The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of September, 2012.

(September 1: Saturday)

<u>Burglary</u>: 800 block of Carolina Boulevard. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole two (2) bicycles from the enclosed garage. The house was rented by victim through Southern Shores Real Estate.

Breaking & Entering Motor Vehicle: 21st Avenue. Complainant contacted the Isle of Palms Police Department in regards to him locating a broken window in a vehicle parked on 21st Avenue. Victims were located on the beach and on their return to the vehicle found a missing purse that contained several credit cards. The victim reported that he had been notified that one of the cards had been used on Maybank Highway.

(September 3: Monday)

<u>Burglary</u>: 54th Avenue. Complaint advised that New Image Cleaning Service, had information her three flat screen TVs were missing from the rental residence. No forced entry was noted and an opened side door was found by the cleaning service on arrival. A neighbor advised that they witnessed two Hispanic males wearing green short walking behind the residence before the theft was discovered. The house is a rental unit for Resort Quest.

(September 4: Tuesday)

<u>Credit Card Fraud</u>: Twin Oaks Lane. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) had used his credit card number to purchase items from Office Max and Best Buy. Purchases were done by phone and victim advised that he still had the card in his possession.

<u>Vandalism</u>: Palm Boulevard. Complainant advised that an LSV was returned on Labor Day while the business was closed. The following day employees found the LSV with damages in the parking lot. Renter advised they had placed the LSV behind the business as instructed, and there were no damages to the vehicle.

(September 5: Wednesday)

<u>Burglary</u>: Dolphin Row. Complainant advised that unknown suspect(s) stole a flat screen TV from the rental residence. No force entry was noted; a side sliding glass door and a front door were found to be unlocked. Last known persons allowed into the condo were Eminent Cleaning. Rental is through Resort Quest.

<u>Credit Card Fraud</u>: Waterway Boulevard. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) used hos American Express card number to purchase several item from Amazon.

(September 6: Thursday)

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 5th Avenue. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole his bicycle that had left unattended while he walked on the beach. Victim advised that he did not known make or model of the bicycle, but it was of a beach cruiser type.

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 26th Avenue. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole his keys from inside of his shoe that he had left unattended while he walked on the beach.

(September 7: Friday)

<u>Criminal Domestic Violence</u>: Hartnett Boulevard. Victim reported that during a verbal argument his live in girlfriend became physically violent and struck him in the head and face with a closed fist and open hand causing injuries to his facial area.

<u>Grand Larceny</u>: Ocean Club Villas. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole a diamond ring while they were at the pool. Victim advised that Resort Quest had delivered medical supplies to the room while they were out. Unit is a rental through Resort Quest.

(September 10: Monday)

Open Container: Connector. An Officer conducting routine patrol of the Isle of Palms Connector initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle that was traveling at a higher rate of speed than that posted. While speaking with the occupants, the Officer observed an open container of beer sitting in the passenger floor.

(September 13: Thursday)

<u>Harassment</u>: Hartnett Boulevard. Victim reported that her son (suspect) has been attempting to contact his juvenile daughter despite request from both victim and daughter for the suspect not to contact them. Victim has full custody of the juvenile.

(September 14: Friday)

<u>Disorderly Conduct</u>: An employee of a local business was arrested and charged with Disorderly Conduct after his verbally aggressive response to being terminated.

(September 15: Saturday)

<u>Forcible Fondling</u>: 43rd Avenue. Victim reported that she allowed a neighbor (suspect) into her residence where the suspect attempted to forcibly kiss her, removed his clothing, and grabbed her breast and buttocks. The suspect then left the residence.

<u>Theft From Vehicle</u>: 32nd Avenue. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) entered into his unlocked vehicle that was parked in his driveway, and stole his wallet.

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: Links Clubhouse Villas. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) entered into her condo and stole her medication.

(September 17: Monday)

<u>Grand Larceny</u>: Frank Sottile Lane. Victims reported that when they returned from vacation, several pieces of jewelry were missing. Through investigation it was discovered that the homeowners allowed family members to stay at the residence while they were out of town. Investigators have developed suspects.

(September 18: Tuesday)

<u>Grand Larceny</u>: Beach near 8th Avenue. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole her unsecured beach bag, containing her Rolex watch, while she was walking the beach.

(September 21: Friday)

<u>Burglary</u>: 3400 block of Waterway Boulevard. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) entered into her unsecured residence and stole jewelry from her bedroom. There was no evidence of forced entry.

(September 22: Saturday)

<u>Vandalism</u>: 2200 block of Hartnett Boulevard. Victim reported that while out of town, she believes her neighbor or neighbor's guest had damaged her mailbox by breaking its post. It was discovered that the damage had occurred two weeks prior, while the victim was out of town and possibly the result of an accident rather than malicious intent. The victim's neighbor has agreed to repair the mailbox.

<u>Simple Possession of Marijuana</u>: 1400 block of Palm Boulevard. Officers were dispatched to the area of the 3800 block of Palm Boulevard in reference to a reckless driver. After conducting a lawful traffic stop on the vehicle, Officers located a quantity of marijuana inside the vehicle.

(September 23: Sunday)

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 1400 block of Ocean Boulevard. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole a rental bicycle he had secured under the steps of Ocean Villas. The combination lock was found unlocked next to where the bicycle had been secured.

<u>Burglary</u>: 31st Avenue. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) entered in to the enclosed, yet unsecured, garage area under his residence and stole two bicycles.

(September 25: Tuesday)

<u>Burglary:</u> Forest Trail. Complainant advised that unknown suspect(s) forcibly entered into the residence through the front door. On investigation the front door was found to have been forced open, a TV was found damaged in the living room (possibly dropped while attempting to remove it from the house), and multiple jewelry boxes were found open in the master bedroom; owners were out of town and it is unknown if any items were stolen.

<u>Warrant Arrest</u>: 4500 block of Palm Boulevard. An Officer conducted a traffic stop for an observed seatbelt violation. While conducting interviews with the driver and passenger, it was determined that the passenger had an outstanding warrant from the Berkeley County Sheriff's Office (BCSO). The subject was detained, transported and released to a BCSO Deputy.

(September 26: Wednesday)

<u>Criminal Domestic Violence</u>: Palm Boulevard and 14th Avenue. Victim reported that her husband threw a wallet at her, causing injuries to her face while she was operating a vehicle on Palm Boulevard. Injuries were apparent to the right side of victim's lip.

(September 27: Thursday)

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 7600 Palmetto Drive. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) entered into her rental unit and stole \$20.00 from her purse while she was out at the beach.

(September 28: Friday)

<u>Simple Possession of Marijuana</u>: 41st Avenue. An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for speeding. While speaking with the driver, the Officer detected a strong smell of burnt marijuana emitting from the driver's person, and observed several stems on the driver's shirt. The subject was placed under arrest and charged accordingly.

(September 29: Saturday)

<u>Suspicious Circumstances</u>: The complainant reported that her juvenile son told her that as he was riding his bike to the Recreation Department, a white in color van followed him. The juvenile described the van as a work-type van with heating and cooling decals displayed and was being driven by a tan, white male, heavy-set and possibly in his 40's.

<u>Patrol</u>

During the month of September 2012, Officers issued 3 Business Check notices to business owners/employees advising them that the business was found unsecure. There were 8 Victim of Crime forms completed.

Community Service:

During the month of September, three (3) Neighborhood Block Meet & Greet meetings took place; for a total of five (5).

The first gathering was held in the Beachside Community on 09/05/12. The second, at the Isle of Palms Baptist Church (09/13/12) covering 24th, 25th, 26th Avenues and the 2400-2600 blocks of Cameron and Hartnett Boulevards. On 09/27/12, the third gathering for September was held at the corner of Carolina Boulevard and 10th Avenue, and included 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th Avenues, as well as the 600-1000 blocks of Carolina Boulevard.

Each of the three gatherings were posted on the City website and Officers hand-delivered flyers to residents within the target areas. During interaction with the citizens, Officers introduced themselves and provided a brief description of the program and provided citizens with their business cards. Two (2) meetings have been scheduled for the month of October.

We have received positive feedback from the community regarding the program and the police department's efforts in reaching out to the citizens.
