MONTHLY REPORT for January 2015

Date: February 2, 2015

The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of January 2015.

Thursday, January 1st

Driving Under the Influence – 300 Block of Palm Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a vehicle that had run off the road and was involved in a collision. When they arrived, Officers observed two male subjects standing outside the vehicle and that the vehicle had run off the road, through a yard, struck a tree, struck a trailer, and finally stopped in a flowerbed, with its front axle broken. Both subjects denied being involved in a collision and appeared to be intoxicated, but indicated they were coming from an establishment on the island. An Officer determined who had been driving and had him perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. The driver was placed under arrest, transported to the IOPPSB where he was offered Datamaster Testing, which he refused. The driver was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Public Intoxication - 300 Block of Palm Boulevard

As Officers were investigating a collision and conducting Standardized Field Sobriety Test with the driver, the passenger of the same vehicle was interfering with the Officers doing their job. The passenger, who would not follow Officers instructions, was placed under arrest, transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Felony Driving Under the Influence – 21st Avenue / Waterway Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a single vehicle collision with injuries and on their arrival, observed a vehicle partially rolled over on its passenger side. Several subjects were outside the vehicle with visible injuries and one was lying on the ground unconscious. Further investigation revealed that the driver was possibly under the influence. Due to the seriousness of the injuries to one of the passengers, the driver was placed under arrest and transported to the hospital for treatment of minor injuries. When the driver was released from the hospital, he was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Friday, January 2nd

Petit Larceny - Grand Pavilion

A victim reported that while on vacation, unknown person(s) had stolen his smart phone, which had been left in his room. The victim was able to provide the serial number for his phone, which was entered into NCIC and valued at \$200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, January 6th

Grand Larceny - 1300 Block of Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen his bicycle, which had been secured to the bicycle rack. Further investigation revealed that the unknown person(s) had cut the two locks, leaving them, but took the bicycle, which is valued at \$2200. The victim was unable to provide a serial number for the stolen bicycle. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, January 10th

Driving Under the Influence 2nd Offense – Ocean Boulevard / J C Long Boulevard

An Officer observed a vehicle driving on the wrong side of the road and stopped the vehicle. As the Officer approached the vehicle, it appeared as if the driver was passed out. Upon making contact with the driver, the Officer had to attempt to wake him up. The driver, who was suspected of being intoxicated, was asked to perform the Standardized Field Sobriety test. At the conclusion of the tests, the driver was placed under arrest, transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where the driver refused to provide a breath sample. He was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Sunday, January 11th

Driving Under the Influence – 1200 Block of Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. When contact was made with driver, the Officer suspected that he was intoxicated. The driver was provided the opportunity to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and was arrested at the conclusion. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, which he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Petit Larceny – 24th Avenue

Several victims reported that while they were in a meeting / luncheon, unknown person(s) stole their purses and other belongings valued at \$212 for one victim, \$1090 for a second victim, and \$245 for a third victim. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, January 14th

Driving Under the Influence - 200 Block of Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for speeding and other moving violations. When contact was made with the driver, the driver did not initially answer the Officer's questions, but placed a breath mint in her mouth before answering. The driver explained that she was speeding because she did not want to be late for the Alcoholics Anonymous Meeting. Further investigation revealed that the driver was possibly intoxicated and was provided the opportunity to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. At the conclusion of the tests, the driver was arrested and transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing.

The driver provided a breath sample registering a BAC of .08% and was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Thursday, January 15th

Vandalism – 28th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had again caused significant damage to the grass near the basketball court. The video surveillance provided a description of the vehicles. The amount of damage caused was \$300. This was the second incident this month, the previous damage was estimated at \$500. The area was placed on the Special Patrol Request list. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, January 16th

Breach of Trust - 1500 Palm Boulevard

The District Manager of a local establishment reported that a former employee had stolen \$486 from the night deposit. The District Manager indicated that the former employee failed to report for work, which is when it was discovered that the money was missing. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, January 17th

Petit Larceny - Seagrove Lane

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen a television valued at \$650 from the rental property. The victim was unable to provide a serial number or time frame for the theft and provided the Officer with information for the Property Manager. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, January 20th

Grand Larceny – 9500 Palmetto Drive

A victim reported that several months ago she noticed that she had jewelry missing, but attempted to locate it on her own. After having no success in locating her jewelry that had been missing for approximately two months, she reported is now reporting it as stolen. The stolen jewelry is valued at \$7975. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

<u>Driving Under the Influence</u> – Waterway Boulevard / Timber Lane

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon making contact with the driver, the Officer suspected that he was intoxicated. The driver was given the opportunity to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and was arrested at the conclusion. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing where he provided a breath sample resulting in a BAC of 0.24%. The driver was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Saturday, January 24th

Public Intoxication - 1500 Block of Palm Boulevard

Officers responded to a local shopping center where IOPFD and Charleston County EMS requested assistance with a subject that was found passed out in the restroom of the store. It was determined

that the subject was intoxicated. Further investigation revealed that the subject had two other friends, who were also intoxicated. All three subjects were placed under arrest and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

<u>Driving Under the Influence</u> – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for a vehicle license plate violation. During contact with the driver, the Officer suspected that she was under the influence. The driver was given the opportunity to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. The driver only completed one of the three tests, refusing to complete the remaining tests, and requested to just be given a ticket and allowed to go home. The Officer placed the driver under arrest and transported her to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where she refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Sunday, January 25th

Driving Under the Influence - IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. When asked for her driver's license, the driver handed the Officer her debit card and when asked, admitted to drinking two beers. The driver was given the opportunity to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, while on the way, informed the Officer that she had a pending DUI in another jurisdiction. The driver provided a breath sample that resulted in a BAC of .18%. The driver was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Petit Larceny - 34th Avenue Beach Access

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen her daughter's skateboard. The victim was unable to provide a serial number, but was able to provide a detailed description. The skateboard was valued at \$230. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

<u>Driving Under the Influence</u> – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for speeding and upon making contact with the driver, suspected that he was under the influence. The driver was given the opportunity to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Monday, January 26th

Burglary - Seaside Cottage Lane

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had entered the rental property and stolen three televisions valued at \$942. A back door and window were found to be open. The victim was able to provide serial numbers for all three of the televisions, which were entered into NCIC. The Property Manager was able to provide information on employees who had been inside the residence during this month. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, January 28th

Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / 42nd Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that she was possibly under the influence. The driver was given an opportunity to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where she provided a breath sample that resulted in a BAC of .31%. The driver was transported to Charleston County Detention Center.

During the month, Officers came into contact with three (3) subjects during the course of their patrols who had outstanding warrants with local agencies. The warrant arrests were for contempt of court, failure to appear and driving under the influence.

Community Service

During the month of January 2015, Officers issued four (4) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices and one hundred and nine (109) Property Security Check notices. Sergeant Baldrick assisted citizens with the installation of child safety seats in their vehicles on two (2) occasions.

Isle of Palms Police Department

During the month of January 2015, the Consolidated Dispatch Center received and dispatched 5318 calls for service to the four (4) public safety agencies of Isle of Palms and Sullivan's Island, and the National Park Service. The following is a breakdown of activity by department.
