The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of March 2015.

Sunday, March 1st

<u>Public Intoxication</u> – Back Bay Drive / Seagrass Lane

Officers responded to a report of a subject causing a disturbance, yelling that he was going to "slash" another person. Officers located the subject and further investigation revealed that the subject was intoxicated and was the cause of the disturbance. The subject was arrested and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Sunday, March 8th

<u>Drug Equipment Violation / Warrant Arrest</u> – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Contact with the occupants of the vehicle revealed that the Officer smelled what was believed to be burned marijuana coming from within the vehicle. Further investigation found that the occupants were in possession of drug paraphernalia and one of the occupants had an outstanding arrest warrant with Summerville Police Department. The subject was arrested and transferred to the issuing agency.

Monday, March 9th

Disorderly Conduct - 1100 Block of Ocean Boulevard

An Officer responded to a report of an intoxicated subject who was refusing to pay for his taxicab ride. Further investigation revealed that the intoxicated subject did not know where he was staying and he attempted to walk away from the Officer, demanding that the Officer let him go home. The subject was placed under arrest and lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Tuesday, March 10th

Burglary - 1100 Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a burglary in progress at a local restaurant after hours. A witness provided a description of a subject that was seen leaving with what appeared to a cash box. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, March 12th

Simple Possession of Marijuana - 1400 Block of Palm Boulevard

An Officer on patrol observed a suspicious vehicle that was parked with the subjects sitting in the back of the vehicle. Further investigation revealed that the occupants were drinking beer and smoking marijuana. The occupants were arrested and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Saturday, March 14th

<u>Driving Under the Influence</u> – IOP Connector

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for speeding, 85 MPH in a posted 55 MPH speed zone. Further investigation revealed that the driver was possibly operating the vehicle under the influence. The Officer had the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, the driver was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing and provided a breath sample with a BAC of .15%. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Driving <u>Under the Influence</u> – IOP Connector

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Further investigation revealed that the driver was possibly operating the vehicle under the influence. The Officer had the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, the driver was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing and refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Monday, March 16th

Petit Larceny - Waterway Island Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen her kayak that had been stored on her pontoon boat near her residence. The property is valued at \$1,299.00 and this case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, March 20th

Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon contact with the driver, the Officer believed that the driver was possibly under the influence. The Officer had the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, the driver was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where the driver refused to provide a breath sample. In addition to the DUI charge, the driver was charged with open container of beer, minor in possession of beer, false information to a police officer. The driver was lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u> – 20th Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a defective equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had three (3) outstanding arrest warrants with Charleston County Sheriff's Office (CCSO) for check fraud. The driver was arrested and transferred to CCSO.

Underage Possession of Alcohol - 3900 Block of Palm Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of loud noise and determined that there was a group of subjects in the garage area of the residence who were talking and playing music loudly. Further investigation revealed that the subjects were playing beer bong and all under the age of 21. Officers charged six (6) subjects with underage possession of alcohol and with noise order violation.

Saturday, March 21st

Murder – 24th Avenue

Officers responded to a call of a female subject who stated that she had shot her husband. The female subject was placed under arrest and this case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, March 22nd

Collision Involving Department Vehicle – 900 Block of Palm Boulevard

An Officer was patrolling the 900 Block of Palm Boulevard when a vehicle approached from behind at a high rate of speed and collided with the Officer. The impact caused the Officer to lose control of the vehicle, with it flipping over, landing on the driver's side. The Officer was able to kick the front windshield out and exit the overturned vehicle. SC Highway Patrol investigated the collision and arrested the other driver for driving under the influence and simple possession of marijuana.

Tuesday, March 24th

Driving Under Suspension - Ocean Boulevard / JC Long Boulevard

An Officer responded to a report of a male subject who was asking for money to get his vehicle out of the impound lot. The Officer met with the subject and as they were talking, he stated that he car was passing by. The Officer stopped the vehicle and further investigation revealed that the driver's license was paid and that she had several unpaid traffic tickets. The driver was arrested and lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center. The Officer determined that the male subject had an active arrest warrant out of North Carolina, who requested that a hold be placed on the subject for extradition. The male subject was also lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Friday, March 27th

Public Intoxication – JC Long Boulevard and Palm Boulevard

An Officer patrolling the area observed a female subject who was unsteady on her feet and having difficulty crossing the street at 2:00am. Further investigation revealed that the subject was intoxicated and refused to answer the Officer's questions. The subject was arrested and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Saturday, March 28th

Petit Larceny – 1000 Block of Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen her cellular phone that was last seen sitting on the bar near the front door of a local establishment. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

<u>Driving Under the Influence</u> – Palm Boulevard / 5th Avenue

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for multiple moving violations. During contact with the driver, the Officer determined that the driver was possibly under the influence. The Officer had the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, which resulted in the driver being placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where the driver refused to provide a breath sample. In addition to being charged with driving under the influence, the driver was also charged with simple possession of marijuana, possession of drug paraphernalia and was lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Public Intoxication - 1200 Block of Palm Boulevard

An Officer conducted a business check at a local store, observed a subject sitting in the driver's seat of a parked car who appeared to be passed out. The Officer attempted to get the attention of the subject, who finally responded and tried to open the window using the air conditioner controls. The subject explained to the Officer that he was waiting for his sister to come out of the store and must have fallen asleep, but there was no one inside the store except the Clerk. The subject was unable to provide any further information and was arrested. The Officer lodged the subject at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Sunday, March 29th

Petit Larceny - 600 Block of Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into a vacation rental home and stole two televisions, valued at \$900.00. The victim was unable to provide any serial numbers for the stolen items. This case has been submitted to CID for further investigation.

Monday, March 30th

Petit Larceny - JC Long Boulevard

An Officer responded to a local establishment in reference to a theft that has just occurred. Investigation revealed that a subject had walked out without paying for food and beverages totaling \$87.45. It was determined that the same subject had walked out on a bill totaling \$44.50 at another local establishment. The Officer located the subject, placed him under arrest and lodged him at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Tuesday, March 31st

Petit Larceny - 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen his skateboard, jacket, wallet and bankcard when he was asked to leave a local establishment after causing a disturbance. The victim's property is valued at \$320.00. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Public Intoxication - 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

An Officer responded to a report of a white female subject who had fallen on the back deck of a local establishment. While the IOPFD was treating the female subject, a male subject who was intoxicated became aggressive towards FD personnel and began to interfere with their ability to assist the female subject. The male subject refused to follow the instructions of the Officer and was arrested and lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Community Service / Personnel Recognition

During the month of March 2015, Officers issued seven (7) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices and seventy-two (72) Property Security Check notices.

On March 4th, Officers attended the Keenagers Meeting at the IOP Recreation Department where they spoke with attendees and assisted with filling up bags with Easter candy.

Sergeant Baldrick assisted three (3) citizens with the proper installation of the child safety seats in their vehicles.

The Department initiated a new program this month called Kids & Cops where Officers interact with the younger children that attend pre-school at the IOP Recreation Department. On March 10th, Officer Louise Hardy spent time with the kids, reading to them, talking about basic safety rules and let them ask questions. On March 17th, Officer James Couche met with the kids and discussed bicycle safety, such as how to safely cross the street with their bicycles. He also discussed beach safety and what they should do if they lose sight of their parents.

On March 12th, Sergeant Meekins attended a new home owners breakfast for the Wild Dunes Community. He provided Livability magnets, business cards and information related to quality of life concerns.

On March 14th, Captain Usry and Sergeant Meekins attended the annual Wild Dunes Community Association HOA Meeting. During the meeting, we discussed concerns relating to crime, coyotes, and noise. Information for RAIDSOnline, which as a new resource for citizens was also explained.

On March 18th, the Department held its first Coffee With A Cop Event for 2015. The event was hosted by the Acme Lowcountry Kitchen and approximately ten (10) citizens came to drink coffee, meet the Officers and talk about issues and concerns.

On March 24th, Officer Lawrimore and ACO Enourato participated in the Sullivan's Island Elementary School Career Day. During this event, the Officers spoke to approximately 14 classes about their job responsibilities, bicycle safety, seatbelt safety and answered questions.
