The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of February 2015.

## Tuesday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>

### Driving Under Suspension – 700 Block of Palm Boulevard

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a moving violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver's license was suspended for failure to pay a previous traffic citation. The driver was charged accordingly.

## Sunday, February 8<sup>th</sup>

### Liquor Law Violation – 2200 Block of Hartnett Boulevard

An Officer on patrol encountered a subject that was staggering in the roadway carrying a plastic cup. Further investigation revealed that the subject was drinking alcoholic beverages while walking on the state road. The subject was charged accordingly.

## Monday, February 9<sup>th</sup>

### Agency Assist – 24<sup>th</sup> Avenue

An Officer patrolling the area observed a subject that matched the description of a juvenile missing from Mount Pleasant. The juvenile was positively identified as the missing subject, the information was confirmed in NCIC and the juvenile was returned to her parents.

### Motor Vehicle Theft – Morgan Place Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a golf cart from the storage area. The victim was able to provide a serial number for the cart and it was entered into NCIC. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### Traffic Offense – 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An Officer on patrol observed a vehicle speeding and conducted a traffic stop. Further investigation revealed that the driver was not in possession of a valid driver's license. The driver was charged accordingly.

## Tuesday, February 10<sup>th</sup>

### Public Intoxication – IOP Connector

An Officer responded to a report of a subject that was lying down in the roadway on the IOP Connector. The Officer located the subject, who was intoxicated and indicated that he had no place to stay, no money and no one he could call. It was determined that the subject was unable to care for himself, was arrested, transported and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

## Thursday, February 12<sup>th</sup>

### Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Further investigation revealed that the driver was possibly under the influence. The Officer conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Tests with the driver who was subsequently placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where the subject refused to provide a breath sample. The subject was transported and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

### Driving Under Suspension – 1400 Block of Palm Boulevard

An Officer on patrol stopped a vehicle with an expired vehicle registration. Further investigation revealed that the driver's license was also suspended. The subject was charged accordingly.

## Friday, February 13<sup>th</sup>

### Simple Possession of Marijuana – 3700 Block of Hartnett Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a suspicious vehicle parked in a wooded lot. Officers made contact with a male subject found sleeping inside the vehicle. Further investigation revealed an open liquor bottle, beer bottles, drug paraphernalia, and marijuana. The subject was arrested, transported and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

### Traffic Offense – 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue / Waterway Boulevard

An Officer on patrol conducted a traffic stop on a speeding vehicle. Further investigation revealed that the driver did not possess a valid driver's license. The subject was charged accordingly.

## Saturday, February 14<sup>th</sup>

### Trespass – 5700 Block Palm Boulevard

The victim reported that two subjects who were told to leave the gated community refused to comply. The subjects went into a parking lot close by in an attempt to gain access into the gated community. An Officer made contact with the two subjects, placing them on trespass notice, providing them with written notice.

## Sunday, February 15<sup>th</sup>

### Drug Violations – Palm Boulevard / Breach Inlet Bridge

An Officer stopped a vehicle for speeding. Further investigation revealed that the occupants were in possession of marijuana, drug paraphernalia, and several other types of narcotics. Two of the occupants were juveniles and released to their parents, while two other occupants were arrested, transported and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Disorderly Conduct – Ocean Boulevard / J C Long Boulevard

Officers on foot patrol in the business district, observed a white male subject fall down the steps of a local establishment, get up and kept on walking, indicating that he was fine. As Officers continued to observe the subject, they saw him standing between two parked vehicles urinating in public. The subject was charged accordingly.

Traffic Offense – Palm Boulevard / Charleston Boulevard

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a speeding vehicle. Further investigation revealed that the vehicles license plate was suspended. The driver was charged accordingly.

Monday, February 16<sup>th</sup>

Collision – Palm Boulevard / 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue

Officers responded to a report of a single motor vehicle collision. Investigation revealed that the driver had veered off the roadway and struck a palm tree. The driver had to be extricated from the vehicle and was transported to a local hospital.

Saturday, February 21<sup>st</sup>

Aggravated Assault – 100 Block of Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of subject screaming at a residence. Officers arrived and could hear the subject yelling threats and profanity. Further investigation found a male subject, naked, who as Officers identified themselves and began to approach him, took off running towards the beach. The Officers gave verbal commands for the subject to stop, and when he did, he turned, taking a fighting stance. The subject charged the Officers, striking one in the nose and then began attacking the other. Officers deployed Tasers, causing full neuromuscular incapacitation and were able to secure the subject, who was transported and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center after being released from a local hospital.

Petit Larceny – Forest Trail

An Officer on patrol observed a vehicle drive by him with several occupants and a street sign. Upon further investigation, it was determined that the subjects, who were juveniles, had taken the street sign from the intersection of 34<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Palm Boulevard. The Officer released the subjects to a parent and had the sign dropped off at IOP Public Works.

Tuesday, February 24<sup>th</sup>

Driving Under the Influence 2<sup>nd</sup> Offense – Palm Boulevard / 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for a moving violation and after making contact with the driver, determined that he was possibly under the influence. The Officer conducted Standardized Field Sobriety test on the driver, who was subsequently placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center for Datamaster testing, where the subject provided a breath sample with a BAC of .13%. The driver was lodged at the Detention Center.

Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations and after making contact with the driver, determined that he was possibly under the influence. The Officer conducted Standardized Field Sobriety test on the driver, who was subsequently placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where the subject refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was transported and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Thursday, February 26<sup>th</sup>

Driving Under the Influence – 22<sup>nd</sup> Avenue / Waterway Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for a moving violation and after making contact with the driver, determined that he was possibly under the influence. The Officer conducted Standardized Field Sobriety tests on the driver, who was subsequently placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where the subject refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was transported and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Friday, February 27<sup>th</sup>

Public Intoxication – JC Long Boulevard

An Officer responded to a report of an intoxicated person having difficulty walking down the street. The subject was located, determined to be intoxicated and was placed under arrest. The subject was transported and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Agency Assist – North Charleston Police Department

An Officer certified as a Drug Recognition Expert was requested to assist in the investigation of a driving under the influence arrest because of a motor vehicle collision. The subject that had been arrested by North Charleston Police Department was given a Datamaster test, which resulted in a BAC of .00%. Our Officer conducted the required evaluation and determined that the subject was under the influence of narcotic analgesic and cannabis.

Saturday, February 28<sup>th</sup>

Traffic Offense – 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An Officer conducted a traffic stop for an equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver was not in possession of a driver's license. The subject was charged accordingly.

Underage Possession of Alcohol – 100 Block of Ocean Boulevard

Officers located two illegally parked vehicles in the area and attempted to locate the owners of the vehicles. The Officers knocked on the door and observed several subjects inside, who began to run around trying to hide. Officers were also able to see beer cans lying around on the porch floor. After several attempts to get someone to come to the door, Officers made contact with the homeowner, who responded and let the Officers inside. The Officers located thirteen (13) subjects who were all under the age of 21 and multiple bottles of beer and liquor. All subjects were charged accordingly.

Burglary – 2400 Block of Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered the rental unit where he was staying and stole his iPhone5 valued at \$600.00. The victim was unable to provide a serial number for the phone. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### Community Service / Personnel Recognition

During the month of February 2015, Officers issued seven (7) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices and eighty-three (83) Property Security Check notices. Sergeant Baldrick assisted citizens with the installation of child safety seats in their vehicles on two (2) occasions. Animal Control Officer Enourato, Sergeant Meekins and Sergeant Amba participated in the Doggie Day at the Recreation Department, licensing ninety (90) dogs.

In addition, Sergeant Baldrick completed training which certified her as a Drug Recognition Expert / Evaluator. This certification requires an Officer complete various training courses before being selected to attend the final certification testing which takes place in Arizona and is paid for by the South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy. Out of the more than 14,000 Officers in the state of South Carolina, Sergeant Baldrick is among the 151 Officers that have achieved the DRE Certification.

Pfc. Matt Storen was nominated as the Officer of the Year with the South Carolina Law Enforcement Network for his outstanding efforts in alcohol and drug enforcement. In 2014, Pfc. Storen had a total of 17 arrests for driving under the influence, 52 arrests for individuals for underage possession of alcohol, and 16 arrests for individuals in possession of illegal narcotics.

A Citizen wrote a letter recognizing Ptl. James Taylor for his pleasant and professional interaction with them during the time they had locked their keys inside their vehicle. He said that Ptl. Taylor made unpleasant circumstances tolerable.

## Isle of Palms Police Department

During the month of February 2015, the Consolidated Dispatch Center received and dispatched 4214 calls for service to the four (4) public safety agencies of Isle of Palms and Sullivan's Island, and the National Park Service. The following is a breakdown of activity by department.
