The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of May.

#### Friday, May 4

#### Vandalism - Seagrass Lane

A victim reported that unknown persons had broken her flood lights and left them laying in her yard and damaged her irrigation system by pulling up all the sprinkler heads out of the ground. The amount of damage is approximately \$7,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Saturday, May 5

#### Public Intoxication - Ocean Boulevard / J C Long Boulevard

An officer on night shift patrolling the Front Beach area observed a subject sleeping in his vehicle. Upon attempting to wake up the subject, the officer determined that he was very intoxicated. The officer attempted to get him a ride home, but the subject was uncooperative and became belligerent. The subject was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### Narcotics Violation - Beach behind Windjammer

An officer on night shift patrolling the beach area observed a female subject acting extremely bizarre. She was lying on the beach pretending to swim, would then just lay still and then jump up and run around in a circle, collapsing onto the sand again. A check of the subject determined that she was under the influence of a hallucinogenic. Officers found in her purse a container with sweet tarts that had been laced with a narcotic, which field tested positive for lysergic acid diethylamide (LSD). The subject was placed into handcuffs and then took off running from the officer, who quickly apprehended her. She was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detection Center.

#### Wednesday, May 9

#### Petit Larceny - 2000 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons stole her bicycle from the carport area under the residence. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$149. This case has been assigned to CID for further

investigation. On May 10, a patrol officer located the subject responsible for stealing the bicycle and he was placed under arrest for this theft and other crimes.

#### Petit Larceny – 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

A local restaurant reported that five males ordered dinner and then left without paying their bill, which totaled \$99.80. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation. CID located the subjects involved on May 15 at which time they admitted they left and paid the bill.

#### Motor Vehicle Theft – Beach Access / 25th Avenue

A victim reported that a low speed vehicle (LSV) that had been rented to a family on vacation was stolen when they went to the beach and legally parked the vehicle. The approximate value of the stolen vehicle is \$6,000. The stolen vehicle was entered into NCIC. The case was assigned to CID for further investigation. On May 10, an officer on patrol observed a LSV matching the description of the stolen being driven on Waterway Boulevard and conducted a traffic stop. The LSV was confirmed to be stolen and the two subjects operating the LSV were placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### Driving Under Suspension - Palm Boulevard / Charleston Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Contact with the driver determined that his driver's license was suspended for failure to appear for a traffic ticket. The driver was also determined to have an active suspension for habitual offender, was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### Thursday, May 10

#### Credit Card Fraud - Yacht Harbor Court

A victim reported that his credit card had unauthorized charges in the total of \$31,920. The victim was advised to cancel all credit cards that were charged without authorization. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Stolen Property Offenses - Palm Boulevard / 21st Avenue

An officer observed a vehicle pass and that had a pair of tennis shoes on the roof. The officer attempted to stop the vehicle to advise the occupants. The vehicle did not pull over, but continued driving, turning into the Island Center, continuing behind the stores and then all four occupants exited the vehicle and took off running, leaving the car running and in drive. Officers were able to apprehend all four of the subjects, who were placed under arrest. The subjects were charged with possession of crack cocaine, possession of stolen property, simple possession of marijuana, hindering police officer and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### Burglary – 2400 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a stolen low speed vehicle (LSV) and during the investigation, it was determined that the two subjects had broken into a rental property, where they had stayed for a couple of nights. The subjects were charged with burglary and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### Petit Larceny – 1300 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer on patrol observed an unfamiliar truck parked at the City's fuel pumps located inside the gates of Public Works. Further investigation determined that a male subject was attempting to steal gas and when the officer pulled into the gated area he hid underneath one of the garbage trucks. The

subject was located and it was determined that he was intoxicated and had placed lawn equipment belonging to Public Works into the back of his truck with the intent to steal it. The subject was arrested, charged with public disorderly conduct, trespassing, hindering, and petit larceny. The subject was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### Friday, May 11

#### Disorderly Conduct - J C Long Boulevard

Officers responded to a complaint of an intoxicated subject who would not leave a local establishment. The male subject was located and determined to be unable to provide officers with information on where he was staying and could not provide the name of any one that could pick him up. The subject was placed under arrest, charged with public disorderly conduct and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### Saturday, May 12

#### False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game - 1300 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that she had rented a property from a subject on Craigslist and completed a bank transfer of \$2,500 with instructions to meet the subject at the location to get the keys and a receipt. Upon her arrival, there was no one there to meet with her and she learned that the property was managed by Island Realty, who does not rent through Craigslist. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Monday, May 14

#### Petit Larceny – 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue / Beach

A victim reported that while he was at the beach he left his cell phone and other belongings while swimming. Upon returning, he noticed his phone was missing. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$1,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Grand Larceny - 200 Block Grand Pavilion Boulevard

A victim reported the theft of her diamond ring from the rental property where she had stayed. The approximate value of the stolen jewelry is \$10,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Tuesday, May 15

#### Domestic Violence – 700 Block Carolina Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a domestic situation and determined that one of the subjects involved had left the residence. The female half of the domestic told officers she had a disagreement with her boyfriend and then became uncooperative with the officers. Another officer located the male half of the domestic who stated that the female had hit him several times with an open hand and showed visible injuries to the officer. It was determined that the female subject was the primary aggressor, was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### Thursday, May 17

#### False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game - 22<sup>nd</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that they paid a deposit of \$400 to rent a residence they found on Craigslist. When the victim arrived at the residence, the phone number no longer worked and she realized that she had been scammed. The total amount the victim paid to rent the residence was \$1,060. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Saturday, May 19

#### Disorderly Conduct - 1100 Ocean Boulevard

On officer on night shift patrol observed a male subject passed out laying on the sidewalk. When the officer woke up the subject to check his status, he was observed to be grossly intoxicated and began vomiting profusely. The officer was able to locate a friend of the subject, who was able to get him home. The subject was issued a citation for disorderly conduct with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

#### Sunday, May 20

#### Vandalism – 5700 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons got out of a vehicle and forcibly pushed up the entrance gate into Wild Dunes causing damage to the gate. The officer reviewed the video and was able to obtain license plate information on the vehicle. The approximate cost of damage to the gate is \$500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Monday, May 21

#### Extortion/Blackmail - 44th Avenue

A victim reported that she received a letter postmarked from Birmingham, AL with no return address. The letter indicated that if the victim did not pay \$8,100 in bitcoin that a secret would be revealed to his wife and family. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Thursday, May 24

#### <u>False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game</u> – Chapman Avenue

A victim reported that she was contacted by a subject claiming to work for Homeland Security. The subject explained that the victim had a package at the airport containing 9 million dollars and that he would assist her with the paperwork to claim the package. The subject tried to get the victim to send money, but she would not. The subject then sent her a check for \$10,000, which she cashed at her bank and then wired the money back to the subject. She was notified by her bank that the check was fraudulent. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Friday, May 25

#### False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game - 2700 Block Cameron Boulevard

A victim reported that he rented a vacation rental from Craigslist and wired a deposit of \$1,200 as instructed. The victim received no further contact from the subject to whom he wired the money and

when he checked the address learned that it had been sold. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Saturday, May 26

#### Simple Possession Marijuana - 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer got out with a suspicious subject at the shopping center. While speaking with the subject the officer observed a cigar packet sticking out of his pocket and asked him if he had any marijuana, to which the subject admitted to possessing. The subject was issued a citation with a court date in the Isle of Palms Municipal Court.

#### Monday, May 28

#### <u>Disorderly Conduct</u> – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of an intoxicated male subject who was starting physical confrontations with other patrons. The subject refused to follow the officer's instructions to leave with his girlfriend and became confrontational with the officer. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

#### Theft from Building - 100 Block Grand Pavilion Boulevard

A victim reported that while staying at a rental property, he left his watch on the bedside table when he left the residence for the day. When he returned, he noticed that the watch was missing and that a maintenance employee had replaced the shower curtain while he was out. The approximate value of the stolen property is \$3,650. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Community Service Activities / Notable Mentions

During the month of May 2018, Officers issued ninety-nine (99) "Property Security Check Notices" and twenty-eight (28) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices.

May 2 – FTO Dylan Reynolds assisted a citizen from Mount Pleasant, SC with the installation, inspection and education of a child safety seat.

May 5 – The Department received an anonymous tip from Crime Stoppers for the 2005 Key West boat that was stolen from 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Detective Sergeant Sharon Baldrick met with Charleston County Sheriff's Office, obtained a search warrant and confirmed the boat belonged to our victim. The boat was returned to the victim and warrants are being obtained for the suspect.

May 16 – Detective Louise Hardy and Detective Robert Forsythe participated in "Lunch Buddies" with the 5<sup>th</sup> grade children at Sullivan's Island Elementary School.
