Date: OCTOBER 6, 2008

The following is a synopsis of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of September 2008.

Patrol

September 4, 2008 Just after 11:00 a.m., an officer stopped to investigate a female subject that had been reportedly walking incoherently on the Connector toward Mount Pleasant wearing what appeared to be a blood stained dress. When the responding officer attempted to speak to the subject she refused to answer any questions and showed no sign of comprehension. Fire department personnel were summoned to render first aid, but were unable to obtain any personal information. It was determined that the subject was reacting to the recent use of heroin and was transported by EMS to a local hospital for treatment.

September 6, 2008 Just after midnight, an officer on patrol of the front beach observed a male subject having an altercation in the street with a female companion. After speaking to both parties, the officer determined that the male subject was intoxicated and unable to care for himself. Since the companion would not assume responsibility, the subject was taken into custody and charged with Public Intoxication.

September 6, 2008 Officers responded to an Ocean Boulevard residence where it was reported that a male subject was unconscious and unresponsive. Fire department personnel also responded and it was determined that the male subject had died of natural causes, while sitting at the dinner table. The officer contacted the Coroner and stayed at the residence until a local funeral home responded to remove the subject.

September 6, 2008 Officers responded to a Palm Boulevard residence where a domestic dispute had been reported. An investigation determined that the male subject had been the primary aggressor causing the female subject to fear for her safety. The male subject was taken into custody and charged with Criminal Domestic Violence.

September 9, 2008 Officers responded to a Palm Boulevard residence where a domestic dispute had been reported. It was determined that there had been no assault and that the dispute was a loud verbal argument. The male subject present agreed to leave the residence to spend the night with his parents.

September 11, 2008 An officer responded to a smoke alarm activation reported at a Palm Boulevard residence. When the officer arrived he encountered an elderly female subject carrying her dog to safety. The officer safely removed the woman and pet then entered the residence and observed the entire residence to be filled with smoke. Fire department personnel arrived and determined that the smoke was the result of a faulty air conditioning unit.

September 11, 2008 The mother of a teenager contacted police to report that her son had threatened suicide after she confronted him about his possible drug use. She reported that her son had jumped from her vehicle on 26th Avenue and she wanted him located so she could get him medical attention. He was located a short time later by an officer on Hartnett near 31st Avenue and he agreed to be transported to MUSC by EMS and voluntarily submitted to a psychiatric evaluation.

September 14, 2008 A male subject made contact with an officer to report an assault by two subjects at a front beach establishment two days prior, receiving head injuries. The injuries were documented and the case was assigned to an Investigator. Both suspects responsible were identified, and arrests are forthcoming.

September 18, 2008 Two officers responded to what had been reported as a domestic dispute at a residence on Carolina Boulevard. When the officers arrived they overheard and observed a couple loudly arguing. The officers made contact with both parties who agreed to cease their loud disturbance, and succeeded in separating them for the evening.

September 18, 2008 After an officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation it was determined that a male passenger in the vehicle was wanted by the Bonneau Police Department. The Arrest Warrant was confirmed and the passenger was taken into custody and later released to the custody of a Bonneau police officer.

September 19, 2008 A female subject staying at a local condominium reported that her purse containing credit cards and prescription medication had been stolen while at a local nightspot. The next morning, a citizen located her empty purse and it was returned to her. While in the process of canceling her credit cards, it was determined that someone had already made at least two purchases locally with the stolen cards. This case has been assigned to an Investigator, who has identified the suspect through video surveillance when he used the stolen cards to make purchases. Two Arrest Warrants have been prepared and will be served once the suspect is located.

September 20, 2008 Just after 9:30 p.m., officers responded to reports of gunshots being fired in the area of Fairway Village Lane. After hearing additional gunshots responding officers determined that someone was shooting a shotgun from a location in Charleston County across from the Intracoastal Waterway. The Charleston County Sheriff's Office was notified.

September 22, 2008 Just after midnight, an officer stopped a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for a license plate violation and determined that the driver was operating without insurance coverage. Located in the vehicle was a marijuana pipe along with a quantity of marijuana. The driver was charged with Operating an Uninsured Motor Vehicle and Simple Possession of Marijuana.

September 23, 2008 Just before 2a.m., officers responded to a disturbance at a local convenience store. The officers observed a shirtless male subject yelling at the occupants of a vehicle attempting to leave that location. After speaking to witnesses it was determined that the subject had already assaulted a female companion. Based on evidence and the statements of witnesses, the subject was taken into custody and charged with Disorderly Conduct and Simple Assault.

September 23, 2008 Just before 5a.m., officers responded to a front beach condominium rental unit, where someone reported that an intoxicated male subject in boxer shorts was attempting to make entry into several units. The subject stated to officers that he lived in Wild Dunes, but could not be specific due to his level of intoxication. The subject was taken into custody and charged with Disorderly Conduct.

September 23, 2008 Officers responded to an Ocean Boulevard residence to investigate a burglary and vehicle theft. Investigators have determined that between midnight and 6 a.m. entry was made to the rear of the residence through an unlocked sliding glass door. Credit cards, a cellular telephone, and keys were removed from a purse and a 1994 Dodge Stealth vehicle was stolen from the driveway. Investigators processed the scene for evidence, and are actively working this case.

September 23, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on Charleston Boulevard where a neighbor stated that a male neighbor had threatened to commit suicide. The subject was not present when the officers arrived but found two notes in the residence indicating suicide was being contemplated. The subject returned to the residence and agreed to speak with Mobile Crisis and later agreed to be committed to a local hospital for evaluation. A Charleston County Sheriff's Deputy responded with commitment papers and transported the subject to the hospital.

September 26, 2008 The Mount Pleasant Police Department reported a hit and run accident in their jurisdiction and minutes later a Sullivan's Island officer followed a suspect vehicle matching the description from Sullivan's Island to a residence on Charleston Boulevard. An Isle of Palms officer responded and spoke to the owner of the vehicle, who admitted that he had been involved in an accident and had panicked and left the scene of the accident. A Mount Pleasant police officer responded and charged the subject.

September 27, 2008 Officers responded to a report of an SUV colliding with a palm tree on Palm Boulevard near 21st Avenue. An officer observed a female subject sitting in the driver's seat of the vehicle, who had a strong odor of alcohol on her person, slurred speech, and glassy and bloodshot eyes. An investigation determined that she had not been driving, and a male driver had left the scene prior to the arrival of police personnel. Due to the females difficulty in standing due to her intoxicated state she was taken into custody and charged with Disorderly Conduct.

September 29, 2008 Just after midnight, an officer on patrol observed a male subject at the corner of JC Long Boulevard and Ocean Boulevard, exposing himself and urinating in the presence of many passing pedestrians coming from area establishments. The officer approached the subject, who continued his actions in public. The subject was taken into custody and charged with Indecent Exposure and Disorderly Conduct.

September 29, 2008 Just before 2a.m., an officer on patrol stopped to investigate a male subject in shorts, t-shirt, and no shoes who was observed walking north on Palm Boulevard. A

computer check of the subject indicated he was wanted by the Berkeley County Sheriff's Office. The subject was taken into custody and later released to a Berkeley County deputy.

September 30, 2008 Just before 3 a.m., a Sullivan's Island police officer was involved in a vehicle chase that was heading toward the Isle of Palms and requested Isle of Palms Police assistance. The vehicle wrecked on some rocks near Breach Inlet and the occupants fled from the vehicle. A perimeter was established and both subjects were eventually located and taken into custody. The vehicle had been reported stolen from North Charleston.

Personnel/Community Relations

September 13, 2008 Eight officers and dispatchers participated in the 29th Annual Law Day which took place at the Citadel Mall. Officer's provided handouts and stickers. Two police vehicles and a police bicycle were on display.

September 19, 2008 PFC Baldrick, a State Certified Baby Seat Installer, inspected two baby seats installed by a resident to insure that they were properly installed.

September 26, 2008 PFC K. Thompson spoke to pre-school children at St. Marks Lutheran Church regarding stranger awareness.

September 30, 2008

For the month of September, officers discovered five businesses and four homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of two hundred seven Victim of Crime Forms were issued to business or property owners for various violations noted or to advise that an officer checked their business during the night while on patrol.
