxi picked the subject up from the residence at approximately 4 A.M. A check with local taxi companies indicated that the subject was taken to a hotel in North Charleston. North Charleston Police went to the hotel, located the subject and determined that he was fine and in no danger.

January 6, 2011 An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for having a cracked windshield and while speaking to the driver determined that the driver did not have a valid license. The officer asked if anyone of the passengers had a valid license so the vehicle could be driven away. The passengers name was checked in the computer and he was identified as having five unpaid traffic tickets as well as being wanted by the Orangeburg County Sheriff's Office for an outstanding Family Court Bench Warrant. The driver was charged with DUS 1st offense, and the passenger with NRVC 5 counts. The passenger will be extradited to Orangeburg County.

January 6, 2011 At the request of Fire Department personnel, an officer responded to a Waterway Boulevard residence where a male subject was having a seizure. EMS also responded, but the subject refused to be transported to a hospital for further evaluation.

January 9, 2011 At approximately 7:15 P.M., officers responded to an Ocean Boulevard residence and met with the occupants who reported that their smoke alarm went off on the third floor. When the resident checked he smelled smoke. The home was evacuated, as well as the home on either side for safety. Fire Department personnel responded, with the assistance of Sullivan's Island, Mount Pleasant, and Awendaw Fire Departments. Fire damage was contained to the third floor, but there was major water damage throughout the entire residence. Police units conducted traffic and crowd control and were released by 10:30 P.M.

January 15, 2011 Officers observed several subjects with beer getting into a vehicle on Palm Boulevard near 21st Avenue. The officer drove past the vehicle and while turning around so he could speak with them, the vehicle drove away. The vehicle was stopped and the officer immediately observed an open case of beer in the floorboard. Two subjects were in possession of open containers of beer and were charged with Open Container.

January 16, 2011 An officer stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for an equipment violation, then discovered that the driver did not have a valid driver's license. He was charged with the equipment violation, No Driver's License, and No Proof of Insurance.

January 16, 2011 Officers responded to the Front Beach where a fight in progress had been reported in the street. The officers determined that a verbal altercation occurred when a couple walking down JC Long Boulevard said something to a male subject who appeared to be forcing a female into his pick-up truck. This escalated into an assault when the male subject responded by striking the male subject who had asked if the girl being forced into the truck was alright. All subjects involved were located and determined to be under the influence of alcohol. Since the victim declined to prosecute for assault, arrangements were made for all parties to be transported home by taxi. No other action taken.

January 17, 2011 An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation and while running a computer check of the drivers record discovered that he was wanted by the Charleston County Sheriff's Office. The driver was charged with the equipment violation and was then released to the custody of a County Deputy for incarceration.

January 18, 2011 A female subject turned herself in at Police Headquarters regarding an outstanding Arrest Warrant for Breach of Trust. An Investigator had prepared the warrant and made telephone contact with her to advise her to turn herself in regarding a recent theft of prescription medication from a resident who had hired her as a housekeeper.

January 18, 2011 An officer on patrol on the Connector stopped a vehicle for speeding and while speaking to the driver determined that insurance coverage on the vehicle had been cancelled. The driver was found to be in possession of a quantity of loose pills, which were identified as Adderall. The driver stated that she had intended to sell them. The driver was charged with Speeding, Operating a Uninsured Motor Vehicle and Possession of Schedule II Controlled Substance.

January 21, 2011 A vehicle was stopped on Palm Boulevard near 21st Avenue for a seatbelt violation and while the officer spoke to the driver, it was determined that the driver had an expired license for failure to pay two traffic tickets. A quantity of marijuana was located under the driver's seat along with glass pipes. The driver was charged with DUS 1st, NRVC X2, and Simple Possession of Marijuana.

January 22, 2011 A vehicle was stopped on Palm Boulevard for an equipment violation and while speaking to the driver the officer determined that insurance coverage had lapsed in July. The driver was charged with Expired Registration and Operating Uninsured.

January 23, 2011 After stopping a vehicle on the Connector for speeding, while speaking to the driver, the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol emitting from inside. The officer observed an open container of beer in the vehicle and charged the driver with Open Container.

January 23, 2011 An officer stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for an equipment violation and while checking the driver's license it was determined that he was wanted by the State of Florida for an active Arrest Warrant. Florida notified via teletype that they would not extradite, so the driver was released with a citation for the defective equipment.

January 24, 2011 An officer stopped a vehicle on 25th Avenue near Palm Boulevard regarding an equipment violation. While speaking to the driver the officer determined that the driver had a suspended license for failure to pay a fine. He was charged with DUS 1st, NRVC, No Proof of Insurance, and Defective Equipment.

January 24, 2011 Officers responded to a Palm Boulevard residence for a welfare check at the request of a family member who had been unable to make contact with the resident for a week. Entry was made by officers who located the subject to be deceased. An Investigator was summoned to process the residence and the Coroner also responded to arrange for transfer of the decedent.

January 25, 2011 Officers responded to an Ensign Court residence regarding a fifteen year old male juvenile who refused to go to school. Due to past emotional issues and alcohol use, the subject went willingly to MUSC for evaluation. He was transported by EMS.

January 31, 2011 An officer met with a resident who reported that he had received an e-mail from an acquaintance, that stated that he was stranded in Spain and needed \$2,650 immediately in order to pay his hotel bill, in order to retrieve his seized passport. The resident was suspicious and contacted a mutual friend, who stated that the friend claiming to be in Spain was in North Carolina. No financial transaction was ever made. An Investigator has been assigned to this case.

Personnel/Community Relations

January 10, 2011 At the request of the Basic Training Manager of the South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy, Sgt. Ryan played the Great Highland Bagpipe at Basic Law Enforcement Class 563 graduation ceremonies.

January 31, 2011 For the month of January, officers discovered two businesses and three homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of sixty-two Victim of Crime Forms or Property Security Check Forms were issued to business or homeowners for violations noted, or to advise that an officer checked their property during the night while on patrol.


