Date: April 1, 2013

The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of March, 2013.

#### (March 1: Friday)

<u>Burglary</u>: Fairway Dunes. A complainant reported that unknown suspect(s) entered into a rental residence and stole four TVs. The residence is a rental through Resort Quest.

<u>Driving Under The Influence</u>: 600 block of Palm Boulevard. The operator of a motor vehicle ran off the roadway and into the marsh. Through investigation of the collision, it was determined that the subject was under the influence of narcotics at the time of the collision.

(March 2: Saturday)

<u>Burglary</u>: Wills Way. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) entered into his unsecured garage and stole various hand tools.

<u>Vandalism</u>: Wildwood and Live Oak. A complainant reported that unknown suspect(s) spray painted over the street sign.

(March 3: Sunday)

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u>: 100 block of Palm Boulevard. After conducting a lawful traffic stop for speeding, the investigating Officer received information that the operator of the vehicle did not possess a valid driver's license.

#### (March 4: Monday)

<u>Driving Under Suspension/No Insurance</u>: Palm Boulevard and 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue. An Officer conducted a traffic stop for a seatbelt violation. It was determined that the operator of the vehicle did not possess a valid driver's license, nor did the subject have the vehicle insured.

#### (March 5: Tuesday)

<u>Vandalism</u>: 9000 block of Palmetto Drive. The victim promulgated that unknown suspect(s) vandalized his vehicle by shattering the sunroof.

Driving Under Suspension: S. C. 517/Isle of Palms Connector. An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for defective equipment. While speaking with the operator, it was learned that the driver did not possess a valid driver's license.

#### (March 6: Wednesday)

Grand Larceny: Waterway Island Drive. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) entered into her residence and stole a diamond broach.

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: Fairway Oaks Lane. The victim reported that a possible known suspect fraudulently appropriated a heat exchanger from his pool. The suspect worked for a local pool company and after investigation through video evidence, the subject was positively identified and subsequently charged with petit larceny.

#### (March 9: Saturday)

<u>Burglary</u>: 2100 block of Palm Boulevard. A victim reported that unknown subjects(s) entered into his residence, which is currently under construction, and removed the copper wiring from within the structure.

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u>: 1200 block of Palm Boulevard. An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a defective equipment violation. The operator of the vehicle did not possess a valid driver's license.

#### (March 10: Sunday)

Driving Under Suspension: S. C. 517/Isle of Palms Connector. An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for defective equipment. The operator of the vehicle did not possess a valid driver's license.

<u>Warrant Arrest</u>: S. C. 517/Isle of Palms Connector. After conducting a lawful traffic stop on a vehicle, it was ascertained that the driver of the same had an outstanding warrant from the Berkeley County Sheriff's Office.

#### (March 11: Monday)

<u>Vandalism</u>: Wildwood Road and 41st Avenue. The complainant reported unknown subject(s) defaced the Wildwood street sign by covering it with spray painted graffiti.

#### (March 12: Tuesday)

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: Palm Boulevard and 44<sup>th</sup> Avenue. An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for failure to signal a turn. Through investigation, it was learned that the operator of the vehicle did not possess a driver's license.

#### (March 13: Wednesday)

<u>Narcotics Violation</u>: Ocean Boulevard and 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue. An Officer conducting selective traffic enforcement in the aforementioned location observed a vehicle disregard a stop sign. While speaking with the operator of the vehicle, the Officer observed a strong smell of marijuana emitting from within

the vehicle. After further investigation, both occupants of the vehicle were placed under arrest for Simple Possession of Marijuana.

#### (March 14: Thursday)

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: Seagrove Lane. The victim reported that unknown subject(s) stole two bicycles from an unsecured storage room, located in the garage area of the residence. The residence is a rental property.

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: Back Bay Drive and Ocean Point. The complainant informed responding Officers that unknown subject(s) took, and carried away a pedestrian sign from the cross walk area.

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: Palm Boulevard at 20<sup>th</sup> Avenue. After conducting a lawful traffic stop on a vehicle, it was determined that the operator of the same did not possess a driver's license.

#### (March 15: Friday)

<u>Fraud</u>: Forest Trail. A victim reported that unknown suspect(s) used his personal information to fraudulently obtain several credit cards.

Liquor Law Violation: 1400 block of Palm Boulevard. An Officer conducting patrol in the area of Ocean Park Plaza observed two male subjects that appeared to be unsteady on their feet and carrying alcoholic beverages. Upon further investigation of the situation, the Officer confirmed that both subjects were in fact intoxicated and possessing alcoholic beverages, and charged with no alcohol on beach/streets.

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: Waterway Boulevard and Shady Lane. An Officer conducted a traffic stop for a seatbelt violation, thereafter, discovered that the operator of the vehicle did not possess a valid driver's license.

(March 16: Saturday)

<u>Vandalism</u>: Forest Trail. A victim reported that unknown subject(s) vandalized his vehicle by shattering a side window. The vehicle was parked in his front yard at the time of the incident.

<u>Traffic Arrest/Open Container</u>: J. C. Long Boulevard and Palm Boulevard. A traffic stop was conducted on a golf cart being operated on Palm Boulevard. While speaking with the operator, the Officer observed a red in color SOLO type cup in the center console, containing an alcoholic beverage.

#### (March 17: Sunday)

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 51st Avenue. The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his cell phone from within his residence.

<u>Burglary</u>: 50th Avenue. A victim declared that unknown subject(s) entered into his residence and stole four (4) flat screen TVs.

<u>Driving Under The Influence</u>: 100 block of Palm Boulevard. Officers responded to a traffic collision where a vehicle struck a legally parked vehicle. Through investigation of the collision, it was determined that the operator of the moving vehicle had been driving under the influence.

<u>Driving Under The Influence</u>: 100 block of Palm Boulevard. While directing traffic due to the aforementioned collision, an Officer observed another vehicle narrowly avoid a collision with a parked, marked cruiser with emergency equipment activated. Upon conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle, it was determined that the operator of the vehicle was driving under the influence of alcohol.

(March 19: Tuesday)

<u>Vandalism</u>: Driftwood Lane. The victim reported that unknown subject(s) removed and stole his pool pump handle.

(March 21: Thursday)

<u>Vandalism</u>: 41st Avenue. The complainant proclaimed that a possible known suspect defaced a sign belonging to a business utilizing spray paint.

<u>Vandalism</u>: Waterway Boulevard and 41st Avenue. A complainant relayed information, to the responding Officer that unknown subject(s) had utilized spray paint to deface a stop sign.

<u>Burglary</u>: 3500 block of Palm Boulevard. A victim reported that unknown suspect(s) forced entry into the residence, and stole four (4) flat screen TVs. The residence is a rental property.

<u>Traffic Arrest/Open Container</u>: 200 block of Palm Boulevard. After conducting a lawful traffic stop for speeding, and during interview with the operator of the vehicle; an Officer observed a strong smell of alcoholic beverage emitting from within the vehicle. Through further investigation, a cup containing a quantity of alcoholic beverage was located in the center console of the vehicle.

#### (March 22: Friday)

<u>Grand Larceny</u>: Morgan Place. A victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole several pieces of jewelry from within her residence.

<u>Burglary</u>: 9000 Palmetto Drive. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) entered into the rental residence and stole tools from the owner's closet.

#### (March 23: Saturday)

<u>Vandalism</u>: 1000 block of Ocean Boulevard. A victim reported that two unknown suspects vandalized his vehicle by causing damage the front and rear windows. The vandalism occurred after an altercation took place.

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 1400 Ocean Boulevard Unit 208. The victim reported that unknown suspects failed to pay full fare for a taxi service.

<u>Aggravated Assault</u>: 1000 Ocean Boulevard. The victim reported that he was assaulted by multiple suspects while in the front beach area.

<u>Burglary</u>: 500 block of Ocean Boulevard. A complainant advised that unknown suspect(s) forced opened a rear porch door to the residence and stole a flat screen TV.

<u>Underage Possession of Alcohol</u>: 4500 block of Palm Boulevard. An Officer observed a golf cart being operated during the nighttime, with no headlamps activated. Upon conducting a traffic stop on the golf cart, it was learned that the cart was being occupied by two (2) minors. Further, alcoholic beverages were located on the cart, as well as a stolen golf course flag from Wild Dunes.

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: Palm Boulevard and 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue. An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for an equipment violation. During the interview, it was determined that the operator did not possess a valid driver's license.

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u>: 700 block of Palm Boulevard. After conducting a traffic stop on a vehicle for speeding, it was learned that the operator's driver's license was suspended.

#### (March 26: Tuesday)

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: Palm Boulevard and 24<sup>th</sup> Avenue. An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for an equipment violation. During the interview, it was determined that the operator did not possess a valid driver's license.

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: Isle of Palms Connector and Palm Boulevard. An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for an equipment violation. During the interview, it was determined that the operator did not possess a valid driver's license.

#### (March 28: Thursday)

<u>Driving Under The Influence</u>: Palmetto Drive and Abalone Alley. An Officer observed a vehicle being operated in a reckless manner and conducted a traffic stop on the same. While speaking with the operator, the Officer observed an odor of alcoholic beverage emitting from within the vehicle, and observed the driver's faculties and movements to be those indicative of impairment. After a series of field sobriety tasks were attempted, the subject was placed under arrest for driving under the influence.

#### (March 29: Friday)

<u>Theft From Vehicle</u>: Twin Oaks Lane. A victim advised that he witnessed multiple juveniles inside of his vehicle. He advised that the suspects stole a flashlight and a CD player, but he did not wish to pursue charges.

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: Seagrove Lane. The victim reported that four bicycles had been stolen from his residence. An officer located the stolen bicycles in the area. Victim advised he did not wish to pursue charges.

<u>Traffic Arrest</u>: Frank Sottile Lane and 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue. An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for an equipment violation. During interview, it was determined that the operator did not possess a valid driver's license.

Officers were dispatched to investigate suspicious activity, where three potentially intoxicated individuals sat in a vehicle, which was parked in a parking lot, for an undisclosed amount of time. Upon arrival and through investigation, it was determined that all three occupants of the vehicle were exhibiting characteristic behaviors indicative of gross intoxication.

#### (March 31: Sunday)

<u>Theft From Vehicle</u>: Back Court. The victim reported that unknown subject(s) entered into his unsecured vehicle, and stole a laptop computer and prescription medication.

#### Patrol

A letter and an email of appreciation were forwarded to Chief Buckhannon from several Meet & Greet attendees.

#### (ANNUAL WILD DUNES HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION MEETING)

Police Department personnel attended the Annual Wild Dunes Homeowners Association meeting. A display table containing information pamphlets was staffed.

#### (CALEA SPRING CONFERENCE)

The 100<sup>th</sup> conference for the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) was held in North Charleston from March 19-23. Department staff assisted in providing services at the event.
