The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of September.

Thursday, September 1

Narcotics Violation / Warrant Arrest – 21st Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An officer on foot patrol on the beach access path after midnight located two subjects who were engaged in coitus in the dunes. The subjects were instructed to get dressed and then checked through NCIC for outstanding warrants, which revealed that the male subject was wanted by Charleston County Sheriff's Office. A search of his person incident to arrest found him to be in possession of cocaine. He was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Petit Larceny - Area of 41st Avenue

A victim reported that sometime during the night unknown person(s) boarded her boat located in one of the boat slips and stole the marine battery, causing damage to the ignition switch. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$150 and the damaged caused was estimated to be \$100. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Burglary – 200 Block Carolina Boulevard

A property manager reported that he found items that belonged to a subject that was not supposed to be inside the rental property. A driver's license for the subject was located in the belongings. The subject was located and determined to be connected with multiple burglaries on the island. This case was assigned to CID, who was able to locate the subject and charge her accordingly.

Friday, September 2

Burglary – 2900 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) broke into his residence and stole several items and then appeared to have been staying at the residence. The approximate value of the items stolen was \$1800. This case was assigned to CID, who was able to locate the subject and charge her accordingly.

Burglary – Area of Surf Lane

A victim reported that an unknown person had broken into their residence. It was discovered that the subject had been staying at the residence without permission, did her laundry and stole items from the residence. This case was assigned to CID, who was able to locate the subject and charge her accordingly.

Monday, September 5

Motor Vehicle Theft – 23rd Avenue / Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that he had parked his truck and trailer and went down to the beach. When he returned, he found that unknown person(s) had stolen his dirt bike from the trailer. The approximate value of the stolen vehicle is \$3000. The victim was able to provide the Vehicle Identification Number for the dirt bike and it was entered into NCIC. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Burglary – 300 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that an unknown person(s) had broken into their residence and stole several items. It was also reported that the subject had been staying in the residence without permission. This case was assigned to CID, who was able to locate the subject and charge her accordingly.

Tuesday, September 6

Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for a moving violation and upon making contact with the driver, determined that he was possibly under the influence. The officer asked the driver to complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, to which he refused. The driver was arrested and transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where the driver refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Wednesday, September 7

Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 73MPH in a posted 55MPH speed zone. Upon making contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked if he had been drinking, the driver stated that he had one or two beers earlier. The officer asked the driver to complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and upon completion, was arrested. The driver was then transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he provided a breath sample with a BAC of .09%. The driver was lodged in the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Thursday, September 8

Petit Larceny – Beach / 9th Avenue Beach Access

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his backpack containing personal items that he left on the beach while surfing. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$1380. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, September 9

Disorderly Conduct – 100 Block Charleston Boulevard

An officer responded to a call of a subject passed out in someone's front yard. The officers located the subject, who responded to questions with unintelligible answers. In trying to locate where the subject was supposed to be staying, he indicated New Jersey. After several attempts to assist the subject, his gross intoxication and refusal to provide information, he was arrested and lodged in the AI Cannon Detention Center.

Saturday, September 10

Driving Under the Influence – 200 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for a moving violation and upon making contact with the driver, determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked if he had been drinking, the driver replied that he had three liquor drinks and one shot. The driver was asked to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and upon completion was arrested. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the AI Cannon Detention Center.

Burglary – Area of 9th Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) broke into a residence that was currently under construction and stole several items such as pendant lights, ceiling fans and other household items. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$2,603. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, September 11

Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for an expired vehicle license plate and upon making contact with the driver, determined that he was possibly under the influence. The officer asked the driver to complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, which he refused and was subsequently arrested. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, which he also refused. The driver was lodged in the AI Cannon Detention Center.

Wednesday, September 14

Disorderly Conduct – 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a possible domestic and upon arrival determined that the two subjects involved were extremely intoxicated. The female half of the incident started arguing with patrons inside a local restaurant and then attempted to charge and tackle them. When officers located the subjects, who had both fallen in the parking lot and hit their heads on the pavement, they requested IOPFD to respond. While trying to get identification from the female half, she refused to cooperate and then began yelling profanity in public. The female subject was arrested and placed in the back of a the officer's patrol car, where she began to kick the windows and then threatened to have the officers killed by US Representative Trey Gowdy, in addition to ripping their throats out like a vampire. While officers were placing leg shackles on the female subject, she spit in the face of an officer. The female subject was lodged in the AI Cannon Detention Center.

Sunday, September 18

Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation and upon making contact with the driver, determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked if he had been drinking, the driver stated that he had not. The officer then asked the driver to complete Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, where upon completion was arrested. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the AI Cannon Detention Center.

Tuesday, September 20

Disorderly Conduct – 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of a subject who was disorderly and making threats to harm himself while inside the grocery store. An officer located the subject, who was determined to be under the influence of narcotics and had been making racial slurs towards employees. The subject then threatened to smash a bottle of wine and then slice his throat open if they called the police. The subject was arrested and transported to the AI Cannon Detention Center.

Wednesday, September 21

Agency Assist – Area of Breach Inlet Bridge

Officers responded to assist Sullivan's Island Police Department with traffic control for an accident where a vehicle was reported to have gone airborne and flipped several times near the Breach Inlet Bridge. During the course of their investigation, one of the passengers was determined to have an outstanding arrest warrant and an IOP officer assisted with transport of the subject to transfer his custody to North Charleston Police Department.

Saturday, September 24

Petit Larceny – Ocean Boulevard / Pavilion Beach Access

A victim reported that while on the beach unknown person(s) stole her purse, which she had left unattended. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$845. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, September 25

Motor Vehicle Theft – 5700 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that he had worked late and met a female subject. When he woke the next morning, he discovered that his vehicle was stolen and the female subject had left. The vehicle information was entered into NCIC. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, September 29

Petit Larceny – 800 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole cash from purses and wallets from inside the residence they were staying. The approximate amount of money stolen is \$352. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Vandalism of Property – Area of 41st Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) caused damage to the wooden fence going around the golf cart path by possibly driving through the fence. The estimated cost of damage is \$100. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, September 30

Grand Larceny – 2900 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his enclosed trailer with landscaping equipment from his driveway. The owner was able to provide serial numbers and items were entered into NCIC. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$6775. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.
