The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of July.

## Monday, July 2

### Narcotics Violation – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 100MPH in a posted 55MPH speed zone. The officer immediately had the driver exit the vehicle, placing him in handcuffs, when a bulge was noticed in the driver's pants. A search of the driver located a semi-automatic handgun in his waistband. A search of the vehicle located an open container of beer that the driver had been holding and a bag of cocaine was in the center console. The driver was charged with speeding, minor in possession of beer, open container, unlawful carrying of firearm and possession of cocaine. It was also determined that the driver was on supervised probation status. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

## Wednesday, July 4

### False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game – 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that she contacted a subject who had listed a home for rent on IOP via Craigslist. The victim paid the subject \$1,750 for the rental. Upon arriving at the address, the victim found that the home was already rented. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### Simple Assault – Yacht Harbor Court

An officer responded to a report of an assault in progress. While attempting to locate the subjects, the officer began talking to a group of people when one subject came up and pointed at a female subject, stating she hit me. The officer located the female subject and attempted to get her away from the group and sit down to continue the investigation. The female subject became hostile and as the officer attempted to detain her, the subject elbowed and then began punching the officer in the face. As the officer attempted to take the subject to the ground, the subject's mother interfered, causing the officer to fall. The subject then began kicking the officer in the head and arm. A second officer arrived on scene and was able to get the subject in handcuffs after using the Taser to gain control. The subject was arrested and charged with disorderly conduct and assault on police officer and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

**Disorderly Conduct – Morgan Cove Drive / Yacht Harbor Court**

While officers were investigating the incident where the officer was assaulted, a male and female subject, who were intoxicated, came up into the area where an officer was interviewing a subject. The officer instructed the subject to step away from the scene, but he replied “yeah, that’s not happening”. The subject was advised a second time to step away, but continued to refuse. The male subject was placed under arrest. While the officer was dealing with the male subject, the intoxicated female attempted to put her arms around the officer to keep him from arresting the male, she was placed under arrest. Both subjects were charged with disorderly conduct, hindering and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

**Thursday, July 5**

**Domestic Violence – 25<sup>th</sup> Avenue**

Officers met with the male and female subjects involved in the domestic situation. It was determined that the male subject struck the female in the eye causing a large swollen bump over her eye while they were arguing. It was also determined that the male subject broke a door while forcing entry into a room where the female was seeking refuge. The male subject was placed arrest for domestic violence and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

**Saturday, July 7**

**Narcotics Violations – Palm Boulevard / 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue**

An officer on patrol observed a vehicle traveling in front of the patrol vehicle with an odor of marijuana emitting from it. The officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. Contact with the driver determined that he had been smoking marijuana in the vehicle just before being stopped. A search of the vehicle located a baggie of marijuana in the center console and a search of a duffle bag on the rear passenger seat revealed another baggie with marijuana, individually wrapped baggies of cocaine, and a digital scale. The driver was arrested and charged with possession with intent to distribute cocaine – 3<sup>rd</sup> offense, possession with intent to distribute marijuana – 3<sup>rd</sup> offense and driving under suspension – 3<sup>rd</sup> offense. The subject was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

**Sunday, July 8**

**Credit Card Fraud – 9000 Block Palmetto Drive**

An officer responded to a report of fraudulent use of credit card for a subject paying for a rental property. The victim reported that an unauthorized charge of \$1,420 was made to her credit card. The officer knocked on the door of the rental property and made contact with the suspect. The suspect was determined to have multiple unpaid traffic citations and was placed under arrest. He was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center where a hold was placed on him until warrants for the credit card fraud could be served. This case is continuing and has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

**Tuesday, July 10**

**Domestic Violence – Chapman Avenue**

A victim reported that on the previous night her husband choked her until she could not breathe. She indicated that they had been out for dinner and her husband became intoxicated so they went home. The next morning the victim went to the hospital for treatment and we were notified by the hospital of

the incident. A warrant was obtained and the husband was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center. Investigation of this case continues and it has been assigned to CID.

### Wednesday, July 11

#### Credit Card Fraud – 200 Block Grand Pavilion Boulevard

During an investigation of a similar incident that took place on July 8, an Investigator determined that the same suspect had used another victim's credit card to pay for a rental property. The amount charged was \$2,054.46. CID obtained warrants for the subject and arrested him July 12 for financial card theft and financial transaction card fraud. The subject was lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### Saturday, July 14

#### Simple Possession of Marijuana – 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue / Ocean Boulevard

An officer observed a moped driving recklessly on Ocean Boulevard and attempted to stop the driver and occupant. The driver attempted to evade the officer by going behind the shops at Ocean Park Plaza and then down the beach access path at 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Officers were able to apprehend the subjects on the beach and during a search incident to arrest located marijuana in one of the subject's socks. It was determined that both subjects were under the age of 17, making them juveniles. The subjects were charged with unlawful possession of tobacco, hindering, simple possession of marijuana, reckless driving, and resisting arrest. Due to them being juveniles, they were released to their parents.

#### Narcotics Violation – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 68MPH in a posted 55MPH speed zone. Contact with the driver determined that his driver's license was currently suspended. Further investigation found the driver to be in unlawful possession of oxycodone hydrochloride tablets and was placed under arrest. The driver was charged with driving under suspension 3<sup>rd</sup> offense, failure to pay traffic tickets – 3 counts, and possession of controlled substance, and was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### Sunday, July 15

#### Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

Officers got out with a vehicle that had stopped at the merge lane onto the IOP Connector and was causing a traffic hazard. The investigation revealed that there was an odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from the vehicle and driver. The officer requested that the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the end of testing, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where she refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game – 100 Block Grand Pavilion Boulevard

A victim reported that he had rented a vacation rental from Craigslist and paid a deposit of \$1,340.04 through PayPal. When the victim went to check in, he realized that he had been scammed. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Vandalism – 43<sup>rd</sup> Avenue

An officer placed an immobilization boot on a vehicle due to outstanding parking citations. When the officer returned to remove the boot, he found where the violator had attempted to drive with the boot

attached to his vehicle. The immobilization boot was damaged and no longer able to be used. The violator was issued a citation for damage to real property with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

#### Driving Under the Influence – Breach Inlet

An officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Contact with the driver determined that there was an odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from within the vehicle and the driver. When asked, the driver admitted to drinking vodka and soda earlier. The officer requested the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the end of the testing, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing and provided a breath sample registering a .14% BAC.

#### Monday, July 16

##### Domestic Violence – 34<sup>th</sup> Avenue Beach Access

Officers responded to a report of a domestic violence in progress on the beach. On arrival, they met with the female half of the incident and determined that she and the male subject had been arguing and he took her cell phone and ripped the keys from her hand causing cuts to her hand and fingers. Based on information obtained and that the male subject had taken the female subject's cell phone, which prevented her from calling for help, the male subject was arrested for domestic violence 2<sup>nd</sup> degree and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

##### Driving Under the Influence – 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue / Waterway Boulevard

An officer responded to a report of a possibly intoxicated driver. The officer located the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. Contact with the driver determined that she was possibly under the influence. When asked if she had been drinking, the driver stated she had one glass of wine. The officer requested the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Testing and at the end of the testing, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing and provided a breath sample registering a .17% BAC.

#### Wednesday, July 18

##### Noise Ordinance Violation / Hindering -3300 Block Cameron Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a noise complaint with people being loud and music playing. Contact was made with the subject responsible for renting the residence and explained that at 1am they were causing a disturbance and issued him a citation for noise violation in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court. While speaking with the renter, another subject staying at the rental property began yelling that he would not go inside and it was determined he was intoxicated. The subject continued to refuse to follow officer instructions and continued yelling. The subject was arrested for hindering and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### Thursday, July 19

##### Credit Card Fraud – Fairway Oaks Lane

A victim reported that she noticed unauthorized charges made to her credit card. It was determined that approximately \$13,432.41 had been fraudulently charged. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### Sunday, July 22

#### Disorderly Conduct – 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer on night shift responded to a report of a subject sleeping on a bench in front of a local business. The subject was determined to be grossly intoxicated and difficult to understand. The subject was unable to provide any information and unable to care for himself. The subject was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

### Friday, July 27

#### Domestic Violence – 7000 Block Palmetto Drive

Officers responded to a report of a woman screaming for help. When officers arrived, they separated the male and female subjects. The female explained that they had been drinking today and then began to argue and her husband pushed her down the stairs and the officer observed signs of injury, but the female refused medical treatment. The male subject indicated that his wife had kicked, hit and bitten him, but he was trying to avoid a confrontation with her. An officer also spoke with the juvenile who was present but did not see any physical fighting only heard them arguing, which she said happens often. Due to both parties being intoxicated and mutual combatants, they were both arrested for domestic violence 3<sup>rd</sup> degree and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center. The juvenile was able to stay with a relative that lived nearby.

### Saturday, July 28

#### Stolen Property Offenses – IOP Connector

An officer observed a vehicle with an equipment violation and when he turned around to stop the vehicle, it turned down 20<sup>th</sup> Avenue where the driver jumped out with the vehicle still moving and took off running. The driver's description was put out over the radio and the officer chased after the driver but lost him when he jumped a six-foot privacy fence. During the investigation, when an officer contacted the vehicle's owner, it was learned that it had been stolen and the victim was contacting the Charleston County Sheriff's Office to file a report. Another officer patrolling the area observed a subject matching the description of the driver at the Circle K. When the officer contacted the subject, he provided his name and date of birth and then took off running again towards Oak Harbor Boulevard. The subject jumped a fence and then disappeared into the trees along Hamlin Creek. Attempts to get a mutual-aid response for a K-9 unit were unsuccessful. Officers were able to positively identify the subject from this South Carolina driver's license photograph and secured warrants for violation of non-residence violators compact (NRVC) – 2 counts, failure to stop for blue lights, leaving scene of accident with property damage, possession of a stolen motor vehicle, and driving under suspension – 3<sup>rd</sup> offense.

#### Theft from Motor Vehicle – 22<sup>nd</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that an unknown person(s) entered his locked vehicle and stole his handgun. The victim noticed that when he opened his vehicle that papers and miscellaneous items from his glove box and center console were out of order and thrown around. The victim was able to provide a serial number for the handgun and it was entered into NCIC. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$375. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Domestic Violence – 4000 Block Hartnett Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a physical disturbance. The caller was indicating that an intoxicated male subject was trying to attack her and her son. When officers arrived, they saw a male subject

standing in the street and detained him until they could determine his relationship to the event. Officers then made contact with the female caller who indicated that the male subject that had been detained was her husband and he was the one attacking them. It was determined that the male subject had shoved his wife into the glass door, had thrown the son down to the floor, and continued to be aggressive toward them. The wife also indicated that her husband possessed a rifle that was in the upstairs bedroom. A criminal history check found that the husband was denied from being able to possess a firearm. The male subject was arrested, charged with domestic violence – 2<sup>nd</sup> degree, unlawful possession of a firearm and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### **Community Service Activities / Notable Mentions**

During the month of July 2018, Officers issued one hundred twenty (120) "Property Security Check Notices" and seventeen (17) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices.

July 2 – Detective Louise Hardy assisted with the summer camp at the IOP Recreation Center for Hero Week. She discussed summer safety and handed out safety-themed coloring books.

July 5 – Detective Louise Hardy and Pfc. Thomas Molino organized the IOP Beach Clean Up, coordinating with Charleston County Parks and Recreation and Palmetto Pride to clean the beach after the July 4<sup>th</sup> Fireworks Event. Approximately 30 volunteers helped to clean up the area, collecting over fifteen large bags of trash. Public Works was also on hand to empty the cans and pick up large debris from the area.

July 7 – FTO Dylan Reynolds met with resident from Mount Pleasant to assist with the inspection, installation and education of a child safety seat.

July 10 – FTO James Couche met with a resident from Gastonia, South Carolina to assist with the inspection, installation and education of a child safety seat.

July 17 – FTO James Taylor met with an island resident to assist with the inspection, installation and education of a child safety seat.

July 24 – Detective Louise Hardy and PFC Thomas Molino went to the beach area in the Front Beach business district for a Pops with Cops community relations event where they gave out freeze pops to children on the beach. They spoke with over one hundred visitors and residents and handed out 75 freeze pops.

July 25 – FTO Dylan Reynolds met with a resident from Mount Pleasant to assist with the inspection, installation and education of a child safety seat.
