The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of February.

Thursday, February 2

Collision / Narcotics Violation - 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

An officer responded to a report of a hit and run collision and provided a description of the suspect vehicle to neighboring law enforcement agencies. A Mt. Pleasant Police officer located the vehicle on Riviera Drive. The owner and driver of the vehicle was located and he admitted to hitting the vehicle, explaining that he would settle up later. The driver was arrested and officers found drug paraphernalia on his person. The driver was charged with leaving the scene of a collision and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia. He was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Friday, February 3

Petit Larceny - 200 Block Forest Trail

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his yard and stole his bicycle that was located unsecured next to the residence. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$300. The victim was able to provide a serial number for the bicycle and it was entered into NCIC. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, February 4

Suspicious Vehicle / Narcotics Violations - 1300 Block Ocean Boulevard

An officer patrolling the area after midnight, detected a strong odor of marijuana as he passed by a vehicle that was parked with two subjects sitting inside. The officer approached the subjects and after confronting them about the odor, the owner of the vehicle admitted that there was marijuana in the center console. The subject was charged with simple possession of marijuana and released on scene with a court date.

Monday, February 6

Petit Larceny - 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a solar dog house that was kept at the rear of the business. The approximate value of the stolen property is \$125. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

<u>Suspicious Vehicle / Narcotics Violations</u> – Palm Boulevard / 21st Avenue

An officer patrolling the area after 10pm located a vehicle illegally parked on the shoulder. Further investigation revealed two subjects inside and a strong odor of marijuana emitting from inside the vehicle. The owner of the vehicle admitted that there was marijuana inside the center console as well as a handgun. The subject was charged with simple possession of marijuana, unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia and released on scene with a court date.

Tuesday, February 7

Traffic Stop / Warrant Arrest - 41st Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An officer on patrol observed that as a vehicle passed by, the driver was not wearing his seat belt. The officer stopped the vehicle and further investigation revealed that the driver had an active arrest warrant with the SC Department of Natural Resources (SCDNR). The driver was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center for SCDNR to serve their warrant.

Petit Larceny - 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that he had stayed at a local hotel and upon returning home, discovered that his iPad Air 2 was missing. The approximate value of the stolen property is \$350. The victim was unable to provide a serial number for his property. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Simple Assault – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that on February 1 while he was entering a local establishment, a female subject he knows began yelling at him, push him and then attempted to knock him down the stairs. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, February 10

Liquor Law Violations- 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer observed a golf cart operating after 11:30 at night and conducted a stop of the cart. Further investigation revealed two open containers of beer in the front cup holders and that they were possibly impaired and should not be driving a vehicle. Both subjects were charged and released to a sober driver.

Saturday, February 11

Destruction of Property – 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that the bathroom sink located in his business had been torn away from the wall and that the subjects responsible were headed towards the Municipal Parking Lot. Officers were able to locate the responsible subjects and determined who was responsible for the damage. During their investigation, one of the subjects became irate and combative, attempting to charge and fight with

officers. The subject was quickly arrested and charged with disorderly conduct. The other subject was charged with injury to real property. Both were transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Sunday, February 19

<u>Driving Under the Influence</u> – Palm Boulevard / 22nd Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for making several turning movements without using a turn signal after cutting through a parking lot to avoid the traffic signal. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. The officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, but he refused. The driver was arrested and transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was charged with DUI and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Monday, February 20

Simple Assault - 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that while he was using the restroom at a local establishment, an unknown subject approached him, shoved him into the wall and began punching him repeatedly. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Grand Larceny - Waterway Island Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a jewelry box containing approximately \$131,900 worth of jewelry from her residence. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, February 21

Burglary - 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) broke into two hotel rooms and stole refrigerators, televisions and a clothes iron. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$830. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, February 23

Traffic Offense – Palm Boulevard / 20th Avenue

An officer patrolling at approximately 5:30am, stopped a vehicle for a broken headlight and tag lights. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that the vehicle was not insured. The driver was charged with operating an uninsured vehicle and the vehicle was towed. The driver was released on scene with a court date.

Petit Larceny - 41st Avenue

A victim reported that a delivery driver entered into the restaurant office while the manager had stepped out and stole a sum of cash from the cash drawer. The theft was immediately discovered and officers responded. The delivery company was contacted, requested that the driver and helper return. While the driver was on the way back to the restaurant, the helper handed him the money and jumped out of the truck. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Impersonation / Identity Theft - Ocean Point

A victim reported that she was contacted by two financial institutions in reference to an unknown person(s) attempting to open multiple credit cards in her name. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, February 24

Traffic Stop / Simple Possession of Marijuana - IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for having an expired vehicle license and upon making contact with the driver, smelled a strong odor of marijuana emitting from inside the vehicle. When asked, the driver admitted to having it and removed container from the driver's side door pocket containing the marijuana. The driver was charged with simple possession of marijuana and failing to display a valid sticker on his license plate. He was released on the scene with a court date.

Grand Larceny - 800 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered onto a residential construction site and stole a pallet of wood that was being stored under the residence. The approximate value of the stolen property is \$6,500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

<u>Suspicious Person / Narcotics Violations</u> – Beach / Sea Cabins Pier

An officer patrolling the area after 10:30pm, located two subjects under the pier with a hammock tied to the pilings. While speaking with the subjects, the officer detected a strong odor of marijuana and determined that they had marijuana, an open bottle of liquor and that they were under the age of 21. The subjects were charged with simple possession of marijuana and minor in possession of alcohol. They were released on the scene with a court date.

Monday, February 27

<u>Suspicious Vehicle / Narcotics Violations</u> – Ocean Boulevard / JC Long Boulevard

An officer patrolling the area after 1:00am, observed a parked vehicle with blankets hanging over the rear windows occupied by two subjects who were sleeping. Further investigation revealed that there was drug paraphernalia containing marijuana in plain view on the floorboard of the vehicle. The subjects were charged with unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia, liquor law violation, and simple possession of marijuana. The subjects were transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Tuesday, February 28

<u>Traffic Stop / Open Container</u> – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Further investigation revealed the driver was in possession of an open container of beer that was located in the pocket on the rear of the front passenger's seat. The subject was charged with open container and released from the scene with a court date.

February 8 – Ptl. Robert Forsythe met with Cub Scout Troop 50, Den 2 at Mason Preparatory School where he discussed the job of police officer, the patrol car and equipment.
