A RESOLUTION BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING AN APPLICATION FOR FEMA HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT FUNDS TO ELEVATE THE PUBLIC RESTROOMS IN FRONT BEACH

WHEREAS, on October 05, 2015 the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) issued a major disaster declaration in the State of South Carolina in response to severe storms and flooding during the period of October 01, 2015 to October 23, 2015;

WHEREAS, with this declaration FEMA, through the State of South Carolina Emergency Management Division (EMD), is making funds available for a Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HGMP), which provides local governments, including the City of Isle of Palms, significant opportunities to implement long-term mitigation measures that reduce, minimize, or eliminate potential damages to public infrastructure from natural hazards;

WHEREAS, as a barrier island and due to its low elevation, the City of Isle of Palms is vulnerable to natural disasters, particularly hurricanes and flooding as a result of torrential rains, high tides, and storm surges,

WHEREAS, the City has and continues to maximize steps to be as disaster resistant as possible,

WHEREAS, the City's Public Restrooms facility, located in Front Beach should be replaced and does not meet current flood management standards since it was constructed prior the standards being in place,

WHEREAS, the existing building is located in a "V" zone and must be elevated so that the bottom of the lowest supporting structure is above base flood elevation,

WHEREAS, structural elevation is an eligible and fundable project by the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program provided that it is cost effective, contributes to the long-term solution to the problem intended to be addressed and eliminates the risk of further damage to the property as a result of natural hazards;

WHEREAS, the City understands that FEMA and EMD have put in place a formal process for preparing, reviewing and administering such grants and is prepared to dedicate staff and other resources as needed to fully participate in the process;

WHEREAS, The City of Isle of Palms possesses sufficient funds to fulfill its match obligations related to this grant application should FEMA award the grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ISLE OF PALMS AS FOLLOWS:

The City Administrator is authorized to apply for a Hazard Mitigation Grant for the purpose specified above and shall serve as the City's designated agent to implement the grant should it be approved.
