The following is a synopsis of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of June 2008.

Patrol

June 1, 2008 A concerned citizen following a vehicle on Palm Boulevard reported that it was operating in a reckless manner. An officer located the vehicle on the Connector and stopped it, and while speaking to the driver detected a heavy odor of alcohol. After taking and failing several Field Sobriety Tests the subject was taken into custody and swung around in an attempt to avoid being handcuffed. The subject then complained that his wrist was injured so first responders from the fire department arrived to administer first aid. They determined that x-rays needed to be taken and he was then transported to a local hospital for treatment. Since so much time had elapsed since the stop, a blood alcohol test was not administered. The subject was charged with Reckless Driving and Open Container and transported to the Detention Center.

June 2, 2008 Investigators arrested a sixty-two year old male subject who turned himself in through a local attorney for 2 counts of Lewd Act Upon Minor/Under Sixteen for two separate incidents that occurred on the Isle of Palms in 1985 and 1988. The investigation into the crimes had been ongoing since August of 2007.

June 3, 2008 Officers responded to a Dunes Boulevard residence where a physical altercation had been reported. The victim reported that a male subject that had just left the residence and threatened to assault him with a tire iron. The suspect was located and charged with Assault.

June 4, 2008 At approximately 1:30 A.M., an officer on patrol observed a vehicle fail to stop for a stop sign then unlawfully change lanes. The vehicle was stopped on the Connector and while speaking to the driver the officer immediately detected a strong

odor of alcohol. The driver admitted that he had been drinking and submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests that he failed. He was transported to headquarters to be administered a Datamaster Test, which he refused. The driver was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

June 5, 2008 An officer responded to a Cameron Boulevard residence where the homeowner reported the theft of a utility trailer from the driveway next to the residence. The trailer and its contents were valued at almost \$15,000.

June 6, 2008 An off duty Isle of Palms police officer reported a vehicle operating erratically on Palm Boulevard near 45th Avenue. The officer stopped the vehicle and immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol from the interior of the vehicle while speaking to the driver. An on duty officer responded and administered Field Sobriety Tests to the driver, which he failed. He was then transported to headquarters and given a Datamaster Test where he registered a .10% level of alcohol. He was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

June 7, 2008 A concerned citizen reported a possible drunk driver coming from Sullivan's Island on Palm Boulevard. An officer located the vehicle driving in the bike lane then cross back into the lane of travel and across the double line before being stopped. While speaking to the driver the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle and administered several Field Sobriety Tests, which the driver failed. The driver was then transported to headquarters and given a Datamaster Test where she registered a .19% level of alcohol. She was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

June 8, 2008 A concerned citizen reported an intoxicated male subject attempting to enter his vehicle in a municipal parking lot. Responding officers located the subject and immediately determined that he was too intoxicated to care for himself. While investigating the incident, officers observed a black Labrador retriever locked in the closed vehicle with no ventilation or water. The dog was removed from the vehicle and taken into custody and provided water. The subject was arrested and transported to the Detention center charged with Disorderly Conduct, Animal Cruelty and Unlawful Carrying of a Pistol which was located in the vehicle.

June 8, 2008 Officers responded to a 26th Avenue residence where a domestic dispute had been reported. Upon arrival, an officer observed a female subject lying on the living room floor with an injured leg. She claimed recent knee surgery was aggravated when she was thrown to the ground during an altercation with her husband. It was determined that the husband was the primary aggressor and he was taken into custody charged with Criminal Domestic Violence and transported to the Detention Center.

June 9, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on 44th Avenue where a family member reported that another male family member was upstairs restraining a male subject. It was determined that the subject being restrained had consumed several alcoholic beverages mixed with medication from an existing medical condition. The subject was handcuffed

and taken into emergency protective custody and committed to a local hospital for observation.

June 9, 2008 Occupants of a residence on Charleston Boulevard reported that while they were on the beach, a person or persons unknown had entered their garage and stolen their 2006 Chevrolet Tahoe. Through the use of Onstar, the vehicle was located a short time later abandoned in a wooded area in North Charleston. The vehicle was towed back to the Isle of Palms where Investigators processed it for fingerprints and other evidence.

June 10, 2008 An officer responded to a residence on Ocean Point where a subject reported that while he was unloading luggage, a Glock model 23 handgun was stolen from inside of the vehicle which was left unattended for approximately fifteen minutes.

June 11, 2008 Officers responded to a condominium unit on Ocean Boulevard where someone reported a possible underage party in the unit. Officers determined that alcohol was present and the persons present under 21 years old. A total of six persons were determined to be in possession of alcohol, and one also in possession of marijuana and a false ID. All six were charged with Underage Possession of Alcohol, and one subject with the additional charges of Simple Possession of Marijuana, Unlawful Use of DL, Possession of Schedule II Controlled Substance and Possession of Schedule III Controlled Substance.

June 12, 2008 While on patrol of the Connector an officer observed a vehicle traveling 89 miles per hour. The vehicle was stopped and the officer immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol from within. The driver submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed and was taken into custody and transported to headquarters for a Datamaster Test. When given the opportunity to provide a sample, the driver refused. Due to a prior conviction for DUI he was charged with DUI 2nd offense and DUS and transported to the Detention Center.

June 12, 2008 Investigators arrested a local female subject who voluntarily turned herself in with the assistance of her attorney for 2 counts of Burglary 1st degree. The incidents occurred in April where bloodborne evidence was left at the scene of one Burglary. Investigators tracked blood evidence to a neighbor's residence which is where the suspect resided. A Search Warrant was executed on the suspect to retrieve DNA samples, which were compared by the SLED Forensic Lab to blood evidence taken by Investigators when processing the crime scene. SLED positively identified the comparisons to the suspect.

June 12, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on 32nd Avenue where a parent reported that his son had attempted to commit suicide by cutting his wrist. The suspect's mother also sustained a cut to her finger when she attempted to take the knife away from her son. EMS transported both subjects to the hospital for treatment. It is believed that the suspect cut himself to cover up the fact that he had just been observed inside of a neighbor's home stealing personal property. The neighbor has declined to prosecute the suspect for the Burglary and theft.

June 13, 2008 The Project Manager for the Beach Renourishment Project notified police that a cannonball had been pumped through the dredging pipes from offshore and deposited on the beach with the sand. The police department immediately notified the Charleston County Sheriff's Office and SLED Bomb Squad, who responded. The South Carolina Historical Society and National Park Service were also notified. A Park Ranger from Fort Moultrie positively identified the cannonball as being fired from a Columbiad Cannon, probably from Sullivan's Island during the Civil War. The Park Ranger assumed custody and transported it to Fort Moultrie for further inspection.

June 17, 2008 Just after 6:30 A.M, officers were advised that a male subject last seen on the beach at 2:30 A.M, was missing. Police and Fire Department personnel searched for the subject until the owner of a beachfront residence reported that an unknown male subject had apparently broken into his home and was asleep on his couch. The subject was identified as the person that had been reported missing. It was determined that the subject had used a small table to smash a second story glass door to make entry while the owners were asleep. The suspect was taken into custody and charged with Burglary 1st degree and transported to the Detention Center.

June 17, 2008 Officers responded to the Isle of Palms Marina where someone had reported that an unknown and intoxicated subject was swimming near the boat ramp. The officer located the male subject, and while the subject was retrieving identification from his vehicle parked nearby, a quantity of marijuana was discovered. The subject was taken into custody and charged with Simple Possession of Marijuana.

June 18, 2008 Just after 4:30 A.M., an officer on patrol observed a male subject on Palm Boulevard near 27th Avenue attempting with difficulty to enter a vehicle that did not belong to him. The subject was unsteady on his feet, somewhat incoherent, and disoriented. His vehicle was located a block away where an empty pill bottle was discovered. The officer determined that the subject had ingested all of the prescription pills and consumed a large quantity of alcohol in an attempt to commit suicide. Fire Department first responders arrived as well as EMS. He was transported by EMS to a local hospital for observation.

June 18, 2008 An officer met with a Mount Pleasant Police Officer in order to serve an Arrest Warrant on a subject living on 42nd Avenue. The wanted subject was not at his residence.

June 19, 2008 Just after 4:30 A.M., the police department received notification from the Folly Beach Police Department that a male subject who was wanted by our department was in their custody and had been incarcerated for alcohol related charges. He was wanted for Assault and Battery w/the Intent to Kill as a result of an incident that occurred on Chapman Drive in March of this year where the subject stabbed a male subject during an altercation. The suspect was placed on a \$50,000 surety bond.

June 19, 2008 Investigators served an Arrest Warrant for Grand Larceny at the Detention Center on a subject responsible for the May 2008 theft of jewelry and electronics games

from a residence on Forest Trail. The subject had been arrested for other charges by another local police agency and when he was lodged, the Isle of Palms warrant appeared in the computer.

June 23, 2008 Officers responded to a major structure fire on Ocean Point in Wild Dunes. Officers provided traffic control to keep vehicles from running over fire hoses in the street, and provided crowd control at a safe distance. It is believed that the fire was caused by a lightening strike to the roof of the residence.

June 25, 2008 Officers assisted Mount Pleasant Police in traffic control on their end of the Connector while they handled a serious accident near Seaside Farms.

June 26, 2008 An officer responded to the beach near 7th Avenue where an adult male subject reported that he had been bitten by a small shark in approximately four feet of water. He sustained some lacerations to his hand and went to a local hospital for treatment. The beach was closed for a period of time from 5th Avenue to 9th Avenue.

June 27, 2008 Officers placed four juvenile male subjects under arrest for Burglary 2nd degree after they had illegally entered a pool bar at Wild Dunes after hours and had stolen approximately \$150 worth of liquor. All four Mount Pleasant residents were released to their respective parents for prosecution in Family Court.

June 27, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on 22nd Avenue where a domestic dispute had been reported. It was determined that the dispute was between boyfriend and girlfriend and had only been verbal in nature. Eviction procedures were explained to the owner of the residence.

June 29, 2008 An officer responded to a reported house fire to a residence on Ocean Boulevard. The officer cleared the residence of occupants and was able to put out the fire with several bowls of water from the kitchen. The fire was confined the rear porch siding. Fire Department personnel arrived to insure the fire was extinguished.

Personnel/community Relations

June 21, 2008 At the request of the Charleston County Sheriff's Office, Sgt. J. Ryan played the Great Highland Bagpipes at the opening ceremony for the Palmetto Motorcycle Skills Competition, in memory of two motorcycles officers killed in the line of duty since they competed in the 2007 competition.

June 30, 2008 For the month June, officers on patrol discovered one business and one home with open or unsecured doors. A total of 159 Victim of Crime Forms were issued to business or property owners for various violations noted by officers on patrol.




