The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of October.

Monday, October 1

Simple Possession of Marijuana – Palm Boulevard / IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for a vehicle license plate violation. During contact with the driver the officer detected an odor of marijuana emitting from inside the vehicle. The driver was asked if there was any marijuana in the vehicle and she handed the officer a bag from the center console containing marijuana. The driver was arrested and issued citations with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Wednesday, October 3

Driving Under Suspension – 200 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for a vehicle license plate violation. During contact with the driver the officer determined that the driver's license was suspended, and the vehicle did not have proper insurance. The driver was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Credit Card Fraud – 2300 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that he responded to an online advertisement for a vitamin supplement where he only had to pay the shipping cost of \$4.99. The victim reported that approximately one month later, two charges in the amount of \$98.79 and \$94.99 appeared on his credit card statement without his authorization. When the victim spoke with the company, they explained they did not have a file associated with his information. The approximate amount of money stolen is \$193. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, October 5

Driving Under Suspension – Palm Boulevard / 21st Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Contact with the driver determined that his driver's license was suspended for operating an uninsured vehicle. The driver was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Saturday, October 6

Driving Under Suspension – 7th Avenue / Ocean Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 35MPH in a posted 25MPH speed zone. Contact with the driver determined that his driver's license was suspended. The driver was issued citations with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Theft from Building – 9500 Block Palmetto Drive

A victim contacted the Department after returning home from vacation to report that her purse was missing. She had seen her purse the day before she left the vacation home. The approximate value of the stolen purse is \$300. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, October 8

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 56th Avenue

A victim reported that she received a notification from her credit card company that a charge had been declined. When the victim went to get her purse out of her vehicle, she found that a concrete yard ornament had been thrown through her driver's side window and her purse was missing. There was approximately \$1500 in unauthorized charges on her credit card. The approximate amount of stolen and damaged property is \$2600. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Motor Vehicle Theft – 55th Avenue

A victim reported that sometime during the night, unknown subjects stole his rental vehicle which had been left unlocked with the keys inside. Inside the vehicle were two car seats and a stroller. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$30,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, October 9

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 1200 Oak Harbor Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons entered her unlocked vehicle and stole her purse containing her driver's license, debit cards, sunglasses and other miscellaneous items. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$320. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, October 10

Agency Assist – Beach / 34th Avenue

An officer responded to the beach for a citizen that had found a gun in the sand while looking for seashells. The officer retrieved the handgun and checked the serial number, which came back reported stolen with the Charleston County Sheriff's Office. The gun was logged into evidence and will be released to the Sheriff's Office.

Friday, October 12

Narcotic Violations – 42nd Avenue / Public Beach Access Parking

An officer on patrol observed a vehicle displaying a license plate that belonged to a vehicle of a different make and model. The occupants of the vehicle returned to the officer and indicated that the vehicle did not have insurance. Due to the vehicle not having valid insurance, the officer had the vehicle towed. During a pre-tow inventory the officer located a quantity of white and clear rock like substance that was identified as methamphetamine. The officer also located a handgun inside a bag on the back seat. The male subject admitted that the drugs and handgun belonged to him. He was arrested, charged with trafficking methamphetamine and unlawful carrying of a pistol. He was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Saturday, October 13

Driving Under Suspension – 10th Avenue / Ocean Boulevard

An officer on patrol observed a suspicious vehicle parked in the middle of the street and a male subject loading a bicycle inside. During contact with the subject it was determined that his driver's license was suspended. The driver was issued a citation with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Petit Larceny – Beach / 14th Avenue

A victim reported that he left his belongings on the beach and when he returned he found his book bag to had been taken by unknown persons. The book bag contained clothing, a Kindle, earphones and other miscellaneous items. The approximate value of the items is \$220. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, October 16

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 200 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons entered his unlocked vehicle and stole his wallet containing cash, credit cards and his personal identification. The approximated value of the stolen items is \$150. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Open Container – 600 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer on patrol observed a vehicle stopped partially in the roadway. When the officer pulled up behind the vehicle it pulled into the driveway. While speaking with the driver the officer observed a cold to the touch beer bottle that had been dumped on the ground. The officer located several empty beer bottles that matched the one on the ground. The driver was arrested for no driver's license – 3rd offense and open container of beer in a vehicle. He was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Wednesday, October 17

Traffic Offense – Palm Boulevard / Charleston Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 45MPH in a 35MPH posted speed zone. During contact with the driver it was determined that he did not possess a valid driver's license. The driver was issued citations with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Friday, October 19

Driving Under the Influence – 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer responded to a reported traffic collision in a parking lot. During the investigation the officer determined that the driver was possibly under the influence. The officer requested that the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the end of the testing was placed under arrest. The officer also located a cup containing an alcoholic beverage in the center console cup holder. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center for Datamaster testing where he refused to provide a breath sample and was then lodged.

Saturday, October 20

Driving Under Suspension – Palm Boulevard / IOP Connector

An officer observed a vehicle with an expired vehicle license plate. Contact with the driver determined that his driver's license was suspended for failure to maintain insurance. The driver was issued citations with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Sunday, October 21

Traffic Offense – Palm Boulevard / IOP Connector

An officer observed a vehicle being operated with an unrestrained child standing in the back seat. Contact with the driver determined that the driver did not possess a valid driver's license. The driver admitted to not restraining the child appropriately. The driver was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Tuesday, October 23

Traffic Offense – 36th Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Contact with the driver determined that he did not possess a valid driver's license. The driver was issued citations with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Thursday, October 25

Burglary – 4000 Block Palm Boulevard

The property manager for a rental property reported that on October 9 he had left some tools in the garage of the residence and when he returned found that they had been stolen. The victim was able to provide surveillance video of two individuals entering the garage and stealing the tools. The items stolen were a chainsaw, circular saw, hedge trimmer and nail gun, which are valued at approximately \$1,300. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, October 26

Simple Possession of Marijuana – 25th Avenue / Waterway Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for disregarding a stop sign. While speaking with the driver the officer detected a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. When the officer asked, the driver admitted to having marijuana in the center console. The driver and passenger were placed under arrest and issued citations for simple possession of marijuana and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Saturday, October 27

Driving Under Suspension – 14th Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Contact with the driver determined that his driver's license was suspended for failure to pay reinstatement fees to the state. The driver was issued a citation with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Sunday, October 28

Disorderly Conduct – 3100 Block Cameron Boulevard

An officer on night shift patrol observed a vehicle with its interior lights on and the driver's side door open. He observed the driver's side door close, reopen and then close again. When the officer approached the vehicle, he found a male subject inside who was intoxicated and sleeping. It was determined that the owner of the vehicle did not know the subject. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Driving Under Suspension – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 72MPH in a posted 55MPH speed zone. Contact with the driver determined that his driver's license was suspended for failure to maintain insurance. The driver was issued citations with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

Monday, October 29

Forgery / Counterfeiting – 500 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that she maintains the books for the IOP Exchange Club and that an unknown person had replicated a check and cashed it in the amount of \$2,759.61. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Community Service Activities / Notable Mentions

During the month of October 2018, Officers issued seventy-nine (79) "Property Security Check Notices" and six (6) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices.

October 3 – Detective Louise Hardy hosted a Coffee with a Cop event at the Acme Lowcountry Kitchen. Approximately 8 residents came by to meet our officers and talk about issues and concerns.

October 3 – Detective Louise Hardy and Detective Robert Forsythe attended the Keenager's Luncheon at the IOP Recreation Center. They talked about elder abuse and different resources available to seniors. They provided all attendees with a senior directory of resources available to them.

October 10 – Detective Louise Hardy and PFC Stephanie Tucker went to Sullivan’s Island Elementary School for Lunch Buddies where they ate lunch and discussed all sorts of topics from school safety to Halloween.

October 24 – Detective Louise Hardy and Detective Robert Forsythe assisted with the Sullivan’s Island Elementary School health and wellness group with “Smoothie Day”. They greeted the students and gave out smoothies, helping to educate them on healthy and delicious options for meals and snacks.

October 25 – Detective Louise Hardy participated in the Sullivan’s Island Elementary School “Trunk or Treat” event. She decorated the truck of her patrol vehicle as a crime scene and handed out candy, Childprint ID Kits, stickers and coloring books. There were approximately 300 people in attendance.

October 29 – FTO James Couche met with a Mount Pleasant resident to assist with the inspection and installation of a child safety seat.

October 31 – Officers attended the Halloween Carnival at the IOP Recreation Center. They handed out candy to the children as they entered the Center. Officers patrolled the neighborhoods after the carnival to ensure the safety of all the trick or treaters.
