The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of October, 2013.

October 01: Tuesday

Traffic Offense/Driving Under Suspension: 2100 block of Palm Boulevard. An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle after observing a seatbelt violation. The roadside investigation revealed that the operator's driver's license was suspended. The subject was charged accordingly.

October 03: Thursday

Petit Larceny: 9500 block of Palmetto Drive. According to the victim, sometime in January of 2013 she noticed a diamond ring missing from her residence. The only other individuals with access to her residence are employees of a local housekeeping company.

October 04: Friday

Narcotics Violation: 200 block of Forest Trail. Officers were dispatched to the 200 block of Forest Trail in reference to possible shots fired. While searching the area, an Officer observed a male subject behaving in a suspicious manner, and stopped out with the subject to conduct a field interview. While speaking with the subject, the Officer detected a strong smell of alcoholic beverage emitting from the underage subject's person, who admitted to having consumed alcohol earlier in the same evening. A search of the subject, incident to arrest, produced a quantity of a green, plant-like material (GPM) and a multi-colored glass pipe commonly used for smoking marijuana. The subject was placed under arrest and charged accordingly.

October 05: Saturday

Traffic Violation/Driving Under The Influence/Narcotics Violation: 700 block of Palm Boulevard. An Officer conducted a traffic stop upon a vehicle for a speeding violation. During the roadside interview, the Officer detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from within the vehicle and observed physical indicators of impairment about the driver of the vehicle. Additionally, the Officer observed what appeared to be an open container of an alcoholic beverage poorly tucked under the front passenger seat. After further investigation, the subject was placed under arrest for DUI. A pre-tow inventory search of the vehicle produced a quantity of Schedule II, controlled substances (pills). The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

October 08: Thursday

<u>Grand Larceny</u>: 200 block of Grand Pavilion. The victim advised Officers that while he was photographing a wedding party, he left his camera equipment bag, unsecured, in the vicinity of the band's equipment. When he returned to retrieve the equipment, discovered it had been stolen.

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 100 block of Palm Boulevard. The complainant reported that unknown subject(s) stole a 36 foot ladder and some food items from within the business.

October 15: Tuesday

<u>Vandalism</u>: 1300 block of Palm Boulevard. The victim advised that a possible known suspect (former co-worker) damaged a tire on her vehicle.

October 22: Tuesday

Theft From a Motor Vehicle: 800 block of Palm Boulevard. The victim reported that an unknown suspect(s) stole his wallet from his unsecured vehicle, while it was parked in the driveway of his residence.

<u>Identity Theft</u>: 500 block of Ocean Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) used her personal identity information to file a federal tax return as her fictitious husband.

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 7600 block of Palmetto Drive. The victim reported that unknown suspects entered into the locked owner closet of his rental unit and stole tools, electronic equipment and bottles of wine.

<u>Harassment</u>: 27th Avenue. Officers met with a female subject who wanted to report past and current harassment by an ex-boyfriend. The victim reported that she has received at least ten calls and/or text messages per day, from her ex-boyfriend, whom she has advised that she no longer wants him to have contact with her. The victim also stated that the ex-boyfriend continuously drives by her residence. Officers made contact with the ex-boyfriend and advised him to not have any further contact with the victim, to which he stated that he understood and would comply.

October 23: Wednesday

<u>Burglary</u>: 1400 block of Palm Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) entered into his business, using a key hidden under the door mat for the front door, and stole money from the cash register.

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 900 block of Palm Boulevard. The victim reported that unknown suspect(s) stole a trailer from a vacant lot where he had secured it.

<u>Grand Larceny</u>: Beach Club Villas. The victim advised that they hired a moving crew to package their belonging for a move out of state. On inspection after the move, a necklace and diamond ring were found missing.

October 24: Thursday

<u>Fraud</u>: Edgewater Alley. The victim stated that he purchased an item from a business off of Craigslist, but was never sent the purchased item.

October 25: Friday

<u>Fraud</u>: 27th Avenue. The victim advised reporting Officer that unknown suspect(s) used her credit card number to make several on-line purchases without her permission.

<u>Traffic Offense/Driving Under Suspension</u>: SC 517/IOP Connector. An Officer conducting patrol of the Isle of Palms Connector observed a vehicle traveling at what appeared to be a higher rate of speed than the 55 mph posted. After confirming the speeding violation and conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle, it was determined that the operator of the vehicle's driver's license was suspended. The subject was charged accordingly.

Other Law Enforcement Agency Assist: Sullivan's Island. Sullivan's Island Officers requested the assistance of Isle of Palms Police Officers in locating a suspicious subject that fled from a Sullivan's Island Officer. The suspicious person is believed to be involved in a number of thefts from motor vehicle incidents and possible burglaries in the area. A search of the area did not produce any results.

<u>Suspicious Circumstances</u>: 600 block of Ocean Boulevard. Officers responded to a rental unit in reference to suspicious circumstances. Upon arrival, Officers met with the complainant who stated that she and a family member left the residence, secured, sometime in the early morning hours. When they returned to the residence for lunch, observed that a number of items around the residence had been moved from their original locations, however, nothing appeared to be missing. Officers searched and cleared the residence.

October 26: Saturday

Simple Assault: 1000 block of Ocean Boulevard. The victim reported that an unknown suspect struck him in the face after he "bumped" into a patron of the business.

<u>Petit Larceny</u>: 1400 block of Palm Boulevard. The victim advised that unknown suspects stole his unsecured bicycle.

<u>Burglary</u>: 2500 block of Palm Boulevard. The victim reported that he observed two suspects enter into his enclosed garage and steal a bicycle.

<u>Simple Assault</u>: 3000 block of Waterway Boulevard. The father of victim advised that his son (victim) was slapped and pushed by a known suspect about one month ago; he had just learned of the incident on reporting date.

<u>Criminal Domestic Violence</u>: 2600 block of Waterway Boulevard. Officers responded to a residence in reference to a physical altercation between a married couple. Upon arrival, Officers made contact with both subjects who admitted that a verbal dispute escalated into a physical altercation wherein the female subject struck the male subject about the facial region with an open hand; however, there were no physical manifestations of injury apparent to either subject. The couple agreed to separate for the remainder of the evening, after refusing medical treatment and being advised of protective measures.

October 28: Monday

Criminal Domestic Violence: 1300 block of Ocean Boulevard. Officers responded to a complaint of a physical assault that had just occurred. Upon arrival, Officers made contact with the female half of the altercation, who was walking along Ocean Boulevard. The female was bleeding from her nose and mouth, at which time IOPFD First Responders and Charleston County EMS was requested to respond to the scene. The female stated that she and her boyfriend had been engaged in a verbal dispute, which escalated to a physical altercation when her boyfriend struck her in her facial region with his knee. Further, according to the female subject, after being struck by her boyfriend he "got in her face" and starting yelling at her at which time she struck him and ran out of the rental unit. Officers, then, made contact with the male subject and observed his nose to be bleeding. The male subject provided a different account to the incident, which originated from discussion of an ex-girlfriend. The female subject was transported to the hospital for further treatment. The male subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Facility.
