The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of October 2014.

Thursday, October 2, 2014

Driving Under Suspension – Breach Inlet Area

During routine patrol, an Officer checked the tag of a suspicious vehicle, discovering that the vehicle license plate was suspended. A while later, the Officer observed the vehicle in motion and conducted a traffic stop. Further investigation revealed that the operator's driver's license was also suspended. The operator was arrested and transported to the Detention Center.

Driving Under the Influence – 41st Avenue / Waterway Boulevard

An Officer observed a vehicle traveling 16 miles an hour over the posted speed limit. The Officer stopped the vehicle and further investigation revealed that the operator of the vehicle was possibly under the influence of alcohol. The Officer conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Testing on the driver, who was subsequently placed under arrest, transported for Datamaster testing with a BAC result of .08%. The driver was transported to the detention center.

Friday, October 3, 2014

Criminal Domestic Violence – 1100 Block of Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a domestic situation and found that the suspect had tackled his wife and infant child, knocking them to the ground and striking his wife in the face. In addition, the suspect also tackled another female who was walking with his wife. The suspect was charged with criminal domestic violence, simple assault, and then transported to the Detention Center.

Saturday, October 4, 2014

Traffic Offense – Motor Vehicle Collision – Morgan Creek Drive / Fairway Village Lane

An Officer responded to a single vehicle collision and found that there was no one in the vehicle. The vehicle sustained significant damage and damaged trees along the roadside. Further investigation located the driver, who had sustained injuries, at his residence. The driver was charged with leaving the scene of a collision with property damage and reckless driving. The driver was taken to a local hospital and then transported to the Detention Center.

Friday, October 10, 2014

Simple Assault – JC Long Boulevard

Officers responded to a local establishment and found the victim to have an injury above his left eye, a large knot and abrasion on this right cheek, and a cut lip. The victim was unable to identify the suspect that hit him.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 41st Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered her vehicle that had been parked in the driveway and went through all the compartments. It is unknown if anything was taken. This case has been submitted to CID for further investigation.

Breach of Trust – 2600 Block of Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that she had hired two subjects to pressure wash and paint her residence. The victim provided the subjects with her debit card and pin number to purchase supplies. The victim reviewed her bank statement and found several unauthorized charges. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, October 11, 2014

Driving Under the Influence – Carolina Boulevard / Palm Boulevard

An Officer on patrol, observed a vehicle traveling in the opposite lane of traffic and strike a NO PARKING sign. The vehicle was stopped and further investigation revealed that the operator was possibly under the influence of alcohol. The Officer conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Tests on the driver, who was subsequently arrested, offered a Datamaster test, which he refused. During a search of the driver, the Officer discovered a quantity of a white powdery substance. The driver was charged and transported to the Detention Center.

Monday, October 13, 2014

Warrant Arrest – 2nd Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for a speeding violation and further investigation revealed that a passenger in the vehicle had an outstanding warrant with Charleston County Sheriff's Office. The subject was taken into custody and transferred to CCSO.

Possession of False Driver's License – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for traveling 20 miles an hour over the posted speed limit. Further investigation revealed that the driver provided the officer with a fake driver's license that had expired. The driver then gave the Officer his name and date of birth, which returned with an outstanding warrant. It was determined that the name and date of birth was also false. The driver was arrested and charged with several identity related and transported to the Detention Center.

Credit Card Fraud – 2900 Block of Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that he had contracted with a company to provide strippers for a party at a house he had rented. When it was time for the strippers to arrive, only one showed up, charged his credit card over \$2000 and then immediately left without fulfilling the contract. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, October 15, 2014

Vandalism – 1500 Block of Palm Boulevard

The victim reported that she had been in a verbal argument with an unknown person after she had parked her vehicle at a local establishment. The victim realized she had parked on the white line of the parking space and asked the unknown subject that had pulled up next to her if he would move so she could get into her vehicle and park it appropriately. The unknown subject began yelling at her, so she went into the building to conduct her business and upon returning found that her vehicle had a scratch from the front driver's side door to the rear fender. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Burglary – Back Court

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had entered into the rental property and stolen two televisions. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, October 18, 2014

Warrant Arrest – 3500 Block of Palm Boulevard

An Officer was investigating a vehicle collision and discovered that one of the driver's involved had an outstanding warrant with Berkeley County Sheriff's Office. The driver was taken into custody and transferred to the Sheriff's Office.

Traffic Offense – IOP Connector

An Officer observed a vehicle traveling on the IOP Connector at a high rate of speed. The officer determined that the vehicle accelerated to 110 miles an hour, which is 55 miles an hour over the posted speed limit. The Officer stopped the vehicle and further investigation revealed that the occupants were also in possession of marijuana. The occupants were cited and released to their parents.

Sunday, October 19, 2014

Motor Vehicle Theft – Racquet Club Drive / Back Court

An Officer observed a golf cart with three apparent juveniles traveling after dark with no lights on. The Officer stopped the vehicle and further investigation revealed that the golf cart did not belong them, they were in possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia. The Officer was able to locate the owner of the golf cart, who did not know the juveniles. The juveniles were taken into custody and released to their parents.

Monday, October 20, 2014

Driving Under Suspension – 41st Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the operator's driver's license was suspended and had eight unpaid traffic citations. The driver was charged and transported to the Detention Center.

Petit Larceny – 5800 Palmetto Drive

The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole jewelry while they were staying here on vacation. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, October 25, 2014

Driving Under the Influence – 1200 Block of Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for a moving violation and determined that the driver was possibly under the influence of alcohol. The Officer conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Test with the driver, who was then transported for Datamaster testing. The driver refused the test and was charged. The Officer also determined that the operator's driver's license was suspended. The driver was transported to the Detention Center.

Burglary – 2500 Block of Cameron Boulevard

The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole approximately \$3000 worth of construction tools. The victim was able to provide serial numbers for many of the tools, which were entered into NCIC. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, October 26, 2014

Criminal Domestic Violence _ 7th Avenue / Ocean Boulevard

An Officer patrolling the area found a female subject laying in the roadway. When the Officer attempted to speak with her to determine if she was alright, she would not respond, but gestured the officer away. The Officer then observed a male subject walking towards them. The female then began yelling at the male subject, at which time he turned around gestured at her with both middle fingers. It was determined that there had been a physical altercation between the two subjects with the male subject having injuries to his person. Investigation revealed that the female was the primary aggressor and she was taken into custody and transported to the Detention Center.

Driving Under the Influence – 5th Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a motorcycle for traveling 21 miles an hour over the posted speed limit. Further investigation revealed that the operator was possibly under the influence of alcohol. The Officer conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Test and the operator was taken for Datamaster testing. The operator refused the test, was charged and transported to the Detention Center.

Monday, October 27, 2014

Driving Under Suspension – Waterway Boulevard / 22nd Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for a vehicle license plate violation. Further investigation revealed that the operator's driver's license was suspended. The driver was charged and transported to the Detention Center.

Tuesday, October 28, 2014

Driving Under Suspension – Palm Boulevard / 36th Avenue

An Officer checked a vehicle license plate on a suspicious vehicle and learned that the license plate did not return to the same type of vehicle. The Officer stopped the vehicle and further investigation revealed that the operator's driver's license was suspended and that he using the vehicle license plate from another vehicle. The driver was charged and transported to the Detention Center.

Warrant Arrest – Palm Boulevard / 36th Avenue

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a vehicle license plate violation. A check of a passenger in the vehicle revealed an outstanding warrant with Summerville Police Department. The passenger was arrested and transferred to the Police Department.

Wednesday, October 28, 2014

Warrant Arrest – Morgan Place Drive

Officers were dispatched to the area for a possible wanted subject. They located a subject matching the description and confirmed that the outstanding warrant with the Charleston County Sheriff's Office was valid. The subject was arrested and transferred to the Sheriff's Office.

Thursday, October 29, 2014

Simple Assault – Intracoastal Court

Officers responded to a physical fight between two female subjects. On arrival, the instigator of the assault had left the area and was unable to be located. Officer's obtained a written statement from the victim. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, October 31, 2014

Grand Larceny – Seagrass Lane

The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole jewelry from her residence. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Community Service

Department personnel held a Meet & Greet event in the City Hall parking lot on Thursday, October 30, 2014. Turnout for this event was successful, with approximately fifteen residents that discussed issues, concerns and conversed with Officers. This was the third meeting this year by the Police Department as a part of the Department's new or improved service plan for the calendar year 2014.

During the month of October 2014, Officers issued nine (9) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices and one hundred eighty-three (83) Property Security Check notices.
