The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of July, 2011.

## Patrol

(July 1: Friday)

A female complainant stated someone entered her home, with a key but without her knowledge or consent, on 6/26/2011. The victim went on to state nothing appeared to be missing or damaged. Locks on the residence have since been changed.

A female visitor reported the theft of a small amount of cash from her purse while staying in a local villa. The case has been assigned to an investigator.

A male victim reported kite boarding equipment stolen from his vehicle while staying at a local resort. He later provided serial numbers for the items, which will be entered into a national database to aid in recovery of the property.

(July 2: Saturday)

An officer working off-duty at a local resort took a juvenile into custody for disorderly conduct and released the juvenile to a parent.

A guest at an island villa reported vandalism to his vehicle, and wishes to pursue charges if a suspect's identity is established.

Officers responded to a collision involving a vehicle and a bicyclist. The cyclist was transported to the hospital with only minor injuries. The driver of the vehicle was found to be the sole contributor to the collision.

Officers responded to a local business in reference to a physical altercation, a petit larceny and a hit-and-run collision, all involving the same suspect. Statements were taken and Sullivan's Island police officers assisted in locating the suspect, who was subsequently arrested and charged for all incidents.

(July 3: Sunday)

An officer responded to the scene of a collision on private property, involving a golf cart which had struck a fence and was abandoned. The officer was unable to locate the owner, and a collision report was completed and the cart was towed from the scene. An officer met with a local resident in reference to the theft of his golf cart from his garage. It was determined the golf cart was the same one involved in a collision and towed. The victim wishes to pursue charges, and the case has been assigned to Investigations.

A highly-intoxicate male subject was removed from a local establishment and charged with disorderly conduct, after causing a disturbance. The patron was lodged at the detention center.

A male subject was taken into custody for disorderly conduct after an officer working off-duty at a local resort encountered the male, who was grossly intoxicated. The male was advised to return to his rental unit, but was subsequently arrested and transported to the detention center after failing to comply.

(July 4: Monday)

An Officer working a special assignment on the front beach area observed two males engaged in a physical altercation. After interviewing witnesses and determining the primary aggressor, one of the subjects was arrested and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

At approximately 10:35 pm, Officers were dispatched to an incident of Criminal Domestic Violence. Officers separated and spoke with the husband and wife, during which time physical manifestations of injury were observed on the male. The female subject, also found to be intoxicated, was placed under arrest and charged with Criminal Domestic Violence. She was, subsequently, transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

A victim reported that he had left two bicycles, unsecured, outside his rental property overnight. The following morning, discovered that unknown person(s) had stolen both bicycles.

(July 5: Tuesday)

Officers responded to the Municipal parking lot in reference to an assault. Upon arrival, the victim reported that her boyfriend had struck her in the face with a closed-fist, after a verbal altercation escalated. After assaulting her, the subject fled the scene on foot. First Responders were summoned to the scene to treat the victim's injuries. Officers located the male subject and placed him under arrest. The subject was subsequently, transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

At approximately 12:15 am, Officers responded to a disturbance on 22nd Avenue. Responding Officers observed a grossly intoxicated female subject outside her boyfriend's residence, creating a disturbance. The subject was placed under arrest and charged with Disorderly Conduct.

(July 7: Thursday)

The victim reported that his son left a rental bicycle unsecured, during which time unknown person(s) took and carried it away without his permission.

(July 9: Saturday)

The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into her unsecured porch and stole three bicycles.

(July 11: Monday)

The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered onto his property and stole a flag that was displayed on his front porch.

The victim reported that unknown person(s) broke a glass pane out of a window on the rear of his residence.

The victim reported that her ex-boyfriend continues calling and sending her text messages after he has been advised not to. The case has been assigned to an Investigator for follow-up.

(July 12: Tuesday)

The victim reported that a piece of jewelry had been stolen from her residence. During the time frame of the incident, the victim had several service companies with access to the interior of her residence. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

(July 13: Wednesday)

The manager of a rental property reported that the last long-term renters of the residence removed and took away a number of fixed items from the property. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

(July 15: Friday)

The victim reported that sometime on July 4th, an unknown white male juvenile subject stole two bicycles that she had left unsecured while visiting the Grand Pavilion.

(July 16: Saturday)

The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his bicycle, which he had left unsecured at the beach access located at Palm Boulevard and 28th Avenue.

(July 17: Sunday)

The victim notified the police department to report that an unknown white male subject was at her residence and was continuously knocking on her front door and windows. Upon arriving on scene, the Officers found the subject to be grossly intoxicated. It was determined that the subject thought he was at his residence, however, due to his level of intoxication was unable to realize that he was not. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Facility.

(July 18: Monday)

A female resident reported a burglary to her home, during which electronics and various other items were taken. A suspect was named and taken into custody the following day.

A property owner reported receiving a large sum of money for a rental payment which was made with counterfeit traveler's checks. The investigation is continuing.

An officer working off-duty at a local resort located three underage subjects (1 adult and 2 juveniles) consuming alcoholic beverages. The adult male was also found to be in possession of a false driver's

license. The juveniles were charged and released to parents and the adult was charged and released to the Charleston County Detention Center.

(July 19: Tuesday)

A visitor reported the theft of her purse, with a checkbook and credit cards inside, from her rental unit. The case has been forwarded to an investigator.

While investigating a single-vehicle collision officers discovered an open bottle of liquor in the car. The owner/operator was cited and released on an open container charge.

(July 20: Wednesday)

A resident reported the theft of a quantity of expensive jewelry from his home, possibly taken by a recent house guest. The case remains open.

A resident reported the theft of prescription pills from his residence and named a friend of his grandson as a potential suspect. The victim wishes to prosecute if the subject is found.

Officers assisted the Isle of Palms Fire Department and Charleston County Sheriff's Office with mitigating circumstances surrounding a plane crash near Dewee's Inlet.

(July 21: Thursday)

A long-term renter reported a burglary to his home, presumably by a local juvenile. The investigation is continuing.

(July 22: Friday)

A female subject was cited and released for a violation of the ordinance prohibiting alcohol on the streets, after being found consuming a liquor drink in front of a local establishment.

(July 23: Saturday)

A female subject was taken into custody and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center for a violation of the ordinance prohibiting alcohol on the streets, after being found consuming beer in front of a local establishment.

(July 24: Sunday)

A victim reported that an unknown person had entered into his two vehicles, which were left unsecured and parked in the drive of his residence. Several multi-tools were stolen. A suspect has developed and Investigators are following up on leads at this time.

(July 25: Monday)

A local business reported that unknown persons took and carried away a low-speed vehicle from the parking lot of the business.

(July 27: Wednesday)

The victim reported that her son's surfboard was stolen from within her enclosed garage. The victim stated that the garage door was unsecured with the door being left open throughout the evening of the incident date. A suspect has developed and Investigators are pursuing leads.

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his unlocked vehicle and stole his watch, valued at \$2,500. A suspect has developed and Investigators are pursuing leads.

Officers responded to a residence in reference to an alarm. While on scene, evidence of forced entry into the residence was discovered. Contact was made with the homeowners, whose primary residence is out of state to advise them of the situation. It was determined that a number of items had been stolen from a storage cabinet located in the garage. A suspect has developed. Arrest warrants are pending.

(July 28: Thursday)

An Officer on route patrol of the front beach area was flagged down by a subject to report that his vehicle had been stolen. The victim stated that he parked his vehicle in the 1000 block of Ocean Boulevard the night prior and discovered it missing when he returned to retrieve it. The vehicle was entered into the National Crime Information Center database as being stolen. The Police Department was notified by a law enforcement agency in Georgia reporting that the vehicle had been involved in an accident and the occupant hospitalized. The subject has been positively identified and arrest warrants are pending at this time.

(July 31: Sunday)

Officers assisted the Isle of Palms Fire Department with a water mission, where three individuals were rescued from the water near Ocean Point.

#### **Personnel/Community Relations**

Officers conducted 14 hours of community service by speaking with community groups and installing infant and child restraint seats.

July 31, 2011. For the month of July, officers discovered 44 businesses and 21 homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of 65 Victim of Crime Forms or Property Security Check Forms were issued to business or homeowners for various violations noted or to advise that an officer checked their property during the night while on patrol.
