The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of November, 2012.

(November 01: Thursday)

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 2200 Block of Palm Boulevard. A victim reported that a subwoofer speaker and a six foot ladder were stolen from her carport by unknown person(s).

(November 03: Saturday)

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 41st Avenue. A victim reported that unknown persons(s) stole the wind screens from his boat while it was docked.

(November 04: Sunday)

<u>Burglary</u>: Charleston Boulevard. A victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole a refrigerator from her unsecured garage.

(November 8: Thursday)

<u>Simple Assault</u>: Morgan's Cove Drive. Officers responded to the incident location in reference a 911 call regarding a fight in progress. Upon arrival, Officers made contact with the victim who stated that he and his son had engaged in a physical altercation, however, everything was fine at that time. Neither subject bore any significant physical manifestations of injury. Both declined prosecution.

(November 9: Friday)

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: IOP Connector. While conducting routine patrol on S. C. 517, an Officer observed a vehicle traveling in-bound that appeared to be exceeding the posted 55 mph speed limit. After confirmation of the violation, the Officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. After identifying the operator of the vehicle, it was determined that his driver's license was suspended for failing to pay a traffic citation. The subject was placed under arrest and charged accordingly.

(November 10: Saturday)

<u>Grand Larceny</u>: 4300 Block Palm Boulevard (Beachside). Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole his Hobie Cat sailboat from the beach. The responding Officer observed that the ropes that served as security ropes had been cut and drag marks leading to the roadway were found.

Stolen Property Offense: 4100 Block of Hartnett Boulevard. An Officer on conducting routine patrol observed a South Carolina license plate leaning against a street sign. Upon further investigation, it was determined that the license plate had been stolen from a vehicle within the City of Charleston's jurisdiction.

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: 800 block of Palm Boulevard. While conducting stationary traffic enforcement in the 800 block of Palm Boulevard, an Officer observed a vehicle with inoperable equipment. After conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle, it was determined that the operator of the vehicle had a suspended driver's license.

(November 12: Monday)

<u>Indecent Exposure</u>: Breach Inlet. Victim reported that she watched the suspect masturbating himself through his clothing while he watched and followed different females, including herself, around the beach.

(November 13: Tuesday)

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: 3300 block of Palm Boulevard. After observing the occupants of a vehicle in transit not wearing seatbelts, an Officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. An identification check of the occupants revealed that one of the same had four (4) outstanding bench warrants for failure to pay traffic fines. The subject was charged accordingly.

(November 14: Wednesday)

<u>Threatening and Intimidation</u>: 9500 block of Palmetto Drive. Officers responded to the incident location in reference to a verbal altercation in progress. Upon arrival, the parties were separated, as were the witnesses to the incident. Statements were obtained that an employee of a local carpet cleaning business had aggressively engaged the property manager, when the manager advised the carpet cleaning employee that he was damaging the newly installed railings and to reposition his equipment. According to the victim and a number of witnesses, the employee threatened bodily harm upon the victim. The subject was escorted off the property and placed on trespass notice.

(November 16: Friday)

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: Ocean Boulevard/Pavilion Drive. While conducting routine patrol in the front beach area, he observed a vehicle being operated, during the dark hour, without headlamps activated. Upon conducting a traffic stop, the Officer observed several open containers of alcoholic beverages within. Additionally, it was determined that the operator was under the legal age of 21 years old and exhibited mannerisms conducive to intoxication. The subject was placed under arrest and after providing a Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) breath sample that exceeded the legal limit, was additionally charged.

(November 20: Tuesday)

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 56th Avenue. The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole several pieces of jewelry and a sum of cash from her residence between 10/20/2012 to 11/20/2012. Further, the victim advised that the items were taken at different times during the time period and that a large number of people have been working at her residence during this time.

<u>Simple Assault</u>: 3700 block of Palm Boulevard. The victim reported that his brother in-law struck him in the face several times with closed fist after a verbal altercation escalated.

Traffic Violation: 1400 block of Palm Boulevard. An Officer conducting routine patrol in the area of the 1400 block of Palm Boulevard observed what appeared to be either an improper start from stop or a potential collision. As the Officer was identifying the vehicle, which had turned into the parking lot of the Kangaroo Express, further witnessed three occupants exit the vehicle and enter the business. Upon exit from the business, the Officer observed the driver to be unsteady on his feet. By the time the Officer could reposition to the suspect vehicle's location, the operator of the vehicle continued to operate the vehicle in a reckless and unsafe manner. Subsequently, a traffic stop was conducted on the vehicle when the Officer was able to catch up with the same. While speaking with the driver, the Officer observed indica of potential intoxication. After a series of unsuccessful performance of field sobriety tasks, the subject was placed under arrest for Driving Under the Influence, 2nd.

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: IOP Connector. An Officer traveling S. C. 517, observed the vehicle traveling in front of him to be consistently in too close a proximity to the vehicle in front of him. After conducting traffic stop, it was learned that the operator did not possess valid driver's license. The subject was charged accordingly.

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: Palmetto Drive/Morgan' Place. After conducting a traffic stop, it was determined that the operator had a suspended driver's License.

(November 21: Wednesday)

<u>Theft From Motor Vehicle</u>: 200 block of Forest Trail. A victim reported that unknown persons(s) entered into his two unsecured vehicles that were parked in his driveway. The victim stated that he was awakened by his vehicle's alarm and upon investigation, discovered the dome light on and alarm activated in one vehicle's.

<u>Theft From Motor Vehicle</u>: 3200 block of Waterway Boulevard. A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his wallet from his unsecured vehicle that was parked in his driveway.

(November 22: Thursday)

<u>Simple Assault</u>: 1300 block of Ocean Boulevard. A victim reported that during a physical altercation with his brother, he sustained a minor laceration above his right eye.

(November 24: Saturday)

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: Sandcrab Court. A victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole three pieces of lawn equipment from his open, unsecured garage.

<u>Simple Assault</u>: 2500 block of Cameron Boulevard. A victim reported that during an argument with his mother-in-law, she grabbed his shirt around the neck area and shook him violently, tearing the shirt.

(November26: Monday)

<u>Simple Assault</u>: 57th Avenue. The owner of a rental property reported that unknown person(s) entered into his secured owner's closet and stole a set of golf clubs. However, there were no indications of forced entry.

(November 28: Wednesday)

<u>Burglary:</u> Yacht Harbor Court. The victim reported that a quantity of alcohol was stolen from within his owner's closet. Through investigation, it was learned that a painting company was at the incident location on the day of the incident to paint the exterior doors. After interviewing the company employees, a confession for the theft was obtained. The same subject also had outstanding warrants from the Charleston County Sheriff's Office.

(November 29: Thursday)

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: Intracoastal Court. The victim reported that a number of construction tools were stolen from the incident location. A suspect was developed through the preliminary investigation. IOPPD Criminal Investigations are pursuing leads at this time.

(November 30: Friday)

Simple Assault/Narcotics Violation: Boardwalk Inn. Officers were dispatched to the incident location in reference to an assault that had just recently occurred prior to the call to the police department. The complainant advised that the perpetrator of an assault on one of his employees had fled the scene, on foot. Officers located the subject and advised him to not return to the incident location, as the victim did not wish to pursue charges. Approximately one (1) hour later, the same subject returned to the incident location, assaulted a second employee of the complainant and removed some items from within the complainant's vehicle without his permission. Thereafter, again, fled the scene on foot. The subject was also located the second time. While Officers were speaking with the subject, the second victim advised that he did wish to pursue charges. A search of the subject's person, incident to arrest produced a quantity of a green, plant-like material which field-test presumptive positive for tetrahydro cannibanol (THC: The active ingredient in marijuana), as well as a glass pipe commonly used to smoke marijuana. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Patrol

During the month of November 2012, Officers issued 3 Business Check notices to business owners/employees advising them that the business was found unsecure. There were 8 Victim of Crime forms completed.
