The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of February, 2013.

February 1: Friday

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u>: 300 block of Palm Boulevard. An Officer conducted a traffic stop for an equipment violation and discovered that the operator's driver's license was suspended for four unpaid traffic tickets.

February 2: Saturday

<u>Driving Under The Influence</u>: Palm Boulevard/21st Avenue. Officers were dispatched to the 2200 block of Palm Boulevard in reference to a possible drunk driver. The Officers located the vehicle on Palm Boulevard at 21st Avenue and conducted a traffic stop. During interview with the driver, it was determined that the subject was operating the vehicle while impaired.

February 4: Monday

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 52nd Avenue. Victim reported that unknown suspect(s) entered into the owner's closet and stole various house hold goods and a guitar.

February 5: Tuesday

<u>Driving Under The Influence</u>: S. C. 517 (Isle of Palms Connector). An Officer conducted a traffic stop for an equipment violation. During interview with the driver, the Officer observed indicators that the subject may be operating the vehicle while impaired. After further investigation, the subject was placed under arrest for driving under the influence.

February 8: Friday

<u>Narcotic Violation</u>: Ocean Boulevard and 5th Avenue. Officers stopped a reported suspicious vehicle and detected and located marijuana in the vehicle.

February 9: Saturday

<u>Disorderly Conduct</u>: 3400 block of Hartnett Boulevard. Officers were dispatched to the incident location in reference to a subject attempting to forcefully enter a residence. The subject was identified as the ex-son in law of the homeowner and found to be intoxicated. The subject was placed under arrest and charged with disorderly conduct.

February 12: Tuesday

<u>Grand Larceny</u>: 32nd Avenue. A victim reported that a diamond bracelet was stolen from her residence sometime in January 2013.

February 14: Thursday

<u>Burglary</u>: 3500 block of Cameron Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole an uninstalled TV from her rental home. The house is a rental through Island Reality.

Narcotics Violation: S. C. 517 (Isle of Palms Connector). While conducting route patrol of the Isle of Palms Connector, an Officer observed a vehicle that appeared to be traveling at a high rate of speed. After the Officer confirmed the speeding violation, a traffic stop was conducted. During interview with the driver, the Officer observed a smell of alcoholic beverage emitting from within the vehicle, and observed a bottle of open liquor along with beer cans. The subject was detained. A subsequent pre-tow inventory of the vehicle produced a quantity of a green, plant-like material which tested presumptive positive for tetrahydrocannibanol (THC).

February 15: Friday

<u>Burglary</u>: 2500 block of Cameron Boulevard. A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered and vandalized a house he is currently remodeling. The subjects spray painted the walls and built a fire on the floor.

February 17: Sunday

<u>Public Intoxication</u>: 21st Avenue. Officers were dispatched to a residence on 21st Avenue in reference to a possible assault in progress. Upon arrival, Officers observed two neighbors involved in a verbal altercation. The visiting neighbor was found to be intoxicated, consequently was placed under arrest and charged accordingly.

February 19: Tuesday

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u>: Palm Boulevard at 40th Avenue. An Officer conducting directed traffic enforcement observed a vehicle disregard the stop sign at the

aforementioned intersection. After conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle, it was discovered that the operator did not have a valid driver's license.

February 20: Wednesday

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: Marina: 41st Avenue. A victim reported that an unknown subject(s) stole a cooler from his boat that was moored to the docks at the time.

February 22: Friday

<u>Driving Under The Influence</u>: Palm Boulevard at Breach Inlet. An Officer conducting patrol in the area of Breach Inlet observed a vehicle that appeared to be traveling at a high rate of speed. After a traffic stop was conducted and during interview with the driver, it was determined that the same was operating the vehicle while under the influence.

February 23: Saturday

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u>: Palm Boulevard and 23rd Avenue. An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle that was observed to have been operating in a careless manner during inclement weather. While speaking with the driver, it was learned that the operator did not possess a valid driver's license.

February 24: Sunday

<u>Assault</u>: Grand Pavilion. Officers were dispatched to the Grand Pavilion in reference to an assault in progress. Upon arrival, Officers learned that two female subjects had engaged in a physical altercation due to a common male. The primary aggressor was determined and charged with Assault and Battery.

February 25: Monday

<u>Driving Under The Influence</u>: Palm Boulevard and 3rd Avenue. An Officer conducted a lawful traffic stop on a vehicle that was determined to be traveling at a high rate of speed. While interviewing the operator, it was established that they were operating the vehicle while under the influence.

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u>: S. C. 517 (Isle of Palms Connector). While investigating a collision, an Officer discovered that one of the involved parties did not have a valid driver's license.

February 27: Wednesday

<u>Burglary</u>: 2000 block of Waterway Boulevard. Complaint reported that while away on vacation, suspect(s) entered their residence and stole several tools and some bed linens.

February 28: Thursday

<u>Burglary</u>: 2900 block of Waterway Boulevard. Victim advised that suspect(s) entered her residence and stole bicycles, silver and TVs.

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 2000 block of Waterway Boulevard. Victim reported that suspect(s) stole three surf boards from under a porch of his residence.

<u>Harassment</u>: Lauden Street. Victim reported that a suspect with a heavy accent called her and advised that they had failed to pay a debt and would be going to jail if they did not send funds immediately.

Warrant Arrest: 3100 block of Waterway Boulevard. An Officer observed a suspicious person in one of the areas in which a significant number of vehicle break-ins and burglaries have occurred. While identifying the subject, it was learned that the subject had an outstanding warrant from a law enforcement agency in Georgia. After extradition was confirmed, the subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Facility to await pick-up.

<u>Driving Under the Influence</u>: Palm Boulevard and 6th Avenue. Officers responded to a report of a vehicle that had left the roadway and landed in the marsh. Officers determined that the driver was operating the vehicle under the influence of drugs and was subsequently placed under arrest. The operator was taken to East Cooper Regional hospital and admitted. Later the operator was transferred to Charleston County Detention Facility.

Patrol

During the month of January 2013, Officers issued 15 Business Check notices to business owners/employees advising them that the business was found unsecure. There were 11 Victim of Crime forms completed.

Crime Prevention/Community Service

One (1) Meet & Greet meeting was held during this reporting period. The meeting was held on February 21, 2013 from 5-6:00 p. m., on Ocean Boulevard between the Pavilion Shops, with business owners and employees. There were approximately ten (10) attendees. During the meeting, the possible development of a Front Beach Commerce Association was recommended wherein regular meetings of business owners would be held.
