Call Summary

September 2017

- 9/8/17 Personnel responded to a possible outside fire on the Sullivan's Island side of the Breach Inlet Bridge. Upon arrival it was found that a small brush fire was burning on the Isle of Palms side of Breach Inlet Bridge by the walk path leading down to the beach. Crews pulled a hose line and extinguished the fire. It was uncertain what caused the fire. All units cleared the scene.
- 9/11/17 Personnel responded to a call of a boat that impacted the Isle of Palms Connector Bridge. Upon arrival, crews found a boat which had broken loose of its moorings during a storm and impacted the bridge on the Northern side. Nobody was on board, and fire crews were unable to gather information off of the hull of the boat in order to notify the owners. All units cleared the scene.
- 9/11/17 Personnel responded to Sparrow Drive for a report of a structure fire. Crews were assisted by Pine Ridge Fire Department high water vehicle to access the residence due to heavy flooding following a storm. The residents of the home advised that they smelled smoke coming from the garage. Fire crews investigated and found a strong electrical smell. Power to the residence was disconnected as it appeared that the electrical system was affected by the flood waters. The home owner was advised to have an electrician inspect their electrical system before turning the power back on. All units cleared from the scene.

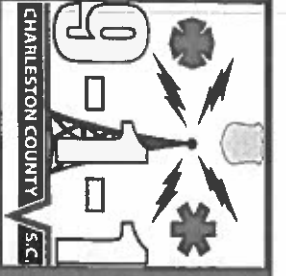
