The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of June.

Saturday, June 3

Simple Assault – Ocean Boulevard / Pavilion Drive

Officers responded to a report of an altercation between two subjects. Investigation revealed that the victim was waiting for a parking space when another vehicle pulled around her and took the space. The subjects exchanged a verbal barrage of insults with one of them claiming the other put his finger in her face, touching her nose. Both subjects were extremely aggressive towards each other, but neither wished to pursue charges for assault and battery.

Sunday, June 4

Petit Larceny- Beach behind Coconut Joe's

A victim reported that she left her bag on the beach, walked down to the water and upon returning found that items had been stolen by unknown person(s). The items stolen were a debit card, driver's license, and keys to her vehicle. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$250. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, June 5

Simple Possession Marijuana – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer on patrol observed a vehicle parked in a neighborhood with two subjects sitting inside appearing to be "hotboxing" (smoking marijuana and letting the car fill with smoke). When the officer pulled up behind the car, the passenger got out and fled on foot with the officer giving chase. The car left the area, but was later located driving on Palm Boulevard. Upon contacting the driver, the officer could smell marijuana, which was found inside the car. The driver was placed under arrest.

Traffic Stop / Simple Possession Marijuana - 3200 Block Waterway Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for traveling 36MPH in a posted 25MPH speed zone. While speaking with the driver, the officer observed a second driver's license in the subject's wallet. The driver admitted that it was his fake ID, which he used to purchase beer and liquor. Additionally, the officer observed in plain sight several beer cans and a search of the vehicle revealed marijuana, drug paraphernalia and a bottle of liquor. The driver was placed under arrest.

Friday, June 9

Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Contact with the driver determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver said that he had drank a few beers. The officer requested that the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and upon completion was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing where he provided a breath sample with a BAC of .15%. The driver was lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Saturday, June 10

Disorderly Conduct – Beach behind Windjammer

An officer was on the beach investigating a fireworks and alcohol incident when a male subject walked up and stood behind the officer. The subject was asked if he was involved with the group and indicated he was not. The officer instructed the subject to continue on his way several times, but the male continued to stand behind the officer, interfering with the investigation. The subject was placed under arrest.

Impersonation of a Police Officer – 2nd Avenue / Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that a subject driving a SUV made a sharp turn, almost striking his car, so he honked his horn and continued on his way. The driver of the SUV turned around and activated emergency lights and siren, which caused the victim to pull over. The driver of the SUV got out and began walking up to the victim's vehicle. The victim realized he was not an actual police officer and drove away. Officers were able to locate the subject, placing him under arrest.

Monday, June 12

Traffic Stop / Simple Possession of Marijuana – 2900 Block Waterway Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 38MPH in a posted 25MPH speed zone. Contact with the driver revealed that he was under the age of 21 and in possession of beer. Further investigation revealed that the driver was also in possession of a fake ID, marijuana and drug paraphernalia. The driver was placed under arrest.

Tuesday, June 13

Narcotics Violation – Simple Possession of Marijuana – 28th Avenue

An officer on patrol investigated a report of suspicious persons at the Recreation Department. The officer's investigation found two subjects sitting in a vehicle with a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. The occupants admitted to having marijuana in the center console. The owner of the vehicle was placed under arrest.

Wednesday, June 14

Simple Assault – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a local establishment for a patron who became disorderly and was fighting security personnel. Officers found security personnel holding down a subject who was being combative on the sidewalk. It was determined that the establishment refused to provide the subject with more

alcohol and he became disorderly. The subject was placed under arrest for assault and battery 3rd degree, hindering, and disorderly conduct.

Saturday, June 17

Motor Vehicle Theft – Beach Club Villas

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his vehicle, which he may have left unlocked. The vehicle is a dark gray Acura RDX valued at approximately \$14,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts / Accessories – Frank Sottile Lane

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole the residential parking permit decal from the rear of her vehicle. The decal was deactivated in the system and a new permit decal was issued to the victim. The approximate value of the stolen decal is \$15. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – Morgans Cove Drive

A victim reported that he left his wallet on the center console with the windows down while he was inside a residence and unknown person(s) entered his vehicle and stole his wallet containing cash, debit cards, and identification card. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$130. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, June 20

Burglary – Ocean Point

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered their residence and stole two televisions. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$1,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, June 22

Burglary – 3600 Block Palm Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a suspicious subject who was walking around under a residence and was seen taking items. An officer located a subject matching the description given and attempted to make contact. The subject fled and the officer pursued on foot. Officers were able to locate the subject and placed him under arrest.

Traffic Stop / Simple Possession of Marijuana – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that when the driver opened the center console, the officer saw a zip lock bag containing marijuana. The driver was placed under arrest.

Burglary – 41st Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered the garage of his home and stole a bicycle. The approximate value of the item stolen is \$200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, June 23

Burglary – Tabby Lane

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered the garage of this home and stole a surfboard and a paddle board. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$1,200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Simple Possession of Marijuana – J C Long Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a subject using narcotics inside a parked vehicle. Officers located the subject and observed drug paraphernalia and a zip lock bag containing marijuana sitting on the front seat in plain view. The subject was placed under arrest.

Petit Larceny – 21st Avenue Beach Access

A victim reported that while she was on the beach an unknown person(s) took her beach bag and removed cash, leaving the other items in the bag and returned it. The amount of cash taken was \$45. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Underage Possession of Alcohol – Beach at Grand Pavilion

An officer located six underage teenagers on the beach in possession of alcohol. All subjects, who were determined to be juveniles (under the age of 17) were charged with the family court offenses and released to their parents.

Saturday, June 24

Possession of Heroin & Marijuana – 7600 Block Palmetto Drive

An officer responded to a possible drug overdose. While IOP Fire Department and Charleston County EMS were speaking with the subject trying to determine what had caused her to lose consciousness, the officer observed drug paraphernalia sticking out of her bag. When the officer picked up the bag, the subject lunged at the officer to get her bag. In addition to the drug paraphernalia, the officer located heroin and marijuana inside the bag. After being cleared by EMS, the subject was placed under arrest and transported to the AI Cannon Detention Center.

Sunday, June 25

Warrant Arrest – 41st Avenue / Hartnett Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 35MPH in a posted 25MPH speed zone. Further investigation found that the driver had active arrest warrants with North Charleston Police Department and Berkeley County Sheriff's Office. The driver was arrested and transferred to North Charleston Police Department for service of the warrants.

Simple Possession of Marijuana – IOP Municipal Parking Lot B

An officer on night shift checked on a vehicle parked in the far side of the parking lot and found two female subjects with the inside of the vehicle full of smoke. The officer made contact with the subjects and determined they were smoking marijuana and were "hotboxing". The passenger admitted that the marijuana belonged to her and she was placed under arrest.

Tuesday, June 27

Simple Assault – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

Officers on foot patrol observed a male subject running towards them with two Security Staff personnel from a local establishment. Officers detained the subject and determined that he had punched a male subject in the face while inside the establishment. When Security Staff attempted to take the subject outside, he punched one of them in the face and then took off running. The subject was placed under arrest for two counts of assault and battery.

Wednesday, June 28

Simple Assault – 600 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that while staying at a rental property, she attempted to wake up her boyfriend, who fell asleep on the couch. The male subject became angry, knocking her to the ground and then dragged her across the floor by her wrists. Initially the female subject refused to cooperate, but the next day she provided a written statement and a warrant was obtained for the male subject.

Simple Assault- 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a physical disturbance at a local restaurant and determined that a male subject walked into the kitchen area and began having words with the victim and then pushed him. The victim was able to place the subject in a headlock until other employees could assist. The subject left the area before officers arrived. The victim determined that he did wish to pursue charges. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Traffic Stop / Simple Possession of Marijuana – Palm Boulevard / 23rd Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. When the officer made contact with the driver, an odor of marijuana was coming from inside the vehicle. The driver handed the officer a zip lock bag of marijuana when asked and admitted to having beer in the back seat. The driver was determined to be a juvenile (under the age of 17), was placed under arrest with family court charges and released to his parents.

Thursday, June 29

Motor Vehicle Theft – 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his car, a black Infiniti from a parking space along Ocean Boulevard. The victim had locked the vehicle after getting some items. The approximate value of the stolen vehicle is \$15,000. In addition, located inside the stolen vehicle were golf clubs and electronics that are valued at approximately \$2,800. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / J C Long Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that she was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver admitted to drinking earlier and that she had drank too much. The officer requested the driver complete the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and upon completion was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center for Datamaster Testing, where she refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Detention Center.

Friday, June 30

Traffic Stop / Simple Possession of Marijuana – Pavilion Drive / J C Long Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. During contact with the driver, the officer could smell marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. The driver denied having marijuana, but when the officer explained that there was probable cause to search his vehicle, he handed the officer the marijuana. Additionally, the officer located an open container of beer. The driver and passenger were both placed under arrest.

Traffic Stop / Simple Possession of Marijuana – 1400 Block Ocean Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. During contact with the driver, the officer could smell marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. The officer observed in plain view on the back floor board a zip lock bag containing marijuana. The driver was placed under arrest.

Personnel Recognition

Command Staff recognizes the following personnel:

Sergeant Jamey Meekins for his dedication and professionalism while assisting a citizen who had gotten her vehicle stuck on a curb. She explained that his actions helped to make what could have been a bad ending to a fun week, but because of the kindness he showed, it turned out to be a positive experience.

Officer Robert Forsythe for his dedication and professionalism while assisting a citizen in pushing her car out of the roadway in the rain after she had broken down. She was very thankful for his assistance.

Community Service Activities

During the month of June 2017, Officers issued fifty (50) "Property Security Check Notices" and ten (10) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices.

June 15 – Officer Louise Hardy participated in the Charleston Southern University Law Enforcement Summer Camp. She assisted in setting up the physical agility test course and monitored the twenty-four camp attendees that challenged the course.
