The following is a synopsis of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of January 2008.

Patrol

January 1, 2008 Just before 1 A.M., an officer on patrol observed several juveniles run across Cameron Boulevard near 34th Avenue and investigated. The officer made contact with a female juvenile who was unable to stand without assistance. The officer determined that the juvenile was in an obvious state of intoxication and made telephone contact with a parent in Mount Pleasant. Before the parent could respond, the juvenile passed out and had to be treated and transported by EMS to East Cooper Hospital. She was charged with Public Intoxication to be heard in Family Court. The officer determined that the parent dropped her daughter off at a friend's residence on Yacht Harbor Court earlier in the evening. An officer went to that residence to check on the welfare of other possible juveniles that may be at that location. The others were located and identified, where they advised the officer that they had been drinking earlier at another location. The owner of the residence assumed responsibility for the three remaining girls.

January 1, 2008 Just before 4 A.M., officers responded to a residence on Hartnett Boulevard where a burglary in progress had been reported. The owner of the residence showed officers where he had discovered a male subject sleeping on a couch in his living room. The officers determined that the subject, who was extremely intoxicated, had accidentally entered the unlocked front door without permission and fell asleep. Due to the subject's condition and inability to care for himself he was taken into custody and

charged with Public Intoxication since the homeowners did not wish to prosecute for Burglary.

January 3, 2008 An officer responded to a business on Ocean Boulevard that reported an overnight burglary. The cash register had been opened with currency reported missing. An ATM machine in the business was damaged extensively where the suspect attempted to unsuccessfully make entry. Evidence gathered indicated that the burglary was staged to appear as though forced entry was made through the front door. Investigators determined that a male subject with access to the key was responsible and he was arrested on January 29, 2008, after admitting to the crime. He was charged with Breach of Trust.

January 4, 2008 An officer responded to a residence on Forest Trail where an elderly female reported, via 911, that she was having difficulty breathing. The officer made entry through a rear door with Fire Department personnel and found the subject sitting in a chair in the kitchen. EMS responded and transported the subject to a local hospital for treatment of a possible heart attack.

January 5, 2008 A concerned citizen reported a reckless driver on Waterway Boulevard traveling toward 21st Avenue. A nearby officer positioned his vehicle and waited for the vehicle to approach, then followed the vehicle. The vehicle was stopped and the driver was unable to produce a valid driver's license. A computer check of the driver indicated that he was wanted in Conyers, Georgia and in South Carolina by the Charleston County Sheriff's Office. Since Conyers, Georgia declined to extradite, he was taken into custody and turned over to a Charleston County Deputy, after being cited for No Proof of Insurance and Failure to Surrender License Plate.

January 6, 2008 Officers responded to a front beach establishment where management reported an intoxicated patron causing problems with the bartenders. Before the officers arrived, it was reported that the subject left walking down Ocean Boulevard. The subject was located and identified and observed to be having problems walking from the sidewalk to the street. Due to his extreme condition and inability to care for his own safety, he was taken into custody and charged with Public Intoxication.

January 8, 2008 Officers responded to a residence where a citizen reported flames coming from the rear of a residence on 35th Avenue. The officer met the citizen who stated that he attempted to stomp the flames out while his friend dialed 911. The Fire Department arrived minutes later and worked the fire that was contained to a sunroom.

January 11, 2008 After stopping a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for an equipment violation the driver was unable to provide proof of insurance to the officer. A computer check of the driver's license indicated that he had ten unpaid traffic tickets on his record. After taking the driver into custody a quantity of marijuana was located in the floorboard of the vehicle. He was charged with NRVC 10 counts and Simple Possession of Marijuana.

January 12, 2008 A Sullivan's Island police officer requested assistance with traffic control for a vehicle rollover on the causeway in their jurisdiction.

January 12, 2008 Just before midnight, an officer stopped a vehicle on Ocean Boulevard for an equipment violation and after running a computer check of the driver's license he was determined to have a suspended license, with two prior convictions. After being taken into custody the driver was found to have been in possession of open liquor and beer. The driver was charged with DUS 3rd offense, Violation of NRVC and Open Container in a Motor Vehicle.

January 16, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on Sand Dollar Drive regarding a domestic dispute that had been reported there. When the officers arrived they met the husband in the driveway who explained that his wife had struck him in the eye causing an obvious injury. The wife had locked herself in the house and refused to come to the door. Entry was made to the residence where the wife was located hiding behind a sofa. She was taken into custody and charged with Criminal Domestic Violence.

January 17, 2008 After a two month investigation into a series of residential burglaries to rental homes, Investigators arrested a female employee of a local cleaning service, who was charged with 5 counts of Breach of Trust and 2 counts of Burglary 1st degree. A female accomplice and roommate was also arrested and charged with Breach of Trust and Burglary 1st degree. Arrest Warrants were prepared for a third accomplice, the brother of the female employee, who was arrested a short time later by the Berkeley County Sheriff's Office. He spent several days in jail in the Berkeley County Jail to satisfy a Bench Warrant that Berkeley County had on file. He was extradited to Charleston County charged with 4 counts of Burglary 1st Degree, 2 counts of Grand Larceny, 2 counts of Petit Larceny, and Breach of Trust.

January 19, 2008 After observing a speeding vehicle on the connector, the officer followed and noted that the vehicle was not slowing down. Once stopped, the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol while speaking to the driver. After submitting to and failing several Field Sobriety Tests, the driver was taken into custody and transported to headquarters for a Datamaster Test, where the driver failed to provide a sample. He was arrested and charged with DUI.

January 19, 2008 An officer responded to the East Cooper Hospital to meet with an intoxicated female subject who reported to hospital staff that she had been assaulted by her boyfriend at her Cameron Boulevard residence. After the officer gathered the necessary information, the subject then refused to cooperate any further and did not wish to prosecute the subject responsible.

January 22, 2008 An officer accompanied a Mount Pleasant Police Officer to a residence on 26th Avenue which was the last known address of a male subject that they had Arrest Warrants for. The officers determined that the subject had moved to Florida.

January 22, 2008 An officer accompanied a Mount pleasant Police Officer to a residence on Morgan's Cove Drive attempting to make contact with a male subject that they had active Arrest Warrants for. It was determined that the subject was not at home.

January 29, 2008 Officers responded to a 911 hang up at a residence on Palm Boulevard. Officers met with a female subject who appeared distressed. She explained that after an argument over coming home late her common law husband assaulted her on the face with his hands. The husband had already left the residence prior to the officer's arrival and an Investigator is handling the matter.

January 29, 2008 A local Rental Company reported that numerous checks were cashed at several local banks against their business account totaling almost \$6,000. Investigators are actively working the case to identify and located the responsible subject.

Personnel/Community Services

January 8, 2008 Chief Buckhannon received a letter from a citizen praising the police department for their planning, preparedness, and proactive control of the influx of traffic through the Isle of Palms while the Ben Sawyer Bridge was closed for repair.

January 10, 2008 PFC Baldrick met a male subject at police headquarters and instructed him on the proper installation of a child safety seat in his vehicle.

January 14, 2008 At the request of the Basis Training Coordinator of the South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy in Columbia, South Carolina, Sgt. Ryan played the Great Highland bagpipe at the graduation ceremony of Basic Law Enforcement Class 514.

January 24, 2008 Animal Control Officer Cook received a letter of appreciation from a grateful citizen.

January 31, 2008 Det. Sgt. Caldwell and Det. Tarr were awarded Employees of the Month for the month of January for their hard work in solving a rash of burglaries to rental homes on the Isle of Palms.

January 31, 2008 Det. Sgt. Caldwell, Sgt. Usry, and PFC Baldrick provided a presentation to a local Cub Scout Pack to complete several requirements to attain the rank of Bear Scout.

January 31, 2009 For the month of January, officers on patrol discovered three businesses and nineteen homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of two hundred sixty three Victim of Crime Forms were issued to business or property owners for various violations noted by officers on patrol.
