The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of October, 2011.

Patrol

(October 1: Saturday)

Officers responded to a rental property in reference to a physical assault. The victim stated that he and his girlfriend were verbally arguing, during which time she physically assaulted him. There were no visible manifestations of injury, and the victim did not wish to pursue charges.

(October 2: Sunday)

Unknown individuals destroyed 7 mailboxes in a beachside neighborhood. There were no witnesses to the incident.

(October 3: Monday)

Officers responded to a local business in reference to a shoplifting. The complainant, business manager, provided a physical description of a white female and a black male that had exited the business without paying for a dress. A search of the area produced the female suspect, who was positively identified by the employee. The subject was placed under arrest and charged accordingly.

(October 5: Wednesday)

A victim reported that she had responded to a Craigslist posting regarding rental property on the Isle of Palms. She stated that she made contact with the name and number listed in the posting, at which time she was directed to deposit a quantity of cash in a Wells Fargo account for a deposit for the rental property, and that someone from their company would meet the victim at the property to provide a key. The victim made the deposit as directed. When the victim arrived on the Isle of Palms, it was determined that the address listed in the Craigslist posting did not exist. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

(October 6: Thursday)

Officers responded to a rental condo in reference to a domestic dispute. Upon arrival, it was determined that a verbal altercation ensued when the female subject attempted to leave the residence. The verbal altercation escalated into a physical assault when the female attempted to remove the car seat from their vehicle and the male subject attempted to stop her. The couple agreed to separate for the evening and refused to pursue charges.

(October 9: Sunday)

The victim, a property inspector for a cleaning company, reported that she went to a rental property to check to make sure that housekeepers properly cleaned the residence. When she advised the housekeepers that a downstairs room needed to be re-cleaned, one of the housekeepers physically attacked her. The victim stated that she did not wish to pursue charges.

(October 11: Tuesday)

An Officer met with a victim at the Isle of Palms Public Safety Building in reference to a theft of two deck chairs. The theft occurred sometime between April and September, 2011.

(October 12: Wednesday)

An owner of a rental property reported that unknown person(s) stole a signed blank check that she had left at the residence to pay a repair company. The check was subsequently, cashed for the amount of \$500.00. A list of individuals with access to the residence and a copy of the cashed stolen check were provided. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

(October 12: Wednesday)

The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his unsecured vehicle, which had been parked in the driveway of his residence, and stole prescription medication from the center console.

(October 13: Thursday)

A verbal altercation occurred between two parents while their children played on the playground at the Recreation Department. A witness stated that the two subjects, at one time during the verbal altercation, appeared as though they were about to engage in a physical altercation. Officers arrived on scene and met with both subjects. One of the suspects agreed to gather his children and leave the playground.

(October 17: Monday)

A victim met with an Officer at the Isle of Palms Public Safety Building in reference to harassment. The complainant reported that she has been receiving harassing telephone calls and texts from her ex-boyfriend. Further, even though she has requested that he stay away from her residence, he continues to show up unannounced.

(October 18: Tuesday)

A rental property manager reported vandalism to a rental unit. More specifically, he reported that as he was inspecting the house after a renter had departed, discovered various damages to the house possibly as a result of a large party. The floors and rugs in the house were excessively dirty and there was damage to an upstairs bathroom counter. The stairway hall between floors had scrapes on the wall that will require repainting. An upstairs bathroom had apparent vomit all over the tub, sink, toilet, walls and floor. There was broken glass inside the pool and evidence of people smoking inside the house.

(October 22: Saturday)

The complainant notified this agency in reference to an intoxicated black male subject who walked in their establishment and threatened the bar staff with violence. Upon arrival, Officers observed the black male subject sitting on the back deck of the establishment and made contact with him. When the Officers questioned the subject about the incident inside with the bar staff, the subject, "I am President Johnson with the Secret Service, from Gilligan's Island." Through further conversation with the subject, Officers recognized the subject's behavior to be similar to that of Schizophrenic tendencies. The Officers escorted the subject to the front of the establishment, during which time the subject started using profanity and screaming at people passing by. Due to the obvious mental state of the subject, Officers contacted his family and requested that they respond. Upon arrival, the subject's father attempted to take custody of the subject, without a response from the subject. Simultaneously, the subject began experiencing significant seizure activity. IOPFD and EMS responded to the scene. The subject refused to voluntarily be transported by EMS to the hospital. Consequently, he was placed into Emergency Protective Custody.

(October 22: Saturday)

Officers responded to the parking lot of a local business in reference to the vandalism of two vehicles. Unknown person(s) had keyed the exterior of the vehicles sometime overnight.

(October 25: Tuesday)

Officers responded to the area of Wildwood and 41st Avenue in reference to a complaint of a vandalism. Upon arrival, Officers observed what appeared to be an individual's initials spray painted on an AT&T call box.

(October 28: Friday)

The victim reported that unknown person(s) had fraudulently obtained and utilized his bank ATM card number to make six unauthorized on-line purchases. One of the six purchases was for hotel reservations at a hotel in Mexico. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

(October 29: Saturday)

The owner of a rental property reported that unknown person(s) stole two speakers from her surround sound system. There were no indications of forced entry into the residence. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

During the month of October, 2011, Officers issued 35 Business Check notices to business owners/employees advising them that the business was found unsecure. There were 24 Victim of Crime forms completed.

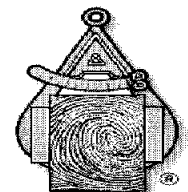

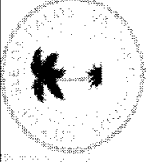
