The following is a synopsis of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of November 2008.

Patrol

November 1, 2008 Officers responded to a residence after a thirteen year-old female reported to her father that her friend had a knife and was threatening to end her life. Officers searched the area and located the subject at her residence on Hartnett Boulevard. The juvenile making the threat was taken into Emergency Protective Custody and transported to MUSC for a psychiatric evaluation.

November 2, 2008 An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding on the Connector and while speaking to the driver detected a strong odor of alcohol coming from inside the vehicle and observed that the driver had slurred speech and bloodshot eyes. The driver fumbled through his wallet looking for his driver's license. After failing several Field Sobriety Tests the driver was taken into custody and transported to headquarters. On the way to headquarters the subject began to breath abnormally. First Responders were summoned to headquarters to administer first aid where he was transported to East Cooper Hospital by EMS. The attending physician diagnosed the subject as having alcohol intoxication and allowed him to be incarcerated. After being transported to the Detention Center, he again stated he did not feel well, and was again transported to a hospital and diagnosed with acute alcohol intoxication and issued a clearance to be lodged in the jail. The subject later admitted to being drunk and that he had faked being sick to avoid taking the Datamaster Test. He was lodged and charged with DUI, No Proof of Insurance and No Proof of Ownership.

November 5, 2008 The driver of a North Area Taxi reported that two subject's who were transported to the Isle of Palms from Summerville did not have the fare upon their arrival. The male and female passengers were taken into custody, where the male was charged with Disorderly Conduct and Failure to Comply with NRVC. The female subject was charged with Petit Larceny and held at the Detention Center for an outstanding Arrest Warrant through the Summerville Police Department.

November 9, 2008 Officer's responded to the third floor of a high rise condominium unit, where the occupant reported smelling smoke coming from the floor above theirs. Police personnel evacuated the fourth floor, firefighters inspected each unit and resolved the situation.

November 11, 2008 Officer's responded to a residence on 24th Avenue, where a domestic dispute had been reported. While responding, information was relayed that the husband was leaving the residence in a pickup truck. One officer stopped the vehicle and the other responded to the residence to make contact with the wife. It was determined that the dispute was only verbal and the husband had decided to leave the residence for the night. No other action taken.

November 11, 2008 At the request of a Sullivan's Island police officer, an Isle of Palms officer responded to assist in locating a male subject that fled from a traffic stop on Marshall Boulevard near Station 28 ½. The subject was located by a Charleston City Police Department K-9, and arrested by the Sullivan's Island officer.

November 16, 2008 A Sullivan's Island police officer requested assistance in clearing a residence on Middle Street, where a possible prowler had been reported. The property was searched with negative results.

November 16, 2008 A Sullivan's Island police officer requested assistance in responding to a residence on Ion Street, where a burglar alarm had been activated. The residence was found to be secure.

November 17, 2008 Just after 2 A.M., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation on Palm Boulevard near 14th Avenue. The officer determined that the vehicle had no insurance coverage and the passenger to be in possession of an open bottle of beer. The vehicle was towed and the driver was charged with Operating Uninsured and the passenger with Underage Possession of Beer.

November 18, 2008 An officer on patrol in the business district on Ocean Boulevard observed a male subject having difficulty negotiating the stairwell of a local establishment, then watched him fall into the roadway. The subject was unable to stand on his own, nor was he able to care for himself. He was taken into custody and charged with Disorderly Conduct.

November 19, 2008 Just after midnight an officer on patrol at the Isle of Palms Marina observed a vehicle parked facing the water near the boat ramp with someone slumped

over the steering wheel. The officer investigated and found a female subject who appeared to be sleeping behind the wheel of the vehicle. The officer managed to awaken the subject who appeared to be under the influence of alcohol. The subject stated that she had no money and that her debit card would not work and had no one in the area to contact. The subject was taken into custody and while conducting an inventory of the vehicle a quantity of marijuana was located in the console area. The subject was charged with No Overnight Sleeping in Vehicle, Disorderly Conduct, and Simple Possession of Marijuana.

November 19, 2008 Police and Fire Department personnel responded to a reported house fire on the 100 block of Ocean Boulevard. Police officers set up a perimeter while firefighters neutralized the fire inside and interior wall.

November 21, 2008 At the request of a Sullivan's Island police officer an Isle of Palms officer responded to assist in clearing a home on Middle Street, where the homeowners reported a prowler. The home was cleared with negative results.

November 22, 2008 Just after 1:30 A.M., an officer on patrol on the Connector, observed a vehicle veering from left to right in the lane of traffic. The officer followed and videotaped further erratic movement and stopped the vehicle. After the driver admitted that she had consumed beer and liquor she was administered several Field Sobriety Tests, which she failed. She was taken into custody and taken to headquarters to be administered a Datamaster Test, where she refused to provide a sample. She was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

November 22, 2008 An officer responded to a front beach establishment, where a medical assist call was dispatched. The officer arrived and observed an unconscious male subject at the bar and determined that he had been assaulted by another male subject, but did not want to press charges. Witnesses stated that the subject that had been assaulted had been cut off from purchasing any more alcohol and caused a scene with other patrons which led to his assault. Due to his condition and attitude he was charged with Public Intoxication, but allowed to leave with his spouse.

November 23, 2008 Just after midnight, officers responded to a Palm Boulevard residence, where the male complainant reported that his girlfriend had just slit her wrists and ingested a large quantity of pills. The responding officers removed the knife and attempted to converse with the victim. Fire Department personnel arrived and administered first aid until EMS arrived and transported the subject to a local hospital for evaluation.

November 23, 2008 At the request of a Sullivan's Island police officer an Isle of Palms officer responded to assist in removing an intoxicated subject from a vehicle parked in a yard at Station 22. The subject was removed and taken into custody without incident.

November 23, 2008 At the request of the Mount Pleasant Police Department, an Isle of Palms officer responded to their headquarters to perform a Datamaster Test on a male

subject that was in custody there. The officer administered the test and returned to the Isle of Palms without incident.

November 24, 2008 The mother of an infant female child reported a possible sexual assault to her child while the child's father had visitation this past weekend at his residence on the Isle of Palms. The case has been assigned to an Investigator.

November 25, 2008 A male subject came to police headquarters to report a verbal dispute at his residence with his estranged wife that escalated to a point where his wife assaulted him. The subject was advised of his options and suggested that he confer with his attorney for legal advice.

November 26, 2008 Just after 4 A.M., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for an equipment violation and discovered that the driver had a suspended license to operate a vehicle. The driver was arrested and charged with DUS.

November 27, 2008 At the request of a Sullivan's Island police officer, an Isle of Palms officer was sent to assist him in searching for a suspect in an attempted Burglary on Goldbug Avenue.

November 27, 2008 Just before midnight, an officer on patrol observed a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed on the Connector. The officer observed the vehicle almost collide with other vehicles and stopped the vehicle. The seventeen-year old driver was charged with Reckless Driving and No Proof of Insurance.

Personnel/Community Relations

November 1, 2008 AAA Carolina's Foundation named The Isle of Palms Outstanding Traffic Safe Community for 2008 for Traffic Safety. The Isle of Palms was named in the category of less than 10,000 in population, and recognized for their use of a new traffic survey device to follow-up traffic complaints and then if needed, set up saturation patrols.

November 30, 2008 For the month of November, officers discovered four businesses and three homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of 56 Victim of Crime Forms were issued to business or property owners for various violations noted or to advise them that an officer checked their business during the night while on patrol.
