The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of May.

Tuesday, May 3

Burglary – 500 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered the enclosed garage area, stealing a child's bicycle. The approximate value of the stolen bicycle is \$100. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, May 6

Missing Person – 700 Block Palm Boulevard

A subject was reported missing from his residence by his family who had not been able to contact him for the last several days. It was determined that the subject had not been at work and missed several scheduled meetings. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

The subject was located in Salt Lake City, Utah in good health.

Grand Larceny – 800 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole tools from a residence under construction. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$2,657. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, May 8

Agency Assist – IOP Fire Department – 4700 Block Palm Boulevard

Officers responded to assist the IOPFD with traffic control at a confirmed structure fire.

Motor Vehicle Theft – Morgans Cove Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his golf cart from his front yard. The approximate value of the vehicle is \$8,000. The victim was able to provide the vehicle identification number, which allowed the golf cart to be entered into NCIC as stolen. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

The next day, a Patrol Officer located the golf cart abandoned on the side of the road. The golf cart was returned to the owner and removed from NCIC.

Burglary – 54th Avenue

A good Samaritan observed a residence that appeared to have an open front door and called the police. Officers arrived and discovered that the doorframe had been broken. The property manager was contacted to determine if any items had been stolen. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – Twin Oaks Lane

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his unlocked vehicle, stealing his brief case, which contained an iPad and jewelry. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$595. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – Commons Court

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into her unlocked vehicle. The only item discovered missing was the owner's manual for the vehicle. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$25. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, May 12

False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game – 900 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that they rented a vacation home from Craigslist, paying \$767 as a down payment. The victim contacted the rental company, discovering that the listing on Craigslist was a fraud. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, May 13

Burglary – 600 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into the garage area of the residence, stealing his golf bag and clubs. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$2,366. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, May 14

Domestic Violence – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a male and female subject arguing and fighting on the beach. The subjects left in a vehicle that was stopped by officers. It was determined that the subjects were married and were mutual combatants. Both subjects were arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Sunday, May 15

Simple Assault – JC Long Boulevard

Officers responded to an assault in progress with information that one of the subjects had left the area. An officer located the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop, detaining the subject until all information could be obtained. It was determined that the subject had struck a server in the face while at a local

restaurant and left. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to the AI Cannon Detention Center.

Domestic Violence – 2600 Block Cameron Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a domestic situation. Upon arriving at the residence, it was determined that the subjects lived together and that the male subject had struck the female subject causing injury. The male subject was arrested and transported to the AI Cannon Detention Center.

Wednesday, May 18

Petit Larceny – 41st Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole fishing equipment from his boat. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$780. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, May 19

Burglary – 900 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into the garage area and stole the batteries from the golf cart. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$600. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, May 22

Disorderly Conduct – 5800 Block Palmetto Drive

Officers responded to a report of a male subject banging on walls and yelling profanity throughout the night. Upon arrival, officers attempted to make contact with the male subject, who could be heard yelling profanities and causing a disturbance. The subject eventually opened the door, but then slammed it on the officers. The subject was placed under arrest for disorderly conduct and transported to the AI Cannon Detention Center.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 1100 Block Pavilion Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had broken the driver's side window out of his vehicle. The unknown person(s) then stole his handgun from inside the vehicle. The owner was able to provide the serial number for the gun, which was entered into NCIC. The approximate value of the stolen handgun is \$300. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, May 23

Burglary – Sandpiper Court

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had entered into his garage area, cut the lock on his storage area, and stolen his fishing equipment. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$1,660. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Burglary – 200 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into a residence that was being remodeled, stealing several items and the owner's car. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$10,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 200 Block Forest Trail

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into her locked vehicle, stealing her handgun from the center console. The owner was able to provide the serial number and the handgun was entered into NCIC. The approximate value of the handgun is \$525. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, May 24

Petit Larceny – Beach Access / Pavilion Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole her beach chair that contained her cell phone, where she left it on the beach while she was walking. The owner was able to provide the serial number for her cell phone and it was entered into NCIC. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$300. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, May 25

Drug/Narcotic Violation – 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer on patrol observed a vehicle parked illegally and upon investigation observed in plain view a clear plastic baggie of marijuana sitting on the center console. The officer was unable to locate anyone at the time and wrote a parking citation. A short time later, the officer observed the vehicle driving along Palm Boulevard, conducted a traffic stop with the vehicle, and detained the subjects. The officer located the illegal drugs on the front passenger floorboard and discovered a white powdered substance that the subject advised was “molly”, also known as MDMA or ecstasy. The subjects were arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Thursday, May 26

False Pretense/Swindle/Confidence Game – 1300 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that a subject had rented three vacation rentals during the same period using a credit card, belonging to his father. The victim received a call from the credit card company indicating that the charges were being disputed. The approximate value of the rental homes being disputed is \$11,619. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – JC Long Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into the trunk of her vehicle, stealing her pocket book and its contents, after she accidentally left the trunk unlatched. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$300. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, May 27

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 20th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole the vehicle license plate from the rear of his car. The license plate information was entered into NCIC. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, May 31

Burglary – 800 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) broke into a residence that is under construction and damaged the inside of the residence by throwing paint on the walls and floors. The approximate amount of damage caused is \$5000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Beach Alcohol Enforcement

During the month, Officers patrolled the beach and charged twenty-five (25) persons for violating the City's ordinance preventing alcohol on the beach.
