The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of December, 2012.

(December 02: Sunday)

<u>Vandalism</u>: Harbor Golf Course. The complainant reported that an unknown person caused damages to a number of putting greens by driving a motor vehicle upon them. Officers located a suspect who admitted to causing the damages.

Burglary: Beachside Community. Sand Dune Lane. Officers responded Sand Dune Lane in reference to a noise complaint; more specifically, people yelling from a residence. Upon arrival, officers observed damages to a rear door, indicating possible forced entry into the residence. Officers located the perpetrators inside the residence, consuming alcoholic beverages, in fact, without the knowledge or permission of the rightful owner.

(December 06: Thursday)

Petit Larceny: 26th Avenue. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole his unsecured utility trailer from the incident location, which is currently under construction.

(December 07: Friday)

Petit Larceny: 41st Avenue. A victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole an unsecured utility trailer from the Yacht Harbor parking lot.

(December 08: Saturday)

Wire Fraud: Linkside Court. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) used her name, social security number, and date of birth to establish a fraudulent account with Pay Me Later services. Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts: Oak Harbor Boulevard. The victim reported that the relay box to the ignition system of her vehicle was stolen. A potential suspect has developed through investigation.

(December 09: Sunday)

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 14th Avenue and Ocean Boulevard. An officer on patrol reported that one of the Santa Clause hats was missing from one of the sea turtles on the statue.

<u>Shoplifting</u>: 1200 block of Palm Boulevard. Complainant advised that a suspect entered into the store and then walked out with some perishable items without paying. An officer located the suspect a short distance from the store.

<u>Motor Vehicle Theft</u>: 400 block of Palm Boulevard. Victim contacted the Isle of Palms Police, by phone from Hawaii, to report that his friend had informed him that his vehicle had been stolen from his house. The victim later contacted an Investigator to advise that his ex-wife had taken the truck without his permission. Victim stated that he does not wish to pursue charges.

(December 10: Monday)

<u>Vandalism</u>: 28th Avenue. The Isle of Palms Recreation Department reported that unknown person(s) drove a vehicle through the playing fields causing damage to the grass.

Narcotics Arrest: 41st Avenue. An Officer conducting route patrol on 41st Avenue observed a vehicle disregard the stop sign at 41st Avenue and Waterway Boulevard. After conducting a lawful traffic stop on the vehicle, and while speaking with the driver, the Officer observed the smell of marijuana emitting from within the vehicle. Upon further inquiry, the driver voluntarily produced a clear plastic baggie containing a green, plant-like material which field tested presumptive positive for Tetrahydrocannibannol (THC). Consequently, the driver was placed under arrest and charged accordingly.

(December 12: Wednesday)

<u>Theft From Motor Vehicle</u>: Merritt Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into two of his unlocked vehicles on or about 12/10/12 and removed an iPod from within one of the vehicles, however, did not report the incident. On this report date, the victim stated that unknown person(s) had entered into his son's unsecured vehicle, which was parked in his driveway, and took and carried away a pair of tennis shoes.

<u>Breach of Trust</u>: Links Clubhouse Villas. The victim reported that an ex-tenant removed household items from his furnished rental property without his consent or permission.
