The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of July, 2013.

July 1: Monday

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 41st Avenue. The victim reported that she left her iPhone 4 (in a case with her S. C. driver's license) lying on the table at a local restaurant. When she returned to retrieve it, it was gone. The phone's internal GPS unit was activated which produced information that the phone had been used at addresses in Mount Pleasant, and North Charleston.

<u>Theft From a Motor Vehicle</u>: 22nd Avenue. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his unsecured (windows down/doors unlocked) vehicle that was parked in his driveway, and stole a handgun from the center console. The stolen firearm was entered into the National Crime Information Center (NCIC).

<u>Suspicious Vehicle/Open Container</u>: Ocean Boulevard/J. C. Long Boulevard. Officers patrolling the reported area observed two male subjects occupying a vehicle behaving in a suspicious manner. One of the Officers ran a check of the vehicle license plate through dispatch, receiving information that the tag was not on file with the Department of Motor Vehicle (DMV) database. A stop was conducted and as the Officer was speaking with the driver, observed an open container of beer between the front seats. The Officer requested the operator's driver's license to which he stated he had none. The subject was placed under arrest. The passenger's information was, then, checked with information returning that he had an outstanding warrant out of the North Charleston Police Department. The passenger was also placed under arrest. A pre-tow inventory of the vehicle produced paraphernalia commonly used for smoking crack cocaine and heroin.

July 2: Tuesday

<u>Indecent Exposure</u>: 3500 block of Cameron Boulevard. The victim stated that she was mowing her lawn when she noticed a male subject standing in the front yard of the residence adjacent to her residence, staring at her. When she took notice of the subject, he pulled down his shorts, exposed his genitals and

began masturbating while staring at her. The victim stated that when she went inside to call police, the man fled on foot north on Cameron Boulevard, according to the victim.

<u>Theft From a Motor Vehicle</u>: Pelican Reach. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into their unsecured vehicle, which was parked underneath the residence, and stole a GPS unit and a pair of designer sunglasses. The GPS unit has been entered into NCIC.

July 3: Wednesday

<u>Burglary</u>: 3800 block of Hartnett Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into her residence and stole a flat screen television. There were no signs of forced entry.

July 4: Thursday

<u>Narcotics Violation</u>: Palm Court. An Officer conducting patrol in the area of Palm Boulevard and Palm Court observed a male subject walking along Palm Court that appeared to be intoxicated. The Officer made contact with the subject, shortly thereafter, placed him under arrest for public intoxication. A search of the subject's person, incident to arrest, produced a quantity of a green, plant-like material (GPM) which field-tested presumptive positive for Tetrahydrocannibanol (THC: the active ingredient found in marijuana). The subject was additionally charged with simple possession of marijuana.

July 5: Friday

<u>Identity Theft/Fraud</u>: 200 block of Charleston Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown person(s) used her personal information to obtain at least four (4) credit cards, thereafter made fraudulent purchases.

July 6: Saturday

Other Agency Assist/Watercraft Collision: 25th Avenue at the Intracostal Waterway (ICW). Officers were dispatched to the ICW at the end of 25th Avenue in reference to a boat collision. IOPPD Officers arrived on scene prior to the arrival of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Officers and assisted Isle of Palms Fire Department (IOPFD) First Responders in stabilizing several injured passengers. Officers were advised by the occupants that the collision occurred somewhere on the ICW. The scene was turned over to DNR and Charleston County EMS upon their arrival.

July 8: Monday

<u>Warrant Arrest</u>: 1500 block of Palm Boulevard. An Officer conducting patrol in the reported area observed a vehicle with an inoperable brake lamp. After conducting a traffic stop and identifying the operator, information was obtained that confirmed an active warrant for the subject out of the Colleton County Sheriff's Office. The subject was detained and transported to the Charleston County Detention Facility to await extradition.

July 9: Tuesday

Theft of a Motor Vehicle: 37th Avenue. The victim reported that a friend of her husband's requested to use her vehicle, to which she stated "no". When the victim woke in the middle of the night, she noticed her husband's friend and her vehicle to be missing. She immediately reported the incident to the Police Department. That same evening, a Deputy with the Charleston County Sheriff's Office conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle in Mt. Pleasant. Upon receiving proper identification of the subject, it was learned that he had an outstanding warrant out of the Charleston Police Department. The subject was arrested and the vehicle was returned to the victim.

<u>Fraud</u>: Waterway Island Drive. The victim reported that unknown person(s) used his personal information to produce a fraudulent check and attempted to cash the check at a bank in Texas. Due to the large amount of the check, his financial institution contacted him to confirm validity. A hold was placed on the account. Additionally, a mortgage package was fraudulently completed and faxed to the same bank. Through investigation, it was determined that the fax number from which the fraudulent mortgage package was sent was from an address in Burlington Ontario. This case is being turned over the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI).

<u>Fraud/Scam</u>: Forest Trail. The victim reported that she has been trying to rent a room within her residence and had been corresponding with a female subject who stated that she was currently out of the country but could send a check for the lease. The victim received the check, which was more than the lease. The subject advised the victim to wire the remaining funds back to her. Shortly thereafter, the victim received a telephone call from her financial institution advising her that the check was a fraudulent check. This case is being turned over to the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI).

July 11: Thursday

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: 2300 block of Palm Boulevard. While traveling northbound along Palm Boulevard, an Officer observed the vehicle traveling directly in front of him as having inoperable tail lamps. While speaking with the operator of the vehicle, the Officer observed an open container of beer sitting in the front center console. Further, throughout the roadside investigation, it was learned that the operator of the vehicle possessed a suspended driver's license. After placing the operator under arrest, the Officer made contact with the passenger, at which time a second open container of beer was observed. The passenger was, consequently placed under arrest. A search of the passenger's person, incident to arrest, produced a glass pipe (commonly used for smoking marijuana) and a quantity of a green, plant-like material (GPM). The GPM field tested presumptive positive for Tetrahydrocannibannol (THC: the active ingredient found in marijuana.

<u>Larceny</u>: Oyster Row. The victim reported that she had left a check for a rental company agent on the kitchen table of the residence that she had rented, as prearranged between her and the agent. It was determined that one of the housekeepers had taken the check and cashed it at a business in St. Stephens, S. C. This case has been assigned to an Investigator.

July 13: Saturday

<u>Theft From Motor Vehicle</u>: Beachwood West. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into their unsecured vehicle and stole an iPhone. Additionally, two bicycles that were left unsecured in the front yard were also stolen.

<u>Burglary</u>: Grand Pavilion. The victim reported that they left their rental unit at Grand Pavilion unsecured when they departed to go to the beach. Upon return, the victim discovered that unknown person(s) had entered into the rental and stole two iPad's and an iPod.

July 14: Sunday

<u>Disorderly Conduct</u>: 1000 block of Ocean Boulevard. Officers conducting foot patrol on the front beach observed a grossly intoxicated, belligerent male subject being escorted out of a local establishment by employees of the business. The Officers made contact with the employees, the intoxicated subject and a friend of the subjects'. The friend was not intoxicated and stated that he would be able to care for the intoxicated subject, and would call for a ride home. While waiting for the arrival of transportation, the intoxicated male subject continued to behave in a belligerent manner and was observed to have walked

into moving traffic. The subject refused Officers commands to return to the bench to wait for their transportation. After the failure of the subject's friend, as well as Officer's attempts to keep the subject calm, he was placed under arrest for disorderly conduct.

Simple Assault: 3100 block of Palm Boulevard. Officers were dispatched to a rental property in the 3100 block of Palm Boulevard, in reference to a fight in progress, with two (2) male combatants. Upon arrival, the subjects had already been separated by family members. Both subjects had sustained minor lacerations, however, refused medical treatment by IOPFD First Responders. It was learned, through the on-scene investigation that the two subjects are brothers and that after one of the two made an inappropriate comment regarding a past family issue, a physical altercation ensued. Neither subject wished to pursue charges. Family members also occupying the rental property for a family reunion, including the parent s of the subjects, agreed to keep both involved parties separated.

July 15: Monday

<u>Theft From Motor Vehicle</u>: 2900 block of Palm Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) entered his unsecured vehicle and stole a backpack, compass, and sunglasses.

July 16: Tuesday

Theft From Motor Vehicle: 37th Avenue. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) entered into his unsecured vehicle and stole his wallet.

July 17: Wednesday

Motor Vehicle Theft: 1900 block of Waterway Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole his vehicle and an attached trailer.

<u>Burglary</u>: Tabby Lane. The victim advised that unknown suspect(s) entered into his garage through an unsecured, open door and stole three pair of sunglasses and a surfboard.

July 20: Saturday

<u>Theft From Motor Vehicle</u>: 32nd Avenue. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) entered into his unsecured vehicle and stole a backpack containing his laptop computer and iPad.

July 21: Sunday

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 41st Avenue. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole his Trek bicycle from the beach.

Narcotics Violation: 1400 block of Palm Boulevard. An Officer conducting patrol in the 1400 block of Palm Boulevard observed a vehicle in transit with unsafe equipment. After conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle, and speaking with the operator; it was determined that the subject did not possess a driver's license. The subject was placed under arrest and a search of the subject, incident to arrest, produced a quantity of a white powder-like substance was located in one of his back pockets. The substance field-tested presumptive positive for cocaine-base. The subject was transported to the Charleston County Detention Facility.

July 24: Wednesday

Motor Vehicle Theft: 41st Avenue. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole his boat and trailer from the Marina's parking lot. Both the boat and trailer were later recovered.

July 25: Thursday

<u>Theft From Motor Vehicle</u>: 100 block of Charleston Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole his wallet from his unsecured vehicle.

July 27: Saturday

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 100 block of Charleston Boulevard. The complainant reported that unknown suspect(s) stole one of five bicycles he had rented from the Isle of Palms Beach Chair Company.

July 28: Sunday

Narcotics Violation: 20th Avenue. While conducting patrol of the Isle of Palms Connector (S. C. 517), an Officer observed a vehicle that matched the description of a reported Breach of Trust vehicle. The Officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle and determined that the vehicle was in fact the same vehicle, and that the operator of the vehicle was the subject accused of failing to return his friend's vehicle. A driver's license check of the subject produced information that his driver's license was suspended for failing to pay a traffic fine. Additionally, during the road-side interview, Officers detected a strong odor of marijuana emitting from within the vehicle. The subject was placed under arrest, and a search of his person produced a large quantity of cash. Further, an Officer observed; in plain view, a bag sitting in the center console that contained a quantity of a white, powder-like substance (which field tested presumptive positive for cocaine) and a quantity of a green, plant-like material (GPM). The GPM field-tested presumptive positive for Tetrahydrocannibanol (THC: the active ingredient found in marijuana.

<u>Narcotics Violation</u>: 300 block of Palm Boulevard. An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a confirmed speeding violation. While speaking with the driver of the vehicle, the Officer detected the odor of marijuana emitting from within the vehicle. It was discovered that the subject possessed a quantity of a green, plant-like material (GPM), which field-tested presumptive positive for the active ingredient found in marijuana, as well as a number of various types of paraphernalia.

July 30: Tuesday

Theft From Motor Vehicle: 41st Avenue. The victim reported that while he and a family member was paddle boarding, unknown person(s) entered into his vehicle and stole his wallet and iPod. According to the victim, the vehicle was parked in the parking lot of a local establishment, and that he had locked the doors, however, left the front windows partially down. Latent prints were obtained from the vehicle and will be transported to the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED) for an identification check through the Automated Fingerprint System (AFIS). There were no indications that forced entry had been made into the vehicle.

July 31: Wednesday

<u>Burglary</u>: Waterway Island Drive. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his secured garage and stole several firearms and a quantity of ammunition. There were no indications that forced entry was made into the residence. The scene had been contaminated prior to reporting the incident.

<u>Directed Alcohol Enforcement/Alcohol Violations</u>: Palm and Ocean Boulevards (Beach). During the month of July, Officers conducting directed alcohol enforcement, via foot patrol on the beach, charged 17 subjects with having open containers of alcohol on the beach.

Patrol

During the month of July, Officers issued four (4) Business Check notices to business owners/employees advising them that the business was found unsecure. There were eight (8) Victim of Crime forms completed.

PROPERTY IDENTIFICATION PROGRAM:

During the month of July, weekly follow-ups with all eight (8) involved rental companies continued to collect documented property identification information, to be entered into the departments Records Management System (RMS). Over 1,000 property identification tags have been distributed for marking and identifying property. The original goal of the program was to meet with a minimum of three (3) real estate companies and get a minimum of six (6) involved. As of date, the annual goal for this program has been exceeded.

NEIGHBORHOOD MEET & GREET PROGRAM: During the month of July, there were two (2) Meet & Greats hold

(MEET & GREET: 07/18/13)

Meeting Location: Corner of 20th Avenue and Waterway Boulevard. Target Areas: 17th-20th Avenues, Myrtle Boulevard, Dunes Boulevard.

This meeting was a make-up meeting for the month of June, which was cancelled due to inclement weather. This meeting was held at the corner of 20th Avenue and Waterway Boulevard. There were approximately 4 citizens in attendance. The event was posted on the City website and flyers were distributed throughout the neighborhood beginning 07/12/13 by patrol. There were a number of complaints regarding vehicular traffic disregarding the Stop sign on Waterway Boulevard at 20th Avenue. There were complaints about heavy traffic on 20th Avenue on busy beach days, typically between 1500-1700 hrs. Finally, there was a request that the tree branches hanging over the bike path along Waterway Boulevard be cut, as not to obstruct bicycle traffic on the path. The request for Selective Traffic Enforcement was passed along to Captain Usry. The request for the trees branches over the bike path along Waterway Boulevard was delivered to Sgt. Meekins and Public Works Director, Donnie Pitts.

(MEET & GREET: 07/25/13)

Meeting Location: Vacant lot @ 2301 Waterway Boulevard.

Target Areas: 21st-25th Avenue and 2100-2400 blocks of Waterway Boulevard.

This meeting was held at the vacant lot located at 2301 Waterway Boulevard. There were two citizens in attendance. The event was posted on the City website and flyers were distributed throughout the neighborhood beginning 07/19/13 by patrol. There were no complaints. The potential threat of inclement weather is believed to have had an effect on minimal the turn-out.

The next meeting is scheduled for August 22, 2013.
