NOTABLE EVENTS / CALL HIGHLIGHTS

05/04/2022 Cody Marlow was promoted to Fire Engineer.

O5/05/2022 Fire crews responded to a report of a motor vehicle accident at 20th Avenue and Palm Boulevard. Upon arrival, emergency personnel found that a large freight truck had hit a low power line and pulled it free from the pole. Fire department apparatus were staged to provide a safety perimeter around the scene and the driver was told to remain in the truck until Dominion Power crews were able to determine that the power lines had been deenergized. Once it was confirmed that the scene was safe, and there were no needs for medical attention, all crews cleared from the scene and returned to service.

O5/10/2022 Fire crews responded to a report of a golf cart that had veered into the marsh on Sandwedge Lane. The owner of the golf cart stated that he was attempting to move it when the golf cart rolled down an embankment, crashed through a fence and partially submerged in the marsh. Personnel from both Fire and Police Departments assisted in recovering the golf cart out of the marsh. All units then cleared from the scene and returned to service.

05/11/2022 Fire crews responded to a report of an outside fire in the area of Seagrass Lane. Upon arrival, it was found that a small island (Pine Island) had a vegetation fire. The island was checked for any inhabitants which none were found. There were also no exposure hazards in the area. The island is very small with no structures or life safety hazards. The fire was allowed to continue to burn until it reached the water line and self-extinguished. All units cleared and returned to service.

O5/16/2022 Fire crews responded to a report of a motor vehicle accident on the Isle of Palms Connector. Upon arrival, personnel found two vehicles involved. Firefighters were actively checking on the condition of the passengers when Charleston County EMS arrived on scene and assumed all patient care. The vehicles and area were checked for any hazards. All units cleared and returned to service.



NOTABLE EVENTS / CALL HIGHLIGHTS

- O5/18/2022 Fire crews responded to a report of a dog being swept out to sea in the area of 51st Avenue and Public Beach Access. Upon arrival, fire personnel found that a dog had swam too far out and its owner was now swimming out to rescue it. Firefighters launched a jet-ski and were able to retrieve both the dog and the owner and bring them back to shore. There was no medical care needed. All units cleared and returned to service.
- O5/29/2022 Fire crews responded to a report of a vehicle fire at Palm Boulevard and 6th
 Avenue. Upon arrival firefighters found a golf cart with smoke coming from the battery compartment. A fire extinguisher was used to put out the smoldering fire and the batteries were disconnected. All units cleared from the scene and returned to service.
- 05/31/2022 A formal pinning ceremony was conducted to recognize Engineer Marlow for his promotion. Engineer Marlow was pinned by his wife, his mother, and his stepfather.


