The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of August.

Monday, August 1

Driving Under the Influence -28th Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An officer responded to a report of a possible intoxicated driver, located the vehicle and conducted a lawful traffic stop. The officer made contact with the driver and determined that she was possibly under the influence. When asked if she had been drinking, the driver admitted to having a couple of liquor drinks earlier. The officer asked the driver to conduct Standardized Field Sobriety Tests (SFSTs), to which she agreed. At the conclusion of the SFSTs, the driver was placed under arrest and transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing. The driver refused to provide a breath sample and was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Burglary – 900 Block of Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered their vacation rental and stole her jewelry. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$23,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Grand Larceny- 41st Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole monies set to be deposited from a local restaurant establishment safe. The approximate amount of monies stolen is \$4,500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, August 2

Vandalism – 400 Block of Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) vandalized the shower area that is located under the house in the garage area. The subjects spray painted profanity on the exterior of the shower. The estimate of the damage caused is \$150. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, August 3

Grand Larceny -22nd Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole jewelry from the residence. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$10,300. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, August 4

Credit Card Fraud – 1400 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) fraudulently used her credit card number to make unauthorized purchases. The approximate amount of items charged is \$3,200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, August 6

Petit Larceny – 800 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole their bicycle from under the residence, unsecured. The approximate value of the stolen bicycle is \$800. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Petit Larceny – 1300 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole their bicycle from the bike rack located in the parking lot, which had not been secured. The estimated value of the bicycle is \$300. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, August 7

Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / 13th Avenue

An officer responded to a report of a collision. During the investigation, the officer determined that one of the driver's involved was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver admitted to consuming alcoholic beverages. The officer asked the driver to complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests (SFSTs), to which the driver agreed. At the conclusion of the SFSTs, the driver was placed under arrest and transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing. The driver refused to provide a breath sample and was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Theft of MV Parts / Accessories – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole the license plate from her vehicle. The stolen license plate was entered into NCIC. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Petit Larceny – 2200 Block Waterway Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole two bicycles from their front porch area. The approximate value of the stolen bicycles is \$150. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, August 8

Burglary – 24th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) forced entry into the residence and stole money, jewelry, and guns from the residence. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$15,858. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, August 20

Petit Larceny- 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A local retail establishment reported that unknown person(s) stole a surfboard from in front of the business. The estimated value of the stolen item is \$200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Driving Under the Influence – 7600 Block of Palmetto Drive

An officer responded to a report of an intoxicated driver. The officer located the vehicle and conducted a lawful traffic stop. The officer made contact with the driver and determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver admitted that he had been drinking. The officer requested that the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. Upon completion of the tests, the driver was placed under arrest and transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing. The driver provided a breath sample that registered a BAC of .14%. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Sunday, August 21

Weapon Law Violations – IOP Connector

An officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for speeding, 90MPH in a posted 55MPH. Upon making contact with the driver, the officer observed a passenger in the vehicle as well. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a loaded handgun under the front seat. The driver was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Monday, August 22

Driving Under the Influence – 30th Avenue / Wills Way

An officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for speeding, 38MPH in a posted 25MPH. Upon making contact with the driver, the officer determined that the driver was possibly under the influence. When asked if she had been drinking, she indicated that she had a few earlier. The officer requested that the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. Upon completion of the tests, the driver was placed under arrest and transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing. The driver refused to provide a breath sample and was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Wednesday, August 24

Burglary – 100 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his residence and stole the iPad remote for the alarm system. The approximate value of the item is \$250. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, August 27

Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / 14th Avenue

An officer responded to a report of a vehicle stopped at the traffic light, where the driver was located passed out in the driver's seat with the vehicle in drive. When asked, the driver indicated he had not been drinking. The officer requested the driver complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. At the completion of testing, the driver was placed under arrest. The driver was transported IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Petit Larceny – 44th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole two flags from his boat located in his boat slip. The approximate value of the items is \$60. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, August 28

Agency Assist / Residential Fire – 300 Block Charleston Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a confirmed residential fire and assisted with traffic control.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – Ocean Boulevard / JC Long Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into her unlocked vehicle and stole prescription medication. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$60. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, August 29

Agency Assist / Water Rescue – 9000 Block Palmetto Drive

An officer responded to assist IOP Fire Department with a water rescue. The officer located the victim's spouse and stood by to assist and transport to a local hospital.

Tuesday, August 30

Domestic Violence – Sandcrab Court

A victim reported that he and his wife had a physical altercation. Upon investigation, it was determined that the wife had assaulted her husband and was placed under arrest. She was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Wednesday, August 31

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole the vehicle license plate from the rear of his car. The stolen license plate was entered into NCIC. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

FTO Matthew Maloney received a commendation from Chaplin Dewey for his compassion and assistance to a citizen whose husband drowned.

Community Service Activities

During the month of May 2016, Officers issued forty-eight (48) "Property Security Check Notices" and six (6) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices.

August 2 – Pfc. Louise Hardy organized the National Night Out event, which was held at the IOP Recreation Department. This event provided the City's First Responders to continue to strengthen relationships with the community. The IOP Recreation Department personnel assisted by providing a jump castle and face painter. The IOP Fire Department assisted by staffing the grills and providing hot dogs to the attendees. All IOP Police Department officers attended to pass out child fingerprint cards, interact with the children, and answer questions from the citizens. It is estimated that 275 attended the event.

August 19 – Pfc. James Taylor assisted a resident from Mount Pleasant, SC with the installation and inspection of a child safety seat.

August 20 – Pfc. James Taylor assisted an island resident with the installation and inspection of a child safety seat.

August 26 – Pfc. James Couche assisted a resident from Mount Pleasant, SC with the installation and inspection of a child safety seat.
