The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of April, 2012.

April 1: Sunday

An Officer met with a victim on Marsh Point Lane in reference to the breaking and entering of his motor vehicle. The victim reported that he had parked his vehicle in the drive of his residence. The following morning he discovered that unknown person(s) had entered into his unlocked vehicle and took and carried away his complete set of golf clubs.

April 4: Wednesday

Officers were dispatched to the boardwalk behind the Grand Pavilion in reference to a group of individuals who appeared to be under the age of 21 consuming alcoholic beverages. When Officers arrived on scene and approached the crowd, all of the subjects fled on foot. One of the subjects was detained but did not display any indications that he had consumed any alcoholic beverage. The subject was released to his guardian.

April 5: Thursday

An employee of the Grand Pavilion Bar and Restaurant reported that a white male subject, approximately 60 years of age, took and carried away a bottle of Grey Goose vodka from the business. The larceny was captured on surveillance, and during review of the video, another business employee was able to positively identify the perpetrator.

April 6: Friday

Officers were dispatched to the area of the Grand Pavilion in reference to a loud party. Upon arrival, a number of juvenile subjects fled the scene on foot. One white male subject was detained and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Officers responded to a 41st Avenue residence in reference to a dispute. Officers spoke to a male and a female subject and determined that they are roommates with the female paying rent to the male subject. According to the male subject, the female roommate had not paid her rent, and he wanted her to leave the premises. The eviction process was explained to both individuals, with the female agreeing to depart the residence for the evening.

While conducting route foot patrol in the area of the Grand Pavilion, Officers detected the smell of burning marijuana emitting from the covered bar at the end of the boardwalk on the beach. As Officers approached the boardwalk, two white male subjects fled the scene on foot. After a foot pursuit, one of the subjects was detained and charged accordingly.

April 7: Saturday

An Officer conducting route patrol of the Front Beach area was approached by a female subject stating that an unknown white male subject was at her J. C. Long Boulevard residence, banging on her door. Officers made contact with the subject, who was determined to be highly intoxicated. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

April 8: Sunday

Officers were dispatched to Seascapes in reference to an aggravated assault. Upon arrival, the Officers met with the victim who reported that a female subject, operating a red-in-color Ford-make passenger car struck him with her vehicle after an incident of road rage that started in the 2100 block of Palm Boulevard and continued to Seascapes. The female subject followed the victim to Seascapes where she continued to harass him, eventually striking him with a side mirror of her vehicle as she fled the scene.

April 9: Monday

Officers were dispatched to a residence in the 2600 block of Palm Boulevard in reference to a Burglary. Upon arrival, Officers met with the victim/homeowner who reported that unknown person(s) had stolen her moped from her enclosed garage. The victim stated that the garage door was closed when she departed her residence the afternoon prior; however, it was found open upon her return in the early a. m. hours the next morning. It was apparent from a walk-through of the residence that someone had entered the residence, yet nothing was missing from within the residence. There were no indications of forced entry into the enclosed garage or residence. Investigators are following leads into a possible suspect.

April 10: Tuesday

An Officer met with a victim of a larceny at the Grand Pavilion boardwalk. The victim reported that his son had parked his bicycle on the bicycle rack near the boardwalk at approximately 5:30 p. m. on 04/09/12. At approximately 9:10 a.m. on 04/10/12, it was discovered that unknown person(s) had stolen the unsecured bicycle

April 11: Wednesday

Two victims met with Officers at the Villages in Wild Dunes in reference to two stolen bicycles. The victims reported that they had left the Wild Dunes rental bicycles unsecured near the parking garage of the Villages for approximately 2-2 ½ hours, during which time unknown person(s) stolen both bicycles.

Officers responded to Lagoon Villas in Wild Dunes in reference to the theft of two bicycles. The victim reported leaving her two bicycles unsecured on the exterior of her rental unit overnight. The following

morning, she discovered both had been stolen.

Another victim, a guest at the Grand Pavilion, reported that unknown person(s) had stolen his unsecured bicycle from the exterior of his rental unit.

An Officer met with a victim at the Public Safety Building in reference to a craigslist fraud. The victim stated that he had made arrangements to rent a condominium located in the 1000 block of Ocean Boulevard, including sending funds via Western Union to the perpetrator. According to the victim, no key had been left for him nor was there anyone at the rental unit to let him in as previously arranged. After numerous failed attempts to contact the individual with whom he had made arrangements; he went to the Police Department to report the incident.

April 12: Thursday

On 04/11/12, while on route patrol at the Isle of Palms Marina, an Officer observed two suspicious white males. The Officer made contact with the first subject, as the second departed the scene prior to the Officer exiting the patrol vehicle. The subject advised the Officer that he and the second subject had just walked out of the Morgan Creek Grill, where they had consumed alcoholic beverages. The first subject contended that the second subject had walked away before the Officer could speak with them because he was afraid of getting into trouble. During interview of the first subject, the Officer did detect the smell of an alcoholic beverage emitting from the person, at which time the Officer advised him that he was not to be driving and provided information for a taxi service and local hotels. Shortly thereafter, the Officer requested vehicle information, via the displayed South Carolina license plate on the vehicle that belonged to the subjects, to provide to the Marina staff, since the same was being left in their parking lot. Information was obtained from Telecommunications that the owner of the vehicle had outstanding warrants. The Officer began a follow-up investigation that extended into the following day. The subjects were discovered to be staying at the Palms Hotel. Contact was made with the same individual as the evening prior, who stated that the second/wanted subject was at the hotel. Officers responded to the hotel in an attempt to apprehend the second subject. While knocking on the door to the room, the Officers heard noises from within the room, but no one answered the door. The Charleston County SWAT team was contacted and responded to the scene. Entry was made into the room, but no one was found inside. Later the same date, the subject was apprehended.

April 16: Monday

Petit Larceny: 10th Ave. The victim reported that his rental house had been vandalized, resulting in broken furniture. Officers learned that the victim had rented the residence to a group of subjects for several days which were when the damage and theft occurred.

Simple Assault: 2nd Ave. The victim reported that his roommate had slapped him about the head and facial region during a verbal argument over rent and other bills. The victim did not wish to pursue charges.

April 17: Tuesday

Domestic Dispute: 22nd Ave. The victim reported that her son had become angry with her over losing his vehicle as punishment for smoking marijuana. No contraband was located at the residence.

April 21: Saturday

Simple Assault: Sea Cabins. The victim reported that her grandson had pushed her while she was attempting to prevent him from leaving without permission. The victim did not wish to pursue charges.

April 22: Sunday

Trespass Notice: Wild Dunes. Wild Dunes security reported an unauthorized subject on the property. The subject could not provide a legitimate location within Wild Dunes. Officers made contact with the subject and placed him on trespass notice.

April 29: Sunday

Petit Larceny: Unknown person(s) stole nine traffic cones belonging to My Favorite Things.


