The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of November 2009.

Patrol

November 1, 2009 An officer met with a resident of Palm Boulevard, who reported being swindled out of \$2,610. After placing an ad to rent a room at a local college housing office, the victim received an e-mail from a female in the United Kingdom interested in renting the room. After an exchange of multiple e-mails she then received an e-mail from the inquiring student's father stating that he would immediately send her a check via Fed Ex. After receiving a check in the amount of \$4,550 payable to her the victim received an e-mail from the father stating that his bookkeeper had made a mistake and sent too much money and instructed her to return the difference, which she did, in the amount of \$2,610. After sending this money the victim received an e-mail from the alleged father stating that his daughter had been in a serious accident and to please return the balance. Only then did the victim realize that she had been swindled. An investigation is ongoing.

November 1, 2009 An officer met with a female resident of Palm Boulevard who reported that she met a subject through an online dating service and discovered that the subject had stolen over \$45,000 worth of jewelry from her while in her residence. She stated that he identified himself as an Army Colonel preparing to be deployed to Iraq. After the victim discovered that he was an imposter, she reported the incident. The US Army Criminal Investigations Division is investigating the suspect for impersonating an Army officer.

November 4, 2009 Officers responded to Palmetto Drive residence regarding a reported domestic dispute between husband and wife. The officers separated the parties and determined that the dispute was a continuation of a major disagreement from the previous evening while visiting a restaurant. The argument escalated this date to a point where the wife struck her elderly husband in the face, knocking off his eyeglasses causing a cut to the nose. She then threw two full cans of soda at her husband striking him in the ribs. The female subject was taken into custody and charged with Criminal Domestic Violence.

November 7, 2009 An officer on patrol observed a speeding vehicle weaving significantly on the Connector and stopped the vehicle to investigate. While speaking to the driver the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol and administered several Field Sobriety Tests, which the driver failed. He was transported to the Detention Center where the driver initially stated he would refuse the test. After the 20-minute observation period the driver decided he that he would provide a sample, where he registered a .24% level of alcohol. He was lodged and charged with DUI.

November 9, 2009 A female resident of Carolina Boulevard reported to an Investigator that she had at least three fraudulent financial transactions against her bank account using checks that were not issued to her. All three checks were cashed in businesses in the Columbia area and totaled approximately \$800.

November 10, 2009 Officers responded to a residence on Merritt Boulevard, where a domestic dispute had been reported. After investigating the matter the officers made the determination that the dispute between two grown brothers was only verbal in nature. Both parties agreed to cease their disagreement.

November 12, 2009 Officers responded to a residence on 24th Avenue, where a domestic violence incident had been reported. Police communicators had already received a 911 call from both parties involved. Officers made the determination that the husband had been the primary aggressor and had caused visible injuries. He was taken into custody charged with Criminal Domestic Violence.

November 14, 2009 An officer observed a vehicle driving erratically on Palm Boulevard and stopped it to investigate. While speaking to the driver the officer detected a faint odor of alcohol from within the vehicle and made the determination that the driver did not have a drivers license. The driver was also found to be in possession of an open bottle of beer. He was charged with No DL, Speeding, and Open Container.

November 14, 2009 An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for failing to stop for a stop sign and while speaking to the driver detected a strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle. The driver first stated that he had nothing to drink, then admitted to not much, then asked could he just get someone to drive him home. The driver then failed to provide vehicle documentation. The driver submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed. After being transported to headquarters for a Datamaster Test he then refused to cooperate, and was charged with DUI.

November 18, 2009 Officers responded to a Wild Dunes hotel, where management advised that two guests who had been arguing in the bar and later in the lobby, were now arguing in their room. The officers, with the assistance of management, met with the parties involved. The couple was separated and interviewed, where the determination was made that the husband had grabbed his wife forcefully by the face, cutting her lip in the process. When the wife attempted to call 911, the husband pressed the disconnect button to the telephone. The husband was taken into custody and charged with Criminal Domestic Violence.

November 22, 2009 Just after 1 A.M., an officer on patrol on the Connector observed a vehicle traveling onto the island at over 100 miles per hour. When the officer stopped the vehicle he observed that the driver had a very young child in a car seat identified as his son. The driver was allowed to call his sister to assume custody of the child. The driver was charged with Reckless Driving because of his speed and the fact that he endangered the life of the child in the vehicle. The vehicle was towed and he was transported to the Detention Center.

November 24, 2009 An officer accompanied a Mount Pleasant police officer to a residence in an attempt to serve an Arrest Warrant on a female subject whose last known address was listed as 26th Avenue. They were able to determine that the subject had moved to Mount Pleasant.

November 24, 2009 Officers responded to a residence on Ocean Boulevard, where a resident reported that she witnessed her husband and a family friend being attacked by two male subjects in the front of her home. The two suspects then fled the scene and left the area in a van that was waiting for them. Officers determined that the assault that she witnessed was an attempted Strong Arm Robbery. The two male subjects were attacked while retrieving luggage from their vehicle and both were struck numerous times about their head, neck, and back, sustaining torn clothing while trying to protect their valuables. A witness was able to follow the suspect vehicle and obtain a license plate number, but the vehicle was lost in traffic. Investigators met with the victims and were able to have a police sketch artist prepare composite drawings of the two suspects, and are following several productive leads to the case.

November 25, 2009 Just before 6 P.M., officers responded to the area of 41st Avenue and Hartnett Boulevard, where a male subject reported that he had been assaulted. The first officer to arrive observed a male subject and a dog lying on the ground. A male subject standing nearby immediately placed his hands in the air and was taken into custody. It was determined that the victim and his dog were sprayed with Mace two times after the victims puppy got out of its fenced in yard and allegedly confronted the suspect and his wife. The suspect was taken into custody charged with Simple Assault.

November 27, 2009 After stopping a truck for speeding on the Connector the officer determined that the driver did not have a license. The driver was taken into custody when the officer determined that he had provided a false name and date of birth. He was

charged with Speeding, Driving Without a DL, and False Information to Police. The passenger was charged with Open Container, but not taken into custody.

November 28, 2009 Just after midnight officers responded to a local convenience store where a domestic dispute had been reported. Officers met with two female subjects who reported that they had been assaulted in a residence on Carolina Boulevard. Both subjects were transported to police headquarters where photos were taken of their injuries and written statements provided. The suspect was immediately located at his residence and taken into custody charged with Criminal Domestic Violence for the assault to his spouse and Simple Assault for the assault to his spouse's friend. While checking the background of all parties involved, a computer check of the victim indicated that she had an outstanding Arrest Warrant from Nassau County, Florida. That agency indicated that they would extradite her to Florida, so she was taken into custody and transported to the Detention Center with a hold placed on her pending extradition.

Personnel/Community Relations

November 30, 2009 For the month of November, officers discovered four businesses and three homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of one hundred fifty one Victim of Crime Forms were issued to business or homeowners for various violations noted, or to advise them that an officer checked their business during the night while on patrol.
