The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of June, 2013.

## June 01: Saturday

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 3000 block of Palm Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his surfboard, which was left unsecured next to his vehicle.

<u>Disorderly Conduct</u>: 1300 block of Ocean Boulevard. An Officer conducting patrol in the reported area observed a male subject laying in the median, on Ocean Boulevard in front of the Sea Cabins. The Officer made contact with the subject and determined the subject to be intoxicated. The subject was placed under arrest.

#### June 02: Sunday

<u>Suspicious Activity/Persons</u>: 4000 block of Palm Boulevard. The complainant reported that he observed a group of individuals attempt to steal his beach chairs, which he had stored under a walkway to the beach. The complainant was able to provide a description of the subjects, who were located and detained. The complainant advised the Officers that he did not wish to pursue changes against the subjects. All were released on scene.

<u>Alcohol/Drug Equipment Violation</u>: 1300 block of Ocean Boulevard. An Officer conducting patrol in the reported area observed a male subject possessing and consuming an alcoholic beverage. The subject was placed under arrest. A search of his person, incident to arrest, produced drug paraphernalia.

## June 03: Monday

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 2900 block of Palm Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole three lawn ornaments from her front yard.

## June 06: Thursday

<u>Suspicious Vehicle/Alcohol Violation</u>: 1400 block of Palm Boulevard. An Officer investigating a suspicious vehicle, located two subjects inside the vehicle. When the Officer illuminated the vehicle, one of the occupants quickly poured their alcoholic beverage onto the street. The subject was placed under arrest. An additional open container of beer was located inside the vehicle.

<u>Simple Assault</u>: 100 block of Charleston. Officers were dispatched to a fight in progress. Upon arrival, it was determined that a physical altercation had occurred between a male and female. Through investigation, it was determined that they were equal aggressors. Neither subject wished to pursue charges against the other.

## June 07: Friday

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: 1200 block of Palm Boulevard. An Officer was dispatched to a collision that had occurred in the parking lot of a local business. During the investigation, it was determined that the driver of the struck vehicle had two outstanding bench warrants for failure to pay traffic fines. He was placed under arrest. The occupant of the same vehicle provided false identifying information to the Officer. After obtaining the correct information on the occupant, it was learned that she, too had an outstanding bench warrant for failure to pay a traffic fine. She was also placed under arrest.

## June 08: Saturday

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 2100 block of Palm Boulevard (Beachside). The victim reported that unknown subject(s) stole her pursue, which she left unattended, while she was away from the area.

<u>Alcohol Violations</u>: 900-2500 block of Palm Boulevard (Beachside). An Officer conducting foot patrol on the beach observed five different incidents of subjects possessing alcoholic beverages. All were placed under arrest.

<u>Alcohol Violation</u>: 2500 block of Palm Boulevard (Beachside). An Officer was dispatched to the beach behind the 2500 block of Palm Boulevard in reference to subjects hitting golf balls into the ocean. Upon arrival, the Officer observed one of the subjects to have in his possession an alcoholic beverage. The subject was placed under arrest.

## June 09: Sunday

<u>Disorderly Conduct</u>: 1300 block of Palm Boulevard (Beachside). An Officer was dispatched to the beach, behind the Sea Cabins in reference to multiple complaints of a male and female subject walking along the beach, soliciting illegal narcotics, more specifically heroin and cocaine, from beachgoers. Upon arrival, the Officer located the subjects and after speaking with them, they agreed to leave the beach. The Officer made arrangements for the subjects to be transported to a family member's house on Sullivan's Island. While escorting the subjects to the street to meet with the family member, the male subject became verbally belligerent. Consequently, the male subject was placed under arrest.

<u>Alcohol Violation</u>: J. C. Long Boulevard/Ocean Boulevard. An Officer conducting foot patrol on the front beach observed a male subject possessing and consuming an alcoholic beverage. The subject was placed under arrest.

## June 11: Tuesday

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 400 block of Palm Boulevard. Victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a surfboard and a skateboard from the open garage area of his residence.

<u>Aggravated Assault</u>: 24th Avenue. Victim stated that two unknown white males assaulted him when he questioned why they were hanging around in the area.

## June 12: Wednesday

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 5800 block of Palmetto Drive. Victim states unknown suspect(s) stole a wallet from her purse that she had left in the buildings laundry room.

<u>Driving Under The Influence</u>: S. C. 517/IOP Connector. While patrolling the Isle of Palms Connector, an Officer observed the vehicle traveling and display maneuvers which are common indicators of DUI. After conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle and conducting an investigation, the operator of the vehicle was determined to be impaired, and was placed under arrest.

## June 13: Thursday

<u>Theft From Vehicle</u>: 400 block of Merritt Boulevard. Victim advised that unknown suspect(s) entered into her unsecured vehicle and stole a pair of sunglasses.

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u>: Palm Boulevard/Carolina Boulevard. An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a motorcycle for an equipment violation. While speaking with the operator, it was determined that he did not have a driver's license and the license plate on the vehicle was suspended for cancelation of insurance.

<u>Vandalism</u>: 3300 block of Palm Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his vehicle and damaged the DVD player. The vehicle was parked in the drive of the victim's residence, with the windows left down and doors unlocked.

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: 6400 block of Palmetto Drive. An Officer conducting patrol in the reported area observed a vehicle with an inoperable tail lamp. After conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle, it was learned that the operator did not possess a valid driver's license.

## June 14: Friday

<u>Burglary</u>: 100 block of Palm Boulevard. Complainant stated unknown suspect(s) forced open a rear door and stole a TV and liquors from the back deck of the business.

## June 15: Saturday

<u>Theft From Vehicle</u>: 1000 block of Ocean Boulevard. Victim advised unknown suspect(s) broke a window on his vehicle and stole monies and CDs.

#### June 17: Monday

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: Sea Cabins at the beach access path. The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his pair of sandals, which he had left unattended at the end of the beach access path.

Motor Vehicle Theft/Breach of Trust: Fairway Oaks Lane. The victim reported that he had allowed his ex-girlfriend use his vehicle to go to the Kangaroo Express (1206 Palm Boulevard). The ex-girlfriend failed to return the vehicle, which was eventually located in Anderson, South Carolina. The case was assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division who prepared and secured warrants for the perpetrator's arrest.

#### June 18:Tuesday

Theft From Motor Vehicle: 7000 block of Palmetto Drive. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into her unlocked vehicle and stolen her I-Pad. Tracking software indicated that the device was located in the area of 1400 Moultrie Street in Mt. Pleasant. The Mt. Pleasant Police Department was contacted to assist in the investigation and responded to the area to search for the device, with negative results. The victim was not able to provide the serial number for the device at the time of reporting, however, will forward the information to an Investigator as soon as it is located.

#### June 20: Thursday

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 5500 block of Palm Boulevard/Beachside. The victim reported that he left his backpack containing his mobile telephone and wallet unattended on the beach as he entered the surf to fish. Upon returning to the location where he left his pack, he found it to be missing.

## June 23: Sunday

<u>Theft From Motor Vehicle</u>: 3500 block of Hartnett Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his unsecured vehicle and stole his wallet. The vehicle was parked in the victim's drive at the time of the incident.

## June 28: Friday:

Burglary/Case Investigation: 400 block of Carolina Boulevard. Through an extensive investigation, evidence was collected that lead to the identification of suspects in this case. The stolen property was recovered, as well as a significant amount of property that had been reported stolen in a number of other cases, in multiple jurisdictions. The North Charleston and City of Charleston Police Departments, as well as the Dorchester County Sheriff's Office were able to clear a number of their outstanding burglary cases. Other agencies are currently in the process of determining whether or not any of the recovered stolen property is related to any of their cases. As of this date, 15 burglary cases have been cleared throughout the tri-county area.

#### **Patrol**

During the month of June, Officers issued eight (8) Business Check notices to business owners/employees advising them that the business was found unsecure. There were ten (10) Victim of Crime forms completed.
