The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of March.

Friday, March 3

Domestic Violence - Lake Village Lane

Officers responded to a report of a domestic disturbance. Investigation revealed that the male subject had become upset and lost his patience with his wife over an issue with their small child. The male subject refused to allow his wife to leave the bathroom. She became upset and fearful of her husband's inability to control his anger. The husband refused to provide officers with any statement regarding the situation. The husband was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Saturday, March 4

Burglary - 800 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had broken the latch on the downstairs door, stole a baseball bat and then struck their vehicle several times, causing damage to the front passenger window. The approximate damage and value of the stolen item is \$1,050. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft from Building - JC Long Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen his cell phone when he left it on a table. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$200. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, March 7

False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game - Twin Oaks Lane

A victim reported that a subject had booked a rental of a residence, but the method of payment was returned for insufficient funds. The subject assured the victim that he would make good on the payment due, but after several failed attempts, the victim reported the incident to law enforcement. CID completed the investigation and secured a warrant for the subject, who was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Friday, March 10

Traffic Offense / Driving Under Suspension-26th Avenue and Cameron Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for operating with an expired vehicle license. Further investigation revealed that the driver of the vehicle also possessed a suspended driver's license. The driver was arrested, charged with driving under suspension, operating an uninsured vehicle, and failure to pay a citation. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Possession of False Driver's License - Palmetto Drive / Racquet Club Drive

An officer stopped a golf cart for operating at approximately 2:00am. Further investigation revealed that the subjects on the golf cart were under the age of 21, had been drinking alcoholic beverages and were in possession of false driver's license to purchase alcohol. Both subjects were issued citations for underage consumption of alcohol, possession of false driver's license and were released with a court date.

Fraud/Identity Theft - 23rd Avenue

A victim reported that he received an alert about unknown person(s) using his personal information to open a Verizon account. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, March 11

Driving Under the Influence - 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon contacting the driver, the officer determined that the driver was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver indicated that he had drank two or three drinks. The officer also observed a beer can that had spilled onto the floorboard behind the front passenger seat. The officer requested the driver to complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and after the tests, the driver was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Monday, March 13

False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game - 600 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that she received a phone call from a subject claiming to be her grandson who was in trouble and needed her to wire money. The victim withdrew \$1,500 as instructed and attempted to wire the money. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, March 16

Underage Possession of Alcohol - 29th Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation and upon contacting the driver, observed a bottle covered up with a shirt on the floorboard behind the front passenger seat. When asked, the driver, who was under the age of 21, indicated that it was a bottle of liquor that a friend gave her and she forgot it was there. The driver was issued a citation for underage possession of alcohol and released with a court date.

Friday, March 17

Traffic Stop/ Driving Under Suspension - Palm Boulevard / IOP Connector

An officer observed a vehicle that was driving much slower than other vehicles and upon checking the vehicle license plate discovered that it was suspended for cancellation of insurance. The officer stopped the vehicle, contacted the driver, whose driver's license was also suspended. The driver was issued citations for driving under suspension, failure to surrender a suspended license plate and released with a court date.

Sunday, March 19

Theft from Buildings - 5800 Palmetto Drive

A victim reported that he rented a residence to have a get together with several guests and during this event an unknown person(s) stole case and prescription medications. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$250. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, March 22

Credit Card Fraud - Morgans Cove Court

A victim reported that when she attempted to use her credit / debit card it was declined and upon contacting her bank, they advised her that her new credit / debit card had been ordered and was being sent to an address in Mount Pleasant. When the victim reviewed her bank statement, she observed several unauthorized charges totaling approximately \$102. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, March 24

Shoplifting - 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that a subject had entered the convenience store, took a beer from the case and then left the store without paying for the item. An officer located the subject near the dumpster at the rear of the store with the stolen beer, which was empty, but still cold. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Saturday, March 25

Liquor Law Violations - 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

An officer approached a subject who was standing on the public sidewalk holding an open container of beer. When the officer instructed the subject to throw the beer away, he refused and drank the contents. The subject was issued a citation and released with a court date.

Tuesday, March 28

Vandalism - 3600 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) caused damage to her fence. Further investigation revealed that the damage was consistent with a vehicle hitting the fence. The approximate amount of damage caused is \$500. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, March 29

Vandalism - 3400 Block Hartnett Boulevard

A victim reported that a subject was observed standing near her vehicle and when she went out to her vehicle later, she observed that profanity had been scratched into the paint. The approximate amount of damage caused is \$250. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, March 30

<u>Traffic Stop / Driving Under Suspension</u> – 2100 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for an expired vehicle license plate. Upon further investigation, it was determined that he had a suspended driver's license. The driver was issued citations for driving under suspension, expired registration and released with a court date.

Friday, March 31

Traffic Stop / Driving Under Suspension - 41st Avenue

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 40MPH in a posted 25MPH speed zone. Further investigation revealed that the operator's driver's license was suspended. The driver was issued citations for speeding, driving under suspension and released with a court date.
