The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of August.

## **Sunday, August 5**

### **Narcotic Violation** – J C Long Boulevard

An officer investigated a suspicious vehicle parked at a business that had closed for the night. The officer smelled marijuana upon approaching the vehicle and observed a subject in the driver's seat. The officer observed a baggie containing a white powdery substance on the subject's leg, which he put in his pants pocket. The subject was removed from the vehicle and placed under arrest. The officer located marijuana, drug paraphernalia, methamphetamine, diazepam and an open container of liquor inside the vehicle. The subject was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### **Forcible Rape** – J C Long Boulevard / Ocean Boulevard

A victim's parent came to the Public Safety Building to report an incident involving his daughter. CID was assigned this case and will contact the victim to further this investigation.

## **Monday, August 6**

### **Narcotic Violation** – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. While speaking with the occupants of the vehicle, the officer smelled a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. During a search of the vehicle it was determined that there was an open bottle of liquor under the front passenger seat. While searching one of the passengers a quantity of marijuana was located on her person. Additionally, the driver of the vehicle only possessed a beginner's permit. The occupants were issued citations with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

## **Tuesday, August 7**

### **Driving Under Suspension** – Palm Boulevard / 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue

An officer conducted a vehicle license check and received information that the license plate had been suspended for cancellation of insurance. The officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle based on the information. Contact with the driver revealed that the driver's license was suspended and that he

also had an unpaid traffic ticket. The driver was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### **Wednesday, August 8**

#### **Driving Under Suspension – Palm Boulevard / 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue**

An officer stopped a vehicle that displayed an expired vehicle license. Contact with the driver determined that her driver's license was suspended. The driver was arrested, charged with driving under suspension 2<sup>nd</sup> offense and possession of expired vehicle license. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### **Friday, August 10**

#### **Theft from Motor Vehicle – 4700 Block Palm Boulevard**

A victim met with an officer at the IOPPSB to report that unknown person(s) entered his vehicle parked at the Citadel Beach House and stole his debit card, sunglasses and other miscellaneous items. The approximate value of the items stolen from the vehicle is \$136. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Saturday, August 11**

#### **Motor Vehicle Theft – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his 2017 Ford Escape from where he had parked it on Ocean Boulevard with the keys inside. The victim also indicated that there was \$300 in cash in the center console. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$24,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Sunday, August 12**

#### **Domestic Violence – 27<sup>th</sup> Avenue**

Officers responded to a report of a domestic violence, where it was reported that a female subject was outside the home screaming for help and that she was going to get a gun. Officers separated the subjects to begin investigating the incident. It was determined that they were arguing over keys and the male subject became aggressive, causing the female subject to be fearful of him. While the female was on the phone attempting to call for help, the male subject grabbed the phone away from her. Officers determined that the female subject had sustained injuries to her arms and neck. The male subject was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### **Driving Under the Influence – Ocean Boulevard / Pavilion Drive**

An officer observed a vehicle driving on the roadway with a pair of shoes on the roof, then the vehicle failed to yield to oncoming traffic. The officer initiated a tracking of the vehicle's operation, observing that the driver was unable to maintain its lane of travel or consistent speed. The officer stopped the vehicle and contacted the driver, determining that she was possibly under the influence. The officer requested that the driver conduct Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and upon their completion was placed under arrest. During a pre-tow inventory of the vehicle an open bottle of liquor was located, and the driver was under the age of 21. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing where when given the opportunity to provide a breath sample, the driver indicated she could not hold

her breath that long. Subsequently, the driver failed to provide a breath sample and was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### **Monday, August 13**

#### **Theft from Motor Vehicle – 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) went into his unlocked vehicle parked in front of his home and stole his wallet. Another vehicle parked at the residence had been gone through, but nothing was taken. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$100. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### **Motor Vehicle Theft – 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue**

A victim who operates a golf cart rental company from his home reported a golf cart had been stolen. The victim indicated that he had left the golf cart at a rental property for the guests to rent during their stay. When the victim went to retrieve the rented golf cart, it was no longer at the residence. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$2,500. Information was provided, and the golf cart was entered into NCIC. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Wednesday, August 15**

#### **Simple Possession of Marijuana – 42<sup>nd</sup> Avenue / Palm Boulevard**

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Contact with the driver determined that the driver's license was suspended along with the vehicle license plate. While speaking with the driver, he also admitted to the officer that he had marijuana in the center console. The driver was issued citations for driving under suspension, operating an uninsured vehicle, expired registration, possession of suspended vehicle license plates and simple possession of marijuana with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

#### **Grand Larceny – 54<sup>th</sup> Avenue**

A victim reported that while staying at a rental property her jewelry was stolen while they were out for the day. The approximate value of the stolen jewelry is \$3,700. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Thursday, August 16**

#### **Theft from Motor Vehicle – 22<sup>nd</sup> Avenue**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered his unlocked vehicle and stole his handgun that was in the center console. The approximate value of the weapon is \$359. The information for the handgun was entered into NCIC and this case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Sunday, August 19**

#### **Theft from Motor Vehicle – 1100 Block Pavilion Drive**

A victim reported that he had parked his vehicle and went to the beach. Upon returning, the victim found that an unknown person(s) had entered his vehicle and stole an iPad, and iPad mini, and a watch. The victim also reported that he found a wallet inside his vehicle that did not belong to him. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$2,250. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

## **Monday, August 20**

### **Driving Under Suspension** – 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue / Hartnett Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for a vehicle license violence violation. Contact with the driver determined that his driver's license was suspended and that there was no insurance on the vehicle. The driver was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### **Grand Larceny** – 53<sup>rd</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that while working on a landscape project at a residence, he left his equipment in the backyard to continue working the next day. When the victim returned to work, he found that all his tools had been stolen by unknown persons. The approximate value of items stolen is \$2,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

## **Friday, August 24**

### **Theft from Motor Vehicle** – 31<sup>st</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered his unlocked vehicle and stole his handgun from the glovebox. The victim was able to provide the serial number and the handgun was entered into NCIC. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$250. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Simple Possession of Marijuana** – Hwy. 517 / IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for a moving violation. Contact with the driver determined a strong odor of marijuana emitting from within the vehicle. The officer could see what appeared to be marijuana on the floorboard of the vehicle. A search of the vehicle located marijuana and drug paraphernalia. The driver was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

## **Sunday, August 26**

### **Driving Under Suspension** – 25<sup>th</sup> Avenue / Waterway Boulevard

An officer conducted a check of a vehicle license plate and determined that it was suspended for not reporting an accident. Upon stopping the vehicle and contacting the driver, it was determined that the driver's license was suspended. The driver was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### **Burglary** – 2300 Block Waterway Boulevard

A realtor of a residence under construction stopped by to check the home and found several kitchen appliances had been removed. Contact was made with the developer who confirmed that the appliances had been installed. It was determined that a beverage cooler, ice maker, washer and dryer had been stolen. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$3,350. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Simple Possession of Marijuana** – Hwy. 517 / Hwy. 703

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Contact with the driver determined that there was a strong odor of marijuana emitting from inside the vehicle. When asked, the passenger in the vehicle handed the officer the marijuana. The passenger was issued a citation with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

## **Monday, August 27**

### **Grand Larceny – 900 Block Ocean Boulevard**

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered her residence that was under construction and stole her new washing machine and dryer. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$3,818. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Warrant Arrest – 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue / Palm Boulevard**

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 46MPH in a posted 35MPH speed zone. Contact with the driver determined that she had an active warrant with Charleston County Sheriff's Office for fraud. Once the warrant was confirmed, the driver was placed under arrest and transferred over to the custody of the Charleston County Sheriff's Office.

## **Tuesday, August 28**

### **Motor Vehicle Theft – 42<sup>nd</sup> Avenue**

A victim reported that his vehicle had been stolen from the driveway at this residence. It was determined that the vehicle was unlocked, and the keys had been left inside. The vehicle information was entered into NCIC. The approximate value of the stolen vehicle is \$6,000. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Theft from Motor Vehicle – 3500 Block Hartnett Boulevard**

A victim reported that when he went out to check his vehicle this morning he noticed that his handgun that he keeps in the center console had been stolen. The victim believes that he left his vehicle unlocked. Information for the handgun was entered into NCIC. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$250. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

## **Wednesday, August 29**

### **Simple Possession of Marijuana – Hwy. 517 / IOP Connector**

An officer stopped a vehicle for a moving violation. Contact with the driver and passenger determined that there was an odor of marijuana emitting from inside the vehicle. A probable cause search of the vehicle located a baggie containing marijuana in the center console. When the officer walked around the vehicle to the passenger side a clear plastic baggie containing marijuana was found on the ground next to the car. Both subjects were issued citations for simple possession of marijuana with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

### **Breach of Trust – Marsh Point Lane**

A victim reported that he had hired a contractor to build and install cabinetry in multiple rooms at his residence, giving the contractor a deposit up front. The victim was granted a judgment against the contractor in civil court but wishes to pursue criminal charges. The amount of monies taken from the victim is \$10,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Thursday, August 30**

#### **Petit Larceny – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard**

A victim reported that she had left her iPad in the hotel room where she was staying and unknown person(s) stole it from her. The approximate value of the stolen item \$900. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### **Friday, August 31**

#### **Warrant Arrest – Palm Boulevard / 45<sup>th</sup> Avenue**

An officer responded to a report of a collision. During the investigation it was determined that one of the subjects involved had an active arrest warrant with North Charleston Police Department. The subject was transferred to the custody of North Charleston Police Department.

#### **Community Service Activities / Notable Mentions**

During the month of August 2018, Officers issued thirty-three (33) "Property Security Check Notices" and six (6) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices.

August 7 – The IOP Police Department hosted the National Night Out event that was coordinated by Detective Louise Hardy and PFC Thomas Molino. The event was attend by many of the Police Department employees. The event was supported by the IOP Recreation Department and IOP Fire Department employees. The Charleston County Sheriff's Office Air Support Unit provided a helicopter and Charleston County Consolidated 9-1-1 Center also assisted in making this a successful event. It was estimated that approximately 150 citizens attended the event.

August 30 – Detective Forsythe along with the Coastal Crisis Chaplaincy, Chaplin Rich Robinson went to Porter Gaud School to hand out Kid's Comfort Kits. There were approximately 40 citizens and multiple police agencies involved in this event.
