The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of April.

## Saturday, April 1

### Burglary – 800 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that he could hear noises coming from the garage attached to his residence. Officers responded, entered the garage and located the subject inside the garage. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### Collision – Hit & Run – 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Ocean Boulevard

An officer responded to a report of an elderly female who had been struck by a juvenile operating a golf cart, who fled the scene. The victim stated that her knee had dislocated and the juvenile abandoned the golf cart in the grass and headed towards the beach. The juvenile was located and further investigation revealed that he had stolen the golf cart. The juvenile was charged and released to his parents to await a Family Court Hearing.

### Motor Vehicle Theft – 1100 Block Pavilion Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen his golf cart that he had left parked with the keys in the ignition. After taking this report, the officer received a call for subjects operating a golf cart on private property. The officer located the subjects, the golf cart was identified as being the one reported stolen. The subjects were placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

## Tuesday, April 4

### Fraud – Credit Card / ATM – 24<sup>th</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had used his credit card to make unauthorized purchases. The amount charged was \$800. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

## Friday, April 7

### Traffic Offense / Driving Under Suspension – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver's license was suspended and there was no insurance on the vehicle. The driver was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### Traffic Offense / Driving Under Suspension – Palm Boulevard / 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue

An officer conducting selective traffic enforcement stopped a vehicle for speeding, 47MPH in a posted 35MPH speed zone. Further investigation revealed that the driver's license was suspended and that he had an active arrest warrant with Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms (ATF) for a felon in possession of a firearm. The driver was arrested, charged and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center where he was transferred to ATF.

### Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / 25<sup>th</sup> Avenue

An officer observed a vehicle that was believed to be operated by a possible intoxicated driver. The officer observed multiple moving violations and the vehicle operating without headlights. The officer stopped the vehicle and upon making contact, determined that the driver was possibly under the influence. The officer requested the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at their conclusion was placed under arrest. An inventory of the vehicle prior to towing found an open container of beer, drug paraphernalia and that the driver was underage. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing where he provided a sample that registered a .14% BAC. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### Simple Assault -1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that while at a local establishment she had asked a female subject to move and was then pushed from behind, causing her to push into the female subject. The female subject then punched the victim in the jaw two times, causing a cut on her lip. The female subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### Disorderly Conduct / Assaulting Police Officer – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

An officer assisting with another call observed a female subject walking on the sidewalk with a beer can. When the officer spoke the subject, advising of the violation, the subject became belligerent. The officer instructed the subject to come over to his patrol car and she refused and attempted to get into an Uber. The subject was removed from the Uber and placed under arrest. When the officer opened the door to his patrol car and attempted to seat the subject inside, she began screaming, then kicked the officer in the groin. The subject was charged and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

## Saturday, April 8

### Simple Assault/Disorderly Conduct – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

An officer responded to a report of a fight at a local establishment and upon arrival found the subject detained by the security staff. Further investigation revealed that the subject had been causing problems with several patrons and when asked to leave, began fighting with the security staff. The security staff did not wish to press charges. The subject was charged with disorderly conduct and released to a sober friend.

Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations and upon speaking with the driver, determined that she was possibly under the influence. When asked if she had been drinking, the driver stated that a friend had told her not to drink and drive. The officer requested the driver to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and upon conclusion was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where she refused to complete the test. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Underage Possession of Alcohol – 31<sup>st</sup> Avenue

An officer responded to a reported noise violation and upon arrival observed a group of people on the porch yelling. When the officer knocked on the door, he observed several subjects start running, someone yelled, "shut up the cops are here", several subjects holding beer began to run, numerous beer containers on the floor, and one subject said, "everyone relax, I'm 21, I'll take care of it". When the subject came to the door, the officer explained why he was there and to speak with the person responsible for renting the residence and how many people under 21 were at the residence. A male subject attempted to tell the officer he could not be there and when instructed to step outside, but subject turned and ran away with the officer pursuing. The male subject began physically fighting with the officer and was attempting to punch the officer in the face when another officer deployed his Taser. In total, nineteen (19) subjects were charged with underage possession, one (1) subject was charged with hindering and resisting arrest, one (1) subject was charged with transfer of beer to a minor and violation of noise ordinance.

Sunday, April 9

Petit Larceny – 500 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a Razor scooter from the front porch. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$60. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, April 11

Hindering/Resisting Arrest – 200 Block Grand Pavilion Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a domestic situation. Further investigation found that the female left the residence due to the intoxicated state of the male subject, who had been yelling at her. When officers located the male subject, they found that he had broken several items in the hotel room and was passed out. The male subject had cuts on his arm hand and foot due to broken glass. The male subject refused treatment from EMS and attempted to leave. The officer told the male subject he was under arrest and he then pushed the officer into the wall until they fell to the ground, where the subject was handcuffed. The subject was charged and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Underage Possession of Alcohol – Beach /1300 Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of underage drinking on the beach. As the officers arrived, the six subjects began walking off in different directions and officers instructed them to stop. The underage subjects, all under the age of seventeen, were found to be in possession of and consuming beer. They were arrested and released to their parents.

### Wednesday, April 12

#### Grand Larceny – 200 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his cement mixer from the construction site. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$3,000. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

### Thursday, April 13

#### Theft from Motor Vehicle – 7600 Block Palmetto Drive

A victim reported that he saw someone breaking into his vehicle and told them to put the items back. The subject dropped the items and left the area. The victim reported that the subject took sunglasses, phone charger and car jack from the vehicle. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$420. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### Friday, April 14

#### Burglary – 300 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered the enclosed garage area of the residence and stole a pump to the jacuzzi. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$1,200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### Monday, April 17

#### Agency Assist Law Enforcement/Suicidal Subject – Ocean Boulevard / JC Long Boulevard

Officers received a call from the Cayce Police Department regarding a possible suicidal subject in possession of a handgun in our jurisdiction. Officers located the subject and talked with her about seeking assistance. The subject agreed to go with EMS and officers located and secured the handgun.

### Saturday, April 22

#### Disorderly Conduct/Resisting Arrest/Assault on Police Officer – Ocean Boulevard / JC Long Boulevard

On officer on foot patrol was stopped by security staff from a local establishment for an intoxicated male and female attempting to get into a vehicle and drive off. The officer located the subjects and were attempting to help them find a safe way home when the female became belligerent and yelling they could do whatever they wanted. When the female subject was advised she was under arrest she began to resist, pulling away from the officer. She then began kicking at the officer, striking him in the stomach and groin. Once placed in the patrol car, she attempted to wrap the seatbelt around her neck, when the officer opened the door, she threw herself out of the vehicle and laid on the ground. Another officer arrived and the male subject began to interfere and was placed under arrest. Both subjects were charged and transported to the AI Cannon Detention Center.

#### Thursday, April 27

##### Petit Larceny – 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole her bag that she left by her chair when she went for a walk down by the water. The items that were stolen were the bag, an iPhone, debit card, car keys and beach towel. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$522. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

##### Fraud – Credit Card/ATM – 5800 Block Palmetto Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) made unauthorized purchases using her debit card number. The approximate amount charged to the debit card was \$342. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

##### False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game – 6800 Block Back Bay Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) contacted her regarding in collecting money. The unknown subject defrauded the victim out of \$250. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

##### Underage Possession of Alcohol – 3600 Block Waterway Boulevard

A neighbor reported several persons trespassing in the backyard of a residence. The officer located three subjects, who were determined to be juveniles under the age of seventeen in possession of a case of beer, red solo cups and ping pong balls. The juveniles were arrested and released to their parents

##### Petit Larceny – 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole her bag while she was at the rinsing station at the County Park. The items that were stolen are the bag, five cell phones, and identification information. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$1,602. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Personnel completed several inspections and collected enough snacks to fill the back seat of a patrol car.

April 17 – Pfc. Louise Hardy organized and hosted a community Meet and Greet for the residents that live between 26<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The event was held at the IOP Public Safety Building and two (2) residents attended.

April 21 – Pfc. James Taylor participated in the Tri-County Special Olympics event at Fort Dorchester High School. He assisted with various events and the awards presentation.

April 21 – Pfc. Louise Hardy conducted a building safety inspection at the Isle of Palms Water and Sewer Commission at the request of the manager.
