The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of September.

Friday, September 1

Harassment - 3400 Block Hartnett Boulevard

A victim reported that she had received threatening text messages from an estranged family member. The victim requested that the family member be placed on trespass notice. The victim was advised on how to get an order of protection order through the Magistrate Court. This case was assigned to CID for follow-up.

Saturday, September 2

Disorderly Conduct - J C Long Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a disturbance between two male subjects at a local establishment. When officers arrived, the located one of the male subjects walking in the road. Contact was made with the subject, who appeared to be extremely intoxicated, was yelling obscenities and refused to follow the officer's instruction. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Driving Under Suspension - 2300 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended driver's license for excessive point violation. The driver was charged and issued a citation.

Sunday, September 3

Simple Possession of Marijuana- 2600 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. During contact with the driver, the officer smelled a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. When asked, the driver turned over the marijuana. The driver was placed under arrest and issued citations.

Stolen Property Offenses - Ocean Boulevard / 14th Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation and before making contact with the driver, checked the vehicle license plate on the Mobile Data Terminal (MDT), determining that the vehicle

license plate had been reported as stolen. Further investigation revealed that the vehicle had also been reported stolen by the West Columbia Police Department. Both the driver and passenger were placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Petit Larceny - Beach / 21st Avenue

A victim reported that when he went swimming, he left his personal belongings on the beach. Upon his return, he found that shorts containing his wallet, credit cards, cash, and mobile phone had been stolen by unknown person(s). The approximate value of the stolen items is \$925. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, September 4

Burglary - 57th Avenue

Officers responded to a burglary in progress. When officers arrived on scene, they found an unsecured door, began to clear the residence and located seven subjects inside, who were all placed in handcuffs during the investigation. It was determined that the subjects did not have permission to be inside the residence. All subjects were arrested, three were under the age of seventeen and released to their parents with notice to appear in Family Court. The remaining fours subjects were transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Tuesday, September 5

Theft from Motor Vehicle - 2700 Block Waterway Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into two of his unlocked vehicles in his driveway and stole money. The amount stolen was approximately \$820. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft from Motor Vehicle- 23rd Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his vehicle and stole a handgun. The approximate value of the stolen gun is \$300. The serial number for the gun was entered into NCIC as stolen. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft from Building - 1900 Block Waterway Boulevard

A victim reported that she had a subject assist her in getting ready for a yard sale. When the subject asked the victim about selling her jewelry, the victim said she was not selling it. The victim found that she had some jewelry that had been stolen. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$1,900. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft from Motor Vehicle - 32nd Avenue

A victim reported that two vehicles parked in the driveway at his residence had been broken into by unknown person(s) and cash was the only thing that had been taken. The approximate amount stolen was \$215. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Petit Larceny - 3000 Block Waterway Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into her garage area and stole a bicycle. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$120. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, September 8

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u> – Palm Boulevard / 14th Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended driver's license for cancelation of insurance. The driver was arrested, issued citations and the vehicle was impounded.

Saturday, September 9

Driving Under Suspension - Palm Boulevard / 26th Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended driver's license for cancelation of insurance. Additionally, the vehicle license plate was also suspended. The driver was arrested, issued citations and the vehicle was impounded.

Monday, September 18

Theft from Buildings - 400 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that he was hired to complete some renovations to a residence and had left eleven ceiling fans at the residence. When he returned to complete the work, he found that the ceiling fans had been stolen. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$1,590. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, September 21

Driving Under Suspension - 1200 Block of Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Further investigation found that the driver had a suspended driver's license for failure to pay reinstatement fees. The driver was arrested, issued citations and the vehicle was impounded.

Sunday, September 24

Warrant Arrest - Waterway Boulevard / 23rd Avenue

Officers were advised that a subject who had outstanding arrest warrants with Mount Pleasant Police Department for disorderly conduct and shoplifting was possibly on the Isle of Palms. An officer located the subject matching the description given walking on foot, confirmed the arrest warrant and placed the subject under arrest. The subject was transferred to Mount Pleasant Police Department.

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u> – Waterway Boulevard / 25th Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for disregarding a stop sign. Further investigation found that the driver had a suspended driver's license for an unpaid traffic citation. The driver was arrested, issued citations, and the vehicle was released to the owner.

<u>Driving Under the Influence</u> – 600 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding. Upon making contact with the driver, the officer smelled an odor of an alcoholic beverage and observed a cup containing wine. When asked, the driver admitted to drinking a glass of wine. The officer requested the driver to submit to Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion of the tests, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB

for Datamaster Testing, where she refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Monday, September 25

Petit Larceny - 3500 Block Waterway Drive

A victim reported that a shop vacuum had been stolen from the garage area under his residence by unknown person(s). The approximate value of the stolen item is \$100. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft from Buildings - 100 Block of Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that a known suspect had stolen consumable goods from a local restaurant. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$100. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u> – Palm Boulevard / 14th Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for failing to stop at the traffic signal before making a turn on the red light. Further investigation found that the driver had a suspended driver's license for reckless driving. The driver was arrested, issued citations and the vehicle was impounded.

Tuesday, September 26

Stolen Property Offenses - Palm Boulevard / IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Upon making contact with the occupants of the vehicle, a strong odor of marijuana was observed. The officer had the passenger exit the vehicle and before the subject could be searched, he attempted to throw a bag containing marijuana over the side of the Connector. Both occupants were placed under arrest. Further investigation revealed a clear plastic baggie containing cocaine and a handgun under the passenger's seat, which when checked through NCIC returned as stolen by the North Charleston Police Department. Documents, credit cards and a driver's license were found inside the vehicle and it was discovered that these items had been stolen, but the victim had not yet reported the armed robbery that had occurred in Goose Creek. Both subjects were transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Wednesday, September 27

Burglary – 200 Block Forest Trail

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into her residence, which is currently for sale. The victim found an open window in the bedroom at the back of the residence, which had been closed when she left. The victim reported that it appeared nothing had been stolen. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, September 28

Warrant Arrest - 200 Block Forest Trail

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding. Further investigation found that the driver had an outstanding arrest warrant with Orangeburg County Probation, Pardon and Parole (PPP) for a parole violation. The arrest warrant was confirmed and the driver was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center to be released to Orangeburg County PPP Office.

Friday, September 29

<u>Driving Under Suspension</u> – Palm Boulevard / 23rd Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Further investigation found that the driver had a suspended driver's license for cancelation of insurance. The driver was arrested, issued citations and the vehicle was released to the owner.

Saturday, September 30

Domestic Violence - High & Aggravated Nature - Sandcrab Court

Officers responded to a report of a domestic situation. Investigation revealed that the victim had been home with the couple's small child when the male half returned home. The victim reported that they began to argue, which moved outside. The male half got into his vehicle and as he was backing out of the driveway, attempted to strike the victim with his vehicle. The male subject was arrested for Domestic Violence of a high and aggravated nature and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.
