The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of October.

Sunday, October 1

Telephone Calls/Obscene/Harassing - 3400 Block Hartnett Boulevard

A victim reported that she was receiving disturbing text messages that were vulgar in nature from an unknown subject. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

<u>Disorderly Conduct</u> – Waterway Boulevard / Seahorse Court

Officers were dispatched to a report of an unconscious male subject laying on the ground. IOP Fire and EMS also responded and after examination, they cleared him and did not transport. Officers attempted to determine where the male subject was staying. The male subject was unable to provide any clear information due to his intoxicated state. He was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Tuesday, October 3

Driving Under Suspension - 21st Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 37MPH in a posted 25MPH speed zone. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that his driver's license was suspended for failure to pay a traffic ticket and the vehicle's license plate was expired since June 2017. The subject was arrested and issued a court date.

Theft from Buildings - 4000 Block of Palm Boulevard

The property manager for a rental property reported that a television had been stolen the day after the owner had left the residence. The approximate value of the stolen item is approximately \$399. Information for the cleaning crew was provided as they were scheduled to clean the residence. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u> – Palmetto Drive / Abalone Alley

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 40MPH in a posted 25MPH speed zone. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that his driver's license was suspended for unpaid property tax and failure to pay a traffic ticket. Additionally, the vehicle's license plate was suspended for unpaid property taxes. The subject was arrested and released with a court date.

Wednesday, October 4

Traffic Offense - 57th Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for disregarding a stop sign. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that the driver did not possess a valid driver's license. The driver was issued a citation and released with a court date.

Monday, October 9

Simple Assault - Sandcrab Court

An officer received a phone call from the Medical University of South Carolina about a possible assault on a child. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, October 11

Petit Larceny - 2700 Block of Hartnett Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown subjects stole two sago palms from her yard. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$50. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, October 12

Motor Vehicle Theft - Marsh Island Lane

A victim reported that unknown persons stole her golf cart from her residence. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$3,000. The owner was able to provide a Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) and it was entered into NCIC. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Driving Under Suspension - Palm Boulevard / 14th Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that her driver's license was suspended for failure to pay property taxes. The driver was arrested and released with a court date.

Friday, October 13

False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game - 57th Avenue

A victim reported that she received a phone call from unknown person claiming that her grandson had been arrested and needed \$9,000 to be bailed out of jail. The unknown person told the victim they would send a taxi to pick her up so she could go to a local store and get a money order. An officer arrived before the taxi could respond and obtained several phone numbers. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Petit Larceny - 500 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons had stolen a campaign sign from her yard. She stated that a silver sedan stopped in front of her home and a male subject got out and removed the handmade sign from her yard. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$5.00. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, October 14

Burglary - 30th Avenue

Officers responded to a reported burglary in progress. Upon arrival, officers met with the owner of the rental property, who indicated that they found two people inside the residence who did not have permission to be there. It was discovered that the subjects had begun gathering items that they intended to steal from the residence. When the victim arrived at the residence, the subjects jumped out of a window, but were apprehended by officers. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, October 15

Indecent Exposure – 34th Avenue / Beach Access

A victim reported that while she was laying out on the beach an unknown male subject who was lying near her exposed himself. The victim was able to photograph the subject. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, October 16

<u>Indecent Exposure</u> – Beach / IOP County Park

A victim reported that while out on the beach an unknown male subject exposed himself. The male subject left the beach and the victim followed, taking a picture of his vehicle and license plate. The victim was able to provide a description of the subject and based on this information an arrest warrant was obtained. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, October 17

Destructive/Damage/Vandalism of Property - 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

An officer on night shift patrol observed a vehicle that had crashed into a dumpster located in the loading zone, completely out of the lane of travel. The officer was unable to locate any persons inside the vehicle, but a witness was able to provide a description of the male who had been driving and that he had a small child with him. The officer located the subject with the child at a local hotel and noted that the subject was intoxicated. The male subject was placed under arrest and the child was turned over to the Department of Social Service until other family members could be located. While the male subject was detained inside of an officer's patrol vehicle, he kicked the door, causing it to bend, not closing all the way, tore the headliner and other damage. The subject was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Petit Larceny - 46th Avenue

A contractor doing renovation to a residence reported that unknown persons stole a washing machine from the residence. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$700. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, October 19

<u>Underage Possession of Alcohol</u> – 2600 Block Palm Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a loud party. When they arrived, they could see several people, who appeared to be under the age of 21, playing beer pong with multiple Bud Light beer cans and bottles of liquor around the residence. When officers knocked to get their attention, they observed several of the subjects run upstairs. The subject responsible for the residence opened the door and officers went inside, where they located six subjects, who were charged and given a court date.

Friday, October 20

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u> – Palm Boulevard / 21st Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for an expired vehicle license plate. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that his driver's license was suspended for four counts of failure to pay property tax and two counts of cancellation of insurance. The subject was arrested and released with a court date.

Saturday, October 21

<u>Driving Under the Influence</u> – Palm Boulevard / 20th Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that she was possibly under the influence. When asked, she admitted that she had been drinking and shouldn't be driving. The officer requested that she complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and upon completion, was arrested. The subject was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where she provided a breath sample with a BAC of .25%. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Simple Assault – JC Long Boulevard

An officer was flagged down by a victim who advised that he had just been assaulted. The victim was able to identify the subject and officers patrolled the area, but were unable to locate him. The victim indicated the subject had punched him in his face approximately five times and attempted to choke him. The victim refused medical treatment. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, October 22

Driving Under the Influence - Palm Boulevard / Breach Inlet

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 50MPH in a posted 35MPH speed zone. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked, the subject admitted to having several glasses of wine. The officer requested that he complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, but the driver refused and was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The subject was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Monday, October 23

Motor Vehicle Theft – Twin Oaks Lane

A victim reported that unknown persons stole her golf cart from the open garage area at her residence. The approximate value of the stolen vehicle is \$3,667. The owner was able to provide a Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) and the vehicle was entered into NCIC. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, October 24

<u>Destructive/Damage/Vandalism of Property</u> – JC Long Boulevard / Ocean Boulevard A victim reported that unknown persons had spray painted the back of her vehicle. The approximate

value of the damage is \$500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

<u>Telephone Calls/Obscene/Harassing</u> – Intracoastal Court

A victim reported that she was receiving harassing text messages from a known subject accusing her of having an affair with the subject's husband. The subject was also contacting the victim's employer. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, October 25

Disorderly Conduct - 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer on night shift patrol observed a subject walking across Palm Boulevard near 14th Avenue who appeared to have difficulty staying upright and walking. The officer made contact with the subject and discovered that he was grossly intoxicated. The subject indicated that he was homeless and did not have anywhere he could stay. Due to his inability to care for himself and his safety due to his intoxication, he was arrested and transported to Al Cannon Detention Center.

Thursday, October 26

Petit Larceny – 9500 Block Palmetto Drive

A victim reported that unknown persons stole the car cover off his vehicle. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, October 27

Burglary - 1300 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown persons broke into the residence they were renting and stole clothing which they had purchased earlier in the day. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$300. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Personnel Recognition

FTO Robert Forsythe, ACO Chris Enourato and BSO Larry Hyleman received a letter of recognition from a citizen for their assistance when her car would not start. She commended them for their service and dedication to the citizens of Isle of Palms.

Ptl. Ayer was commended for his professionalism and dedication when he responded to a medical call on the beach. He located the woman needing assistance until first responders could arrive. She was worried about her dog and he reassured her that he would keep the dog safe and at our kennels until she could pick up the dog. Later during his shift, Ptl. Ayer called the woman to check on her and learned that she was unable to get a ride from the hospital to pick up her car and dog. Ptl. Ayer checked with his Sergeant and then went to get the woman, who was very appreciative.

Community Service Activities

During the month of October 2017, Officers issued one hundred eighty-one (181) "Property Security Check Notices" and seven (7) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices.

October 11 – FTO James Couche assisted a visitor from Connecticut with the installation and inspection of a child safety seat.

October 30 – Detective Louise Hardy and Ptl. Ayer attended Miss Cathy's class at the IOP Recreation Department where they read the children (3-4 years old) a story, discussed Halloween safety and gave them candy to take home.

October 31 – Ptl. Ayer attended Miss Cathy's class at the IOP Recreation Department where he read to the children (3-4 years old), discussed Halloween safety and gave them candy to take home.
